Northern Territory of Australia Fisheries Regulations 1992 Pearl Oyster Licence Levy 2020

I, Paul Andrew Kirby, Minister for Primary Industry and Resources, under regulation 208C(1) of the *Fisheries Regulations 1992*, prescribe a levy of \$45 for each pearl culture unit allocated to a Pearl Oyster Fishery licensee or Pearl Culture Industry licensee to be paid by the licensee on application for renewal of the licence for the licensing year commencing 1 January 2020.

Northern Territory of Australia *Fisheries Regulations 1992* **Fees and Levies 2019–2020**

- I, Paul Andrew Kirby, Minister for Primary Industry and Resources:
- (a) under regulation 206(1)(a) of the *Fisheries Regulations* 1992, prescribe the fee payable for the grant or renewal of:
 - a licence specified in Schedule 1, Part A, for the licensing year commencing on 1 July 2019 to be the amount specified opposite the licence; and
 - (ii) a licence specified in Schedule 1, Part B, for the licensing year commencing on 1 January 2020 to be the amount specified opposite the licence; and
- (b) under regulation 206(1)(aa) to (e) of the Regulations, prescribe the fee payable on and from 1 July 2019 for a matter mentioned in Schedule 2 to be the amount specified opposite the matter; and
- under regulation 207(1) of the Regulations, prescribe for the licensing year
 commencing on 1 July 2019 or 1 January 2020:
 - a levy of \$1 465 to be paid by an applicant for the grant or renewal of a Mud Crab Fishery licence; and
 - a levy of \$1 165 to be paid by an applicant for the grant or renewal of any other licence listed in Schedule 3 to the Regulations.

Revocation and Prescription of Vessel Monitoring System Levy Barramundi Fishery Licences

I, Ian Arthur Curnow, Director of Fisheries, with effect on and from 1 July 2019:

- (a) under regulation 208D(1) of the Fisheries Regulations 1992 and with reference to section 43 of the Interpretation Act 1978, revoke the prescription of levies made by the notice entitled "Vessel Monitoring System Levy Barramundi Fishery Licences" dated 31 May 2018 and published in Gazette No. G23 of 6 June 2018; and
- (b) under regulation 208D(1) of the Regulations prescribe a levy of \$114 on each unit of net endorsed on a Barramundi Fishery licence, to be paid by the holder of the licence on application for renewal of the licence.

Fisheries Regulations 1992

Revocation and Prescription of Timor Reef Fishery Licence Levies, Demersal Fishery Licence Levies, and Off-shore Net and Line Fishery Licence Levies

I, Ian Arthur Curnow, Director of Fisheries, as the delegate of the Northern Territory Fisheries Joint Authority:

- (a) under regulations 208A(1) and 208B(1) of the Fisheries Regulations 1992 and with reference to section 43 of the Interpretation Act 1978, revoke the prescription of levies made by the notice entitled "Timor Reef Fishery Licence Levies and Demersal Fishery Licence Levies" dated 28 May 2018 and published in Gazette No. S35 of 29 May 2018 with effect on and from 1 July 2019; and
- (b) under regulation 208A(1) of the Regulations, prescribe the following levies to be paid by the holder of a Timor Reef Fishery licence on application for renewal of the licence with effect from 1 July 2019 to 30 June 2020:
 - \$0.091 for each fishery unit for goldband snapper attached to the licence;
 - (ii) \$0.037 for each fishery unit for red snapper attached to the licence;
 - (iii) \$0.146 for each fishery unit for grouped fish attached to the licence; and
- under regulation 208B(1) of the Regulations, prescribe the following levies to be paid by the holder of a Demersel Fishery licence on application for renewal of the licence with effect from 1 July 2019 to 30 June 2020:
 - \$0.114 for each fishery unit for goldband snapper attached to the licence;
 - (ii) \$0.076 for each fishery unit for red snapper attached to the licence;
 - (iii) \$0.064 for each fishery unit for grouped fish attached to the licence; and

- (d) under regulation 208CA(1) of the Regulations, prescribe the following levies to be paid by the holder of an Off-Shore Net and Line Fishery licence on application for renewal of the licence with effect from 1 July 2019 to 30 June 2020:
 - \$0.1421 for each fishery unit for grey mackerel species from the Western Grey Mackerel Management Zone attached to the licence;
 - \$0.1421 for each fishery unit for grey mackerel species from the Eastern Grey Mackerel Management Zone attached to the licence;
 - (iii) \$0.0068 for each fishery unit for combined Blacktip Shark attached to the licence;
 - (iv) \$0.0069 for each fishery unit for Spot-tail Shark attached to the licence;
 - (v) \$0.0102 for each fishery unit for combined Shark group attached to the licence;
 - (vi) \$0.0022 for each fishery unit for combined other Shark group species attached to the licence;
 - (vii) \$0.1023 for each fishery unit for combined fin fish group (by-product) species attached to the licence.
