AMENDMENT OF PROHIBITION ON IMPORTATION OR INTRODUCTION OF MYRTLE RUST

- I, KONSTANTINE VATSKALIS, Minister for Primary Industry, Fisheries and Resources, under section 8(1) of the *Plant Diseases Control Act* and with reference to section 43 of the *Interpretation Act*, amend the instrument entitled "Myrtle Rust Declaration of disease and notifiable disease and prohibition of importation" dated 9 September 2010 and published in *Gazette* No. S46 of 10 September 2010 by:
- (a) omitting the Schedule to the instrument; and
- (b) inserting the Schedule to this instrument.

SCHEDULE

1 Definitions

In this Schedule:

approved fungicide means:

- (a) a fungicide that contains chlorothalonil and is supplied with instructions relating to treatment of "rust" diseases on ornamentals;
- (b) a chemical for which the APVMA has issued a permit to treat Myrtle Rust on plants.

APVMA, see section 4 of the Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals (Administration) Act 1992 (Cth).

host plant means a plant of the Family Myrtaceae. plant health assurance certificate means:

- (a) an assurance certificate, as defined in Schedule 2 of the Qld Act, given by an accredited person, as defined in Schedule 2 of the Qld Act, in accordance with the conditions of the person's accreditation; or
- (b) a similar certificate given by an accredited person in another State or Territory in accordance with a national scheme known as the Interstate Certification Assurance scheme

plant health certificate means a certificate given by a person holding an office or position under a law of a State or another Territory equivalent to the office of an inspector.

Qld Act means the *Plant Protection Act 1989* (Old)

2 Host plant from known Myrtle Rust area

 This clause applies to a host plant, other than seed or tissue cultured seed material, if it has been

- grown or kept in a State or Territory in which Myrtle Rust is known to occur.
- (2) A person must not import or introduce into the Territory the host plant unless the host plant:
 - (a) is imported or introduced from a nursery;and
 - (b) is accompanied by a signed plant health certificate or plant health assurance certificate containing the statements specified in subclause (3).
- (3) The plant health certificate, or plant health assurance certificate, for a host plant must state that the person giving the certificate:
 - (a) inspected the nursery from which the plant originated (the *nursery*) no more than 14 days before the date the plant was dispatched from the nursery (the *dispatch date*) and found the nursery free from symptoms of Myrtle Rust; and
 - (b) is satisfied that:
 - (i) all plants in the consignment containing the host plant were treated with an approved fungicide no more than 7 days before the dispatch date; or
 - (ii) all host plants in the nursery were treated with an approved fungicide on 2 occasions with a 14 day interval before the dispatch date; and
 - (c) inspected the consignment containing the host plant at the rate of 600 plants or 2% of plants in the consignment no more than 7 days before the dispatch date and found the consignment free from symptoms of Myrtle Rust.

3 Tissue cultured plant material from known Myrtle Rust area

- (1) This clause applies to tissue cultured plant material of a host plant if the culture was grown in a State or Territory in which Myrtle Rust is known to occur.
- (2) A person must not import or introduce into the Territory the plant material unless the Chief Inspector has approved the importation or introduction.
