FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Susan Gray or persons acting as her agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder') from the School of Biological Sciences, Flinders University of South Australia, G.P.O. Box 2100, Adelaide, S.A. 5001 is exempt from the provisions of the Fisheries Act (Aquatic Reserves) Regulations 1989 and clause 63D of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1984 to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), using the gear specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of marine organisms from all waters of South Australia including intertidal 'rocky' reefs.

SCHEDULE 2

- 2 x beach seine nets (the maximum length of which does not exceed 50 m)
- 5 x drop nets
- 2 x plankton nets
- 1 x beam trawl net (the maximum width of which does not exceed 2 m)
- 1 x cast net
- 10 x fish traps
- 1 x miniature otter trawl
- hook and line
- butterfly/dab nets
- 1 x bait pump

SCHEDULE 3

- 1. The specimens collected by the permit holders are for scientific and research purposes only and may not be sold.
- 2. The permit holders shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
- 3. While engaging in the permitted activity, the permit holders must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.
- 4. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the permit holders must advise a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer of on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to Section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, David J. Warland (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder'), 38 York Street, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5606 to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activities'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, in the waters specified in Schedule 3 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted area') from the date of this permit until 30 November 1999 or until this permit is revoked by the Director of Fisheries.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of no more than 23 adult pot bellied seahorses $(Hippocampus\ abdominalis).$

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity the permit holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a Fisheries Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.
- 2. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically permitted by this notice.
- 3. All specimens taken shall be for the establishment of a broodstock culture only and may not be sold.
- 4. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must first advise the Fishwatch Duty Officer (1800 065 522) of the proposed location and dates on which collections are to be made.
- 5. The permit holder shall provide within 7 days a written report on the number of animals taken, specific location and their condition to the Director of Fisheries at the completion of each collection.
- 6. The permit holder shall only collect the permitted species from registered fish farms with the approval of the fish farm owner.
- 7. No more than 5 of the permitted species shall be collected from any one collection site.
