Explanatory note:

The purpose of this notification is to make a new fishing closure for endorsement holders in the Ocean Trap and Line Fishery implementing additional protection measures for Greynurse Shark.

Fisheries Management Act 1994

1. Name of Notification

This notification is the Fisheries Management (Ocean Trap and Line Fishery Export Approval - North & South Solitary Islands, Fish Rock, Green Island and Magic Point) Notification 2020.

2. Commencement and duration

This notification commences on 19 May 2020 and will remain in force for five (5) years.

3. Definitions

In this notification:

burleying means any activity that would be reasonably likely to result in the aggregation of fish associated with line fishing.

gang of hooks means a group of hooks, each of which is attached to, and in direct contact with, at least one other of those hooks.

hand held line means a rod (or pole) and line or handline.

lead lining means a form of trolling where weights are placed on the trolled lines to target fish lower in the water column.

line fishing means the use of a hand held line, set line or drift line.

Ocean Trap and Line Fishery has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Act.

spinning means the use of an artificial fly or lure in connection with a hand held line deployed from a boat that is not making way (that is, a boat that is anchored, moored or otherwise held stationary), in a manner whereby the artificial fly or lure is retrieved at or near the surface of the water (that is, the fly or lure must not be allowed to sink prior to retrieval).

the Act means the Fisheries Management Act 1994.

trolling means the use of an artificial fly or lure in connection with a hand held line deployed from a boat that is making way (that is, a boat that is under active propulsion).

4. Fishing closure

Pursuant to section 8 of the Act:

a) all endorsement holders in the Ocean Trap and Line Fishery are prohibited from taking of all species of fish by the methods of fishing specified in Column 1 of Schedules 1, 2,

3 and 4 to this notification, from the waters described opposite in Column 2 of Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4 for the period specified opposite in Column 3 of Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4.
