FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, William J. Mersh, Lot 439 Westbrook Road, Tailem Bend, S.A. 5259 (hereinafter referred to as the 'fish farmer') is exempt from the provisions of section 50 of the Fisheries Act 1982, in that they shall not be guilty of an offence when importing and releasing black tiger prawn, (*Penaeus monodon*) and brine shrimp, (*Artermia salina*) (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity') subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 1 from the date of gazettal of this notice until revoked by the Director of Fisheries.

SCHEDULE 1

- 1. The fish farmer may only engage in the permitted activity on the premises situated at Lot 439 in the Hundred of Seymour as detailed in registered aquaculture site FT00470 (hereinafter referred to as the premises).
- 2. The fish farmer shall not import black tiger prawn, (*Penaeus monodon*) and brine shrimp, (*Artermia salina*) into South Australia unless the shipment has been certified disease free by an approved veterinary agency to a protocol approved by PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture.
- 3. The fish farmer must maintain adequate security arrangements to prevent escapement of the black tiger prawn, (Penaeus monodon) and brine shrimp, (Artermia salina) from the premiers
- 4. The fish farmer must ensure that no waste water enters South Australian waters without the prior permission of the Director of Fisheries.
- 5. The fish farmer must ensure that no live fish leave the premises without the prior written approval of the Director of Fisheries.
- 6. The fish farmer shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

7. The fish farmer must retain a copy of this notice and produce that notice for inspection if requested by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, pursuant to Section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, I hereby authorise AusAqua Pty Ltd (or their agent) (hereinafter referred to as the 'fish farmer'), 1 Michelle Street, Wallaroo, S.A. 5556 to engage in the activities and to do the acts specified in Schedule 1 subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2 from the date of this permit until revoked by the Director of Fisheries.

SCHEDULE 1

The importation and release of southern rock lobster, *Qasus edwardsii*); Australian starfish, *Patiriella exigua*) and eastern rock lobster (*Jasus verreauxi*) into tanks located at section 2903 in the Hundred of Wallaroo.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. The fish farmer must maintain adequate security arrangements to prevent escapement of fish (ova, fry, or adult) into any South Australian waters.
- 2. Fish obtained within South Australia for use on the fish farm must be obtained from registered fish farmers, licensed fishers or other persons approved by the Director of Fisheries.
- 3. The fish farmer must not import any live fish (ova, fry, or adult) into South Australia unless the shipment has certification from an appropriate authority in the State from which they are obtained that they are free from all relevant notifiable diseases listed in Schedule 4 of the Fisheries (Exotic Fish, Fish Farming and Fish Diseases) Regulations 1984.
- 4. The fish farmer must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically permitted by this notice.
- 5. The fish farmer must retain the copy of this permit which has been supplied by the Director of Fisheries, and if requested by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer, produce that permit for inspection.
