## **Water Management (Abolition of Anabanch Water Trust) Proclamation 2018**

under the

Water Management Act 2000

### **1 Name of Proclamation**

This Proclamation is the *Water Management (Abolition of Anabanch Water Trust) Proclamation 2018*.

### **2 Commencement**

This Proclamation commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

### **3 Abolition of Anabanch Water Trust**

The Great Anabanch of the Darling River Water Trust (also known as the Anabanch Water Trust), a private water trust constituted under Part 3 of the *Water Act 1912*, is abolished.
