

**Plant Health Act**DECLARATION OF QUARANTINE PLACE FOR  
BANANA AND PLANTAIN PLANTS

I, STEPHEN JAMES WEST, Chief Inspector of Plant Health:

- (a) under section 18(1) of the *Plant Health Act*, declare section 2995, Hundred of Goyder to be a quarantine place for the control of the declared pest Banana Freckle *Phyllosticta cavendishii* (the **declared pest**); and
- (b) declare the quarantine place for the purposes mentioned in section 18(2)(b), (c)(i) and (iv) and (d) of the *Act*; and
- (c) specify that the following prohibitions apply to the whole of the quarantine place:
  - (i) the entry into the quarantine place of any banana or plantain plants is prohibited;
  - (ii) the removal of any banana or plantation plants, or plant material from banana or plantain plants, from the quarantine place is prohibited;
  - (iii) the propagation or planting of banana or plantain plants is prohibited; and
- (d) specify that the reason for the decision to make this declaration is because the quarantine place is affected by the declared pest; and
- (e) specify that a person whose interests are or might be affected by the decision has a right to apply under section 58 of the *Act* for reconsideration of the decision.

**Plant Health Act**REQUIREMENT TO DISPOSE OF  
BANANA AND PLANTAIN PLANTS

LOT 2995, HUNDRED OF GOYDER

I, STEPHEN JAMES WEST, Chief Inspector of Plant Health, under section 20(1) of the *Plant Health Act*, for the control of Banana Freckle (*Phyllosticta cavendishii*) (the **declared pest**), require the owner of banana and plantain plants located on Lot 2995, Hundred of Goyder (the **property**) to treat and dispose of all banana and plantain plants on the property by allowing the Chief Inspector, inspectors of plant health and other persons authorised by the Chief Inspector for the purpose to:

- (a) enter onto the property and;
- (b) destroy and bury on the property all banana and plantain plants on the property; and
- (c) treat all remaining stumps or re-growth with a treatment approved by the Chief Inspector.

The reason for the decision to give this notice is because the property is affected by the declared pest and the owner has a right to apply under section 58 of the *Act* for reconsideration of the decision.
