REVOCATION OF AUTHORITY

POISONS AND THERAPEUTIC GOODS ACT 1966

PURSUANT to clause 170 of the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008*, I, Dr Kerry Chant, Chief Health Officer, a duly appointed delegate of the Secretary of the New South Wales Ministry of Health, do hereby revoke the authority dated 15 May 2018 with respect to the supply of azithromycin, doxycycline, ceftriaxone and metronidazole under NSW Health Policy Directive PD2018_014 RN Supply and Administration of STI Therapies in Publicly Funded Sexual Health Services.

This revocation of authority is published in the NSW Government Gazette.

ORDER

Restoration of Drug Authority

In accordance with the provisions of clause 175(1) of the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008* a direction has been issued that the Order that took effect on and from 1 December 2020, on **Ms Gobika Srikanthan (PHA0001628267)** of Portland NSW 2847, prohibiting her as a pharmacist from supplying or having possession of, or manufacturing any preparation, admixture or extract of a drug of addiction as authorised by clauses 101(1) and 102 of the Regulation, shall cease to operate on and from 7 March 2022.
