IT is hereby notified, for general information, that Her Excellency the Governor has, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, this day assented to the undermentioned Acts passed by the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, viz.:

Act No. 5 2008 – An Act to amend the Food Act 2003 to make further provision for the disclosure of offences relating to the handling and sale of food, to provide for the disclosure of penalty notice information, and to make further provision for payments into the Food Authority Fund. [Food Amendment (Public Information on Offences) Bill]

Act No. 6 2008 – An Act to amend the Gaming Machines Act 2001 to impose a temporary freeze on the maximum number of gaming machines that may be kept in a hotel or club and to make further provision in relation to the transfer of hotel poker machine entitlements; and for related purposes. 

Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Amendment (Temporary Overseas Visitors) Regulation 2008

Her Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Act 1998*.

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Regulation* 1999:

- (a) to provide that temporary overseas visitors (non-citizens who are not permanent residents of Australia) will not be eligible to obtain a driver licence until they have been in Australia for a continuous period of at least 6 months, and
- (b) to provide that the maximum period for which a temporary overseas visitor may have a driver licence issued or renewed is 12 months, and
- (c) to authorise the RTA to include on a driver licence issued to a temporary overseas visitor a code or symbol and a statement indicating that the licensee has not provided the RTA with evidence of permanent resident status.

The amendments will be subject to certain exceptions, including the following exceptions:

- (a) current and former holders of a NSW driver licence will be exempt,
- (b) holders of a current interstate driver licence or an interstate driver licence that expired up to 2 years previously will be exempt (but with no such exemption for a person already recorded as a temporary overseas visitor on the DRIVES register),
- (c) the 6-month licence waiting period will not apply to holders of a current New Zealand driver licence or a New Zealand driver licence that expired up to 5 years previously.

This Regulation is made under the *Road Transport (Driver Licensing) Act 1998*, including sections 9, 19 (the general regulation-making power) and 20.

[1] Clause 6A

Insert after clause 6:

6A Special eligibility criteria for temporary overseas visitors

- (1) A temporary overseas visitor is not eligible to be issued a driver licence until the person has been a resident of Australia as a temporary overseas visitor for a continuous period of at least 6 months immediately prior to applying for the licence.
- (2) A temporary overseas visitor is not eligible to be issued a driver licence that will be in force for a period of more than 12 months and is not eligible to have a driver licence held by the person renewed for a period of more than 12 months. A driver licence renewed before its expiry may be renewed for a period of up to 12 months beyond the expiry of the licence being renewed.
- (3) This clause is subject to the following exceptions:
 - (a) this clause does not apply to a person who holds, or has ever held, a NSW driver licence issued before the commencement of this clause,
 - (b) this clause does not apply to the issue of a driver licence to a person who holds, or held within the previous 2 years, an interstate driver licence, unless the person is already recorded as a temporary overseas visitor on a driver licence register maintained by the Authority,
 - (c) this clause does not apply to the renewal of a NSW driver licence issued under the exemption provided by paragraph (b),
 - (d) subclause (1) does not apply to a person who holds, or held within the previous 5 years, a driver licence issued in New Zealand,
 - (e) the Authority may exempt a person from the operation of a provision of this clause in such circumstances as the Authority considers appropriate.

(4) In this clause:

interstate driver licence means an Australian driver licence issued in another jurisdiction.

NSW driver licence means an Australian driver licence issued in New South Wales.

NSW SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE

Determination to make a minor amendment to Part 3 of Schedule 1 of the Threatened Species Conservation Act

The Scientific Committee, established under the Threatened Species Conservation Act, 1995, has made a determination to make a minor amendment to Part 3 of Schedule 1 (Endangered ecological communities) of the Act by inserting the Howell Shrublands in the New England Tableland and Nandewar Bioregions and as a consequence to omit reference to the Howell Shrublands in the Northern Tablelands and Nandewar Bioregions (as described in the final determination of the Scientific Committee which was published on pages 6160 to 6162 in NSW Government Gazette No. 85 dated 7 July 2000). Minor amendments to the Schedules is provided for by Division 5 of Part 2 of the Act.

The Scientific Committee is of the opinion that the amendment is necessary or desirable for the following purposes under section 36A:

- (b) to correct any minor error or omission,
- (c) to clarify a description of an ecological community (including to reflect new surveys or research information)

The Scientific Committee has found that:

1. The Howell Shrublands in the New England Tableland and Nandewar Bioregions is the name given to the ecological community that is characterised by the following assemblage of species;

- 2. The total species list of the community is considerably larger than that given above, with many species present in only one or two sites or in low abundance. The species composition of a site will be influenced by the size of the site, recent rainfall or drought condition and by its disturbance (including fire) history. The number of species, and the above ground relative abundance of species will change with time since fire, and may also change in response to changes in fire regime (including changes in fire frequency). At any one time, above ground individuals of some species may be absent, but the species may be represented below ground in the soil seed banks or as dormant structures such as bulbs, corms, rhizomes, rootstocks or lignotubers. The list of species given above is of vascular plant species; the community also includes micro-organisms, fungi, cryptogamic plants and a diverse fauna, both vertebrate and invertebrate. These components of the community are poorly documented.
- 3. Howell Shrublands has been recorded primarily around Copeton Dam and Goonoowigal near Inverell with a small occurrence (about 10 ha) at Warrabah. These occurrences are within the New England Tableland and Nandewar Bioregions.

- 4. Howell Shrublands are dominated by low shrubs particularly *Homoranthus prolixus* and *Babingtonia densifolia*. Occasionally all shrubs may be absent giving a grassland structure or *Callitris endlicheri* and various eucalypts such as *Eucalyptus dealbata* and *Eucalyptus prava* may be present giving the appearance of a low open woodland. Howell Shrublands have been described in Hunter, J. & Clarke, P. (1998) *Cunninghamia* 5(3):547-618.
- 5. Howell Shrublands occur on granitic outcrops and has been recorded on Gilgai Granite (undifferentiated), leucoadamellite and Tingha Granite. The area covered by granite outcrops is likely to be about 500-800 ha of which Howell Shrublands community is likely to actually cover about 100-200 ha.
- 6. Rare and threatened species in Howell Shrublands include *Homoranthus prolixus*, *Boronia granitica*, *Eucalyptus mckieana*, *Monotaxis macrophylla*, *Leionema rotundifolium* and *Acacia granitica*.
- 7. The main occurrence of the Howell Shrublands areas are not known to be conserved in any National Parks though it may possibly occur in Copeton State Recreation Area. Part of the small southern occurrence (about 2ha) is conserved in Warrabah National Park.
- 8. The most significant threat to the Howell Shrublands is grazing by goats. There are large herds throughout the area occupied by the Howell Shrublands community. Rabbits also cause substantial modification to the community. Other impacts are from sheep grazing and clearing, weed invasion, roadworks and powerline constructions. Increased mining activity and inappropriate fire regimes are potential threats.
- 9. In view the above, the Scientific Committee is of the opinion that Howell Shrublands in the New England Tableland and Nandewar Bioregions is likely to become extinct in nature unless factors threatening its survival or evolutionary development cease to operate and that listing as an endangered ecological community is warranted.

Minister for Climate Change and Environment

Explanatory note

Section 34J of the Energy and Utilities Administration Act 1987 provides that the Minister may, by order published in the Gazette, require any one or more State water agencies to make an annual contribution for a specified financial year to the Climate Change Fund. The purpose of this Order is to require defined State water agencies to make an annual contribution to the Climate Change Fund for the financial year commencing 1 July 2007.

1. Name of Order

This Order is the Energy and Utilities Administration (Water Contributions) Order 2007.

2. Commencement

This Order commences on the date that it is published in the Gazette.

3. Interpretation

The Explanatory Note to this Order does not form part of the Order.

4. Definitions

State water agency means a State Water agency listed in column 1 of Schedule 1.

5. Annual contribution

- (1) A State water agency is required to make an annual contribution to the Climate Change Fund for the financial year commencing 1 July 2007.
- (2) The amount of the annual contribution to be paid by a State water agency is as set out in column 2 of Schedule 1.

6. Time for payment

The annual contribution is to be paid in one instalment on or before the first day of May 2008.

FOOD ACT 2003

The penalty imposed under the Act was \$2,100 and \$7,324 professional costs awarded to the Authority. This notice is made after statutory time for appeal has elapsed.

IT IS TO BE USED FOR CLAIMS MADE UNDER THE COMPENSATION TO RELATIVES ACT 1897 AFTER 1 APRIL 2008.

Who Can Make a Claim

If you are the close relative (or the executor or administrator of the estate) of a person who died in a motor vehicle accident in NSW, there are a number of circumstances under which you may be eligible to claim compensation for the financial losses you and other close relatives may have suffered as a result of the death of that person.

For the purposes of making a claim a close relative is a wife, husband, de facto partner, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister, parent or child of the person who died.

1. Other driver or owner of vehicle at fault

Whether the person who died was a driver, passenger, pedestrian, cyclist, motorbike rider or pillion passenger you can make a claim for compensation if you can demonstrate that a driver or owner of a motor vehicle, other than the person who died, was partially or completely at fault.

Special benefit for children in accidents from 1 October 2006

If the person who died was under 16 years of age and lived in NSW at the time of the accident you may still make a claim even if the accident was not caused by the driver or owner of a motor vehicle (i.e. the accident was caused by the child). Please refer to the Important note for children on page 6 for more information.

Blameless accidents from 1 October 2007

If the accident occurred on or after 1 October 2007 you may be able to make a claim for compensation even if the accident in which the person died was a blameless motor accident. Examples of blameless motor accidents could include accidents resulting from the sudden illness of a driver, such as heart attack or stroke or vehicle failure such as a tyre blow-out.

If the person who died was a passenger, pedestrian, cyclist, pillion passenger, driver or motorcycle rider you can make a claim. However, special rules apply to drivers and motorcycle riders in blameless accidents. You may not be entitled to make a claim if the person who died was involved in a single vehicle accident or if the person who died was driving or riding the vehicle that caused the accident (i.e they were the driver that suffered a medical condition which resulted in the motor accident).

For more information about the special rules that apply to drivers and motorcycle riders in blameless accidents, contact the Claims Advisory Service on 1300 656 919.

If you were injured in a motor vehicle accident

Do not use this form if you were injured in a motor vehicle accident. If you were injured in a motor vehicle accident contact the CTP insurer to obtain a Personal Injury Claim Form, You can use the Personal Injury Claim Form for an injury that is physical, psychological or psychiatric.

Where To Send The Claim Form

You must send the completed claim form to the Green Slip or Compulsory Third Party (CTP) insurer of the motor vehicle you consider caused the accident. If you are unsure of where to send your claim form contact the MAA's Claims Advisory Service on 1300 656 919.

The claim form should be sent to the CTP insurer as soon as possible but no later than six months after the death. Even though you might not want to think about filling in forms right now, you and your family may miss out on compensation if you do not lodge your claim within six months of the death of your relative.

Help with your claim

If you are claiming more than funeral expenses, you might like to **talk to a solicitor**. A solicitor who understands this area of the law can help you work out who should be named in the form and who should receive compensation. Contact the NSW Law Society's Community Assistance Service (02 9926 0300) for names of personal injury accredited solicitors in your area.

The information in this form is used by insurers to help determine liability for your claim and your compensation entitlements. It is important that you answer the questions fully. For example, you should include details of all dependants of the person who died.

Your information is confidential

The information in this form will be treated confidentially. Only staff of the Motor Accidents Authority (MAA), CTP insurers and other approved bodies with proper legal authority are allowed to access your information and are restricted in how they use the information. You have the right to access and correct information about you held by the MAA or CTP insurers. If you consider:

- that your personal information has been handled incorrectly by the MAA, you can ask the authority to undertake an internal review or you may contact Privacy NSW
- an insurer has handled your information incorrectly, you may contact the relevant insurer for an internal review or the Office of the Federal Privacy Commissioner.

CTP insurers are bound by national privacy principles. You may visit the licensed insurers' websites or contact them directly to request information on how to access your personal information, seek an internal review or determine with whom they share the information.

The information you provide must be truthful

You must answer the questions fully and truthfully. Information that is knowingly false or misleading may result in a fine of up to \$5,500 or imprisonment for up to 12 months or both.

MAKING A COMPENSATION TO RELATIVES CLAIM

There are a number of steps to making a claim:

1 Report the accident to the police

You must report the accident to the police as soon as possible, and in any case, within 28 days after the accident. If the accident is reported late and you cannot give a reason, it could affect the insurer's decision about your claim. If the accident has been reported late, please attach an explanation to this claim form giving the reasons for the delay.

2 Find out the CTP insurer of the NSW motor vehicle you consider caused the accident

Contact the Claims Advisory Service on 1300 656 919 to find out the CTP insurer. You will need to give them the NSW registration number plate of the motor vehicle you consider caused the accident and the date of the accident. If the motor vehicle you consider caused the accident is:

- not a NSW registered motor vehicle, you will need to contact the relevant state or territory.
- unregistered or cannot be identified (e.g. hit and run) see step 4 below for further instructions.

3 Identify the motor vehicle and person you consider caused the accident

You must indicate the motor vehicle and/or person you consider caused the accident (Q22). If you are having difficulty in finding out the motor vehicle registration number and/or the person you consider caused the accident contact the police.

4 If the motor vehicle you consider caused the accident was uninsured or unidentified

The Norminal Defendant receives claims where the motor vehicle you consider caused the accident cannot be identified or is uninsured, and the accident occurred in NSW.

Before sending the claim you must take action to find out the registration number of the motor vehicle or the person you consider caused the accident. For example, by putting an advertisement in the newspaper or attempting to talk to witnesses.

If you cannot find out the registration number or if the motor vehicle is unregistered and not covered by CTP insurance, send your claim to the Nominal Defendant at Level 25, 580 George Street, Sydney NSW 2000, (DX 1517 Sydney). If you need more information about the Nominal Defendant call 1300 137 131 or visit www.maa.nsw.gov.au

5 Complete the claim form on behalf of all dependants

A compensation to relatives claim is made by one person on behalf of all dependants of the deceased. In filling out the compensation to relatives claim form it is necessary to not only include any claim you have for loss of dependency (financial support or loss of services) but also the claims of anyone else who was dependent on the deceased. The entitlements of all dependants are dealt with at the same time and as part of the same claim.

6 Send the claim form to the CTP insurer

You must send the completed claim form to the CTP insurer of the motor vehicle you consider caused the accident (see step 2 above).

The claim form should be sent as soon as possible, but no later than six months from the date of death. You can still make a claim more than six months after the date of death. However, your claim could be rejected if you cannot give a satisfactory reason for the delay. If you make a claim more than six months after the date of death, please attach an explanation to this claim form giving reasons for the delay.

7 If the person who died was under 16 years at the date of accident

Attach proof of age (a certified copy of the birth certificate, death certificate or passport) and proof that the person who died was a resident of NSW at the date of their death (refer to the Important note for children on page 6).

8 Keep a copy of the completed forms and accounts and invoices

Please attach any original accounts and invoices you may already have to the claim form. Keep a copy of all forms, certificates, accounts and invoices, etc., so that you have your own record.

AFTER YOU SEND YOUR CLAIM TO THE CTP INSURER

1 You will receive a letter from the insurer

You will get a letter from the insurer telling you they have received your claim. The letter will include a claim or reference number that you should use if you want to talk to the insurer about your claim. The letter will also include a contact person's name and phone number.

2 You must help the CTP insurer with its investigation of your claim

The insurer will investigate your claim. You may be required to give the CTP insurer more information, photographs, documents or records.

3 The insurer will tell you its decision about your claim

The insurer will tell you whether liability is accepted (fully or partly) or denied. The insurer is required to make a decision on liability within three months of a claim being made. If the insurer accepts liability, they will then make an offer of settlement, that is, an offer to pay an amount of compensation they think is appropriate after investigating the losses you describe in this form.

The settlement offer may include payment for:

- Funeral expenses paid for either by you or a close relative
- The loss of financial support which the person who died would have provided to you or other close relatives if the person had not died
- Loss of services (such as those previously provided by a parent to a child)
- Hospital and other medical expenses
- Loss of earnings the person suffered prior to their death.

You may negotiate with the insurer to settle your claim. This can include accepting the insurer's offer or making a counter-offer.

If the CTP insurer denies liability on your claim, contact the Claims Advisory Service on 1300 656 919 for further information as you may have further rights against the CTP insurer.

4 Important note for children


From 1 October 2006, if the person who died was under 16 years of age and lived in NSW at the time of their death, you may still make a claim for the children's special benefit even if the accident was not caused by the owner or driver of a motor vehicle. The special benefit provides for reasonable funeral or cremation expenses associated with the death of the child. If the accident was caused, wholly or in part, by the driver or owner of a motor vehicle other compensation entitlements may apply.



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

Example diagram for pedestrian/cyclist




Diagram of the accident





Amendment to Safety Management System Guidelines

THE Maritime Authority of NSW has amended the Safety Management System Guidelines published in NSW Government Gazette No 162 dated 15 October 2004 as follows:

1. Section 8 Emergency Procedures

Omit the matter and insert instead the matter Section 8 Emergency and Security Management Procedures as set out below.

- 2. Appendix 2 Emergency Procedures
 - [1] Omit the Heading and insert instead "Appendix 2 Emergency and Security Incident Response Procedures".
 - [2] Insert "and Security Incident Response Procedures" after "Emergency" in the third paragraph.
 - [3] Insert the following after the Note: "Note 2 the diagram does not include Security Incident Response Procedures."
 - [4] Insert the example procedures "Bomb Threat" and "Vessel Security Plan" as set out below at the end of the Appendix.

NSW MARITIME

8. Emergency and Security Management Procedures

Emergency and Security Management procedures need to be developed and documented so that personnel both onboard and shore based, are aware of what to do, and can practice for emergency and security related situations.

SMS Requirements

The company must identify and prepare for all potential emergency and security related situations. Security guidelines for Ferry and Charter Vessel operators have been produced as a companion volume to this SMS and should be used to provide guidance for security planning.

On board and shore based contingency plans must be developed using the OHS consultative arrangements.

The SMS must include, or refer to a schedule for the conduct of drills for the identified emergency and security response procedures. Crew members and company personnel must carry out scheduled drills to improve the competence and confidence of vessel crew and shore based staff to ensure that the procedures and resources can meet the required performance standards.

Records must be maintained of the conduct of drills for the following emergency and security procedures, as well as others deemed necessary by the Company for the meeting of the SMS Policy objectives and the monitoring and continual improvement of the SMS.

- Fire
- Abandon Ship
- Bomb Threat (Sample document at appendix 2)
- Bomb Search
- · Man Overboard/Search and Rescue
- Spillage of fuel/cargo
- · Serious injury
- · Security breach/incident

These records must be retained for a period determined by the Company (but at least 5 years)

The SMS manual must contain, or at least reference the location of documented instructions related to emergency operations and security incident responses for both the vessel and shore based facilities.

Records of all emergency and security drills must be maintained in the SMS records

The results of emergency and security incident response drills need to be assessed on board the vessel at the conclusion of the drill, and during management review.


Changes to procedures, or training of personnel need to be incorporated in the appropriate systems.

7. Duties and Responsibilities.

Sets out the requirements for personnel with a responsibility for security.

8. Knowledge and Training.

Vessel security plans should detail the knowledge skills and requirements for the security related aspects of their position. They should detail the training and qualifications that satisfy those requirements and the training that should be given to those personnel Each plan should include a reference to a training register to record which staff have received the appropriate training or have sufficient knowledge to perform their duties.

9. Security Assessment.

Each plan should include a security assessment to provide an understanding of security risks and possible preventive security measures and procedures to treat the identified risks.

10. Security Measures and Procedures.

Plan should detail effective measures and procedures to treat security risks and to control access to operating areas of the vessel. It should include procedures for responding to security incidents/threats and for reporting security incidents.
