PLANT DISEASES ACT 1924

Proclamation – P163

Proclamation to declare pests and to proclaim notifiable diseases and pests for the purposes of the Plant Diseases Act 1924

I, Professor Marie Bashir A.C., Governor of the State of New South Wales, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to section 3 (2) (a) of the Plant Diseases Act 1924 revoke Proclamation P41 and Proclamation P61 published in *Government Gazette* No. 171 of 11 December 1998 at page 9514, Proclamation P117 published in *Government Gazette* No. 108 on 6 July 2001 at page 5239, Proclamation P120 published in *Government Gazette* No. 150 on 5 October 2001 at page 8417, Proclamation P151 published in *Government Gazette* No. 91 on 28 May 2004 at page 3289 and Proclamation P154 published in *Government Gazette* No. 166 on 7 July 2004 at page 5765, Proclamation P156 published in *Government Gazette* No. 170 on 29 October 2004 at page 8327, Proclamation P158 published in *Government Gazette* No. 200 on 17 December 2004 at page 9496 and any proclamation revived as a result of these revocations and pursuant to section 28B (c) of the Plant Diseases Act 1924 declare Yellow crazy ant (*Anoplolepis gracilipes* (Fr. Smith)) and Red Imported Fire Ant (*Solenopsis invicta*) to be pests for the purposes of the Act and pursuant to section 10 (2) of the *Plant Diseases Act 1924* declare that section 10 of the *Plant Diseases Act 1924* applies in respect of the diseases and pests in the Schedule below.
