FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Geoff Rogers (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder') from the Mid Murray Local Action Planning Committee, P.O. Box 437 Berri, S.A. 5343 is exempt from the provisions of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only so far as he may engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), using the gear specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 16 April 2001.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of aquatic organisms, including fish below the legal minimum length and species protected, pursuant to section 42 of the Fisheries Act 1982, from all waters of Lake Bywaters at Walker Flat.

SCHEDULE 2

3 x seine nets (the maximum length of which does not exceed 25 m with a minimum mesh size of 20 mm).

SCHEDULE 3

1. The specimens collected by the permit holder are for scientific and research purposes only and may not be sold. All native species must be returned to the water immediately upon completion of scientific evaluation.

- 2. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
- 3. The permit holder must provide the Director of Fisheries with a report on the monitoring program conducted within 6 months of the completion of the program.
- 4. While engaging in the permitted activity, the permit holders must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.
- 5. Before collecting any specimens, pursuant to this notice, the permit holders must advise a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.
