FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Grant Barker (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder'), 13A West Terrace, Port Broughton, S.A. 5522 is exempt from clause 72 of schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1984 and clause 16 (2) of the Scheme of Management (Blue Crab Fishery) Regulations 1998, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, in that the permit holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking blue crabs *Portunus pelagicus*) for the purpose of trade or business, without recording the weight of blue crabs on the form BSCF1, from the waters of Spencer Gulf (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity').
