# Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) Amendment (No 7) Order 2022

## Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to amend the *Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) 2021* to—

- (a) remove the requirement for QR check-in before entering certain premises, and
- (b) remove the current density limits on hospitality venues and nightclubs, and
- (c) remove singing and dancing restrictions that apply in relation to certain premises.

## **Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) Amendment (No 7) Order 2022**

under the

Public Health Act 2010

### **1 Name of Order**

This Order is the *Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) Amendment (No 7) Order 2022*.

### **2 Commencement**

This Order commences at the beginning of 18 February 2022.

## **Schedule 1      Amendment of Public Health (COVID-19 General) Order (No 2) 2021**

**[1]    Clause 9 Registration of contact details for funeral or memorial services and gatherings following services**

Omit the clause.

**[2]    Clause 10 Registration of contact details for entry to certain premises**

Omit clause 10(1)(a)–(j). Insert instead—

- (a) nightclubs,
- (b) strip clubs,
- (c) sex on premises venues, being restricted premises where sex between patrons is permitted on the premises,
- (d) music festivals with more than 1,000 attendees.

**[3]    Clause 10(4)(a1)**

Omit the paragraph.

**[4]    Clauses 13A and 13B**

Omit the clauses.
