EXOTIC DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT 1991

NOTICE – Section 18

Entry and Exit Points to Restricted Area – Sydney Metropolitan Area and its Environs

ALL public and private roads intersecting with the boundary of the restricted area declared by order of the Deputy Chief Veterinary Officer on 27 August 2007 entitled “Declaration of Restricted Area - Sydney Metropolitan Area and its Environs”, are legal entry and exit points for horses, mules, donkeys and other animals in the Equidae family, and the animal products, fodder and fittings of these animals.

The movement of all horses, mules, donkeys and other animals in the Equidae family, and their animal products, fodder and fittings into, within or out of the restricted area **is prohibited, unless:**

- authorised by a permit issued by an inspector, and
- made through the entry and exit points specified in this notice.

Substantial penalties apply for breaches of these movement restrictions.

This notice is issued pursuant to section 18 of the Exotic Diseases of Animals Act 1991 (“the Act”).

The notice issued pursuant to section 18 of the Act on 25 August 2007 entitled “Entry and exit points to restricted area – Eastern Creek” is hereby revoked.

ORDER - Section 15

Declaration of Restricted Area - Sydney Metropolitan Area and its Environs

I, STEPHEN ELLIOTT DUNN, Deputy Chief Veterinary Officer, with the powers the Minister has delegated to me under section 67 of the Exotic Diseases of Animals Act 1991 and pursuant to section 15 of that Act and being of the opinion that the area specified in Schedule 1 may be or become infected with the exotic disease Equine influenza hereby:

1. revoke the order entitled "Declaration of restricted area – Eastern Creek" made by Bruce Morgan Christie on 25 August 2007, and any order revived as a result of this revocation;
2. declare the area specified in Schedule 1 to be a restricted area, and
3. declare that the classes of animals, animal products, fodder, fittings or vehicles to which this order applies are those described in Schedule 2.

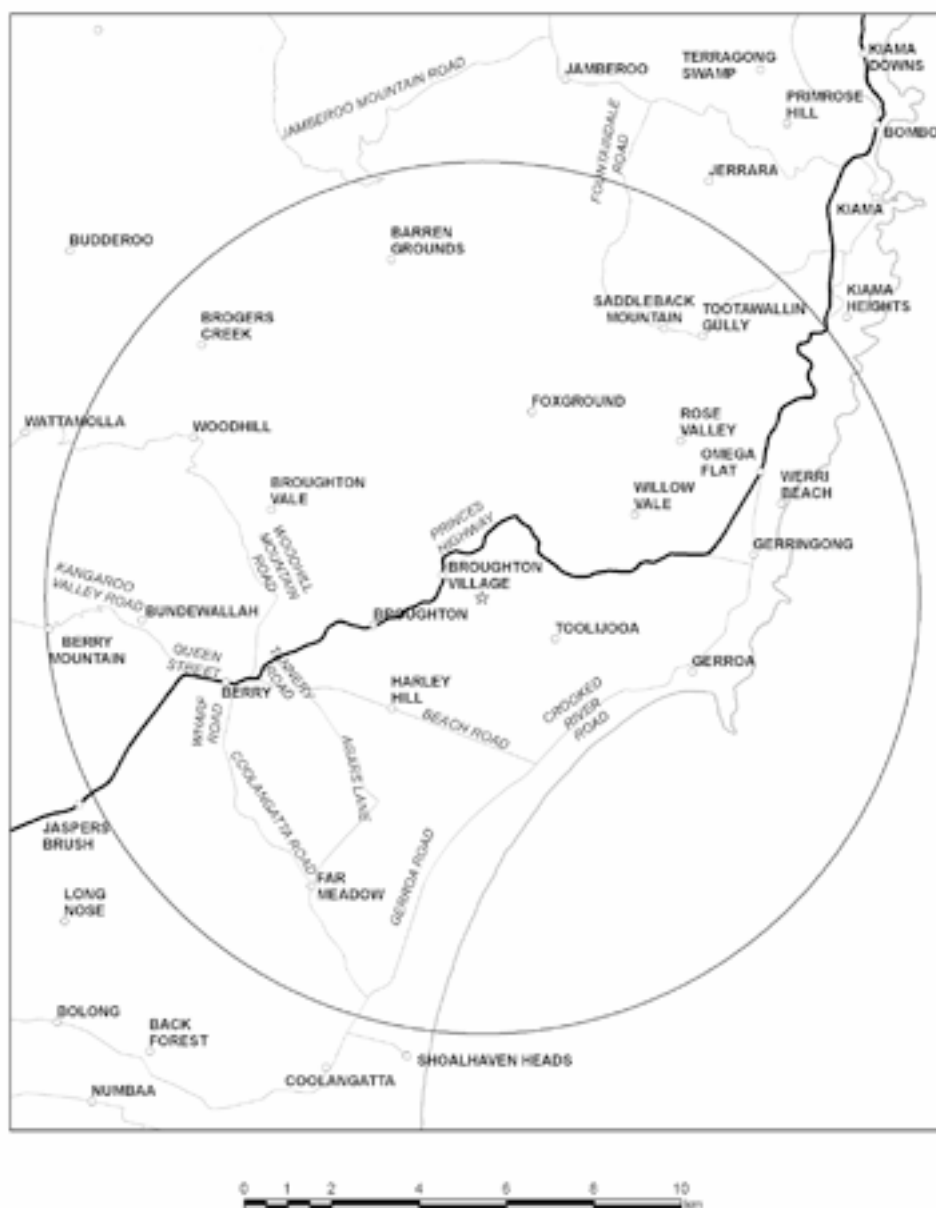

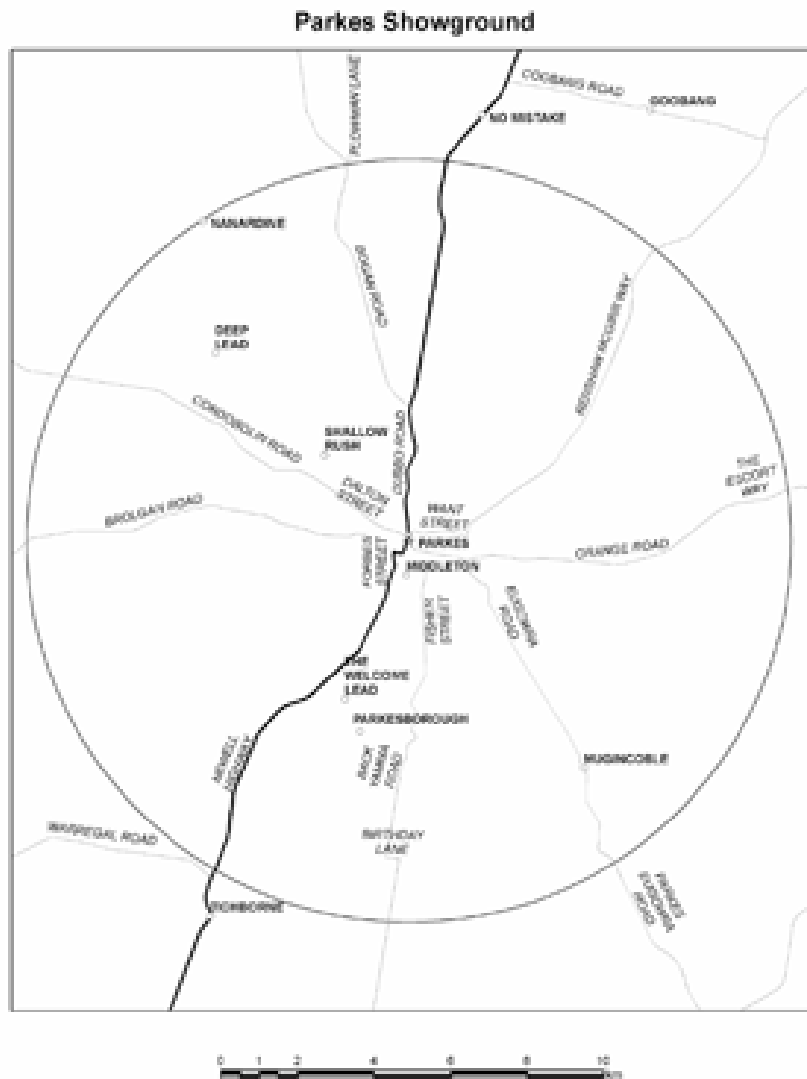
