FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 and Garry Barnes, 5 James Street, Port Broughton, S.A. 5522 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') are exempt from the provisions of Clause 66 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, and section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, insofar as the exemption holder may exceed the boat limits as specified in Schedule 2 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Wild Thing* (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted boat') from the exemption holder in South Australia, for the purpose of recreational fishing for scalefish.

SCHEDULE 2

The exemption holder may engage in the taking of no more than one half of the daily bag limit (for those species of scalefish subject to such a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000) per paying passenger in any one day where the number of paying passengers exceeds five.

SCHEDULE 3

1. This exemption is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

2. The exemption holder shall not use any other boats for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity except the *Wild Thing*.

3. The exemption holder shall not sell any fish taken pursuant to this notice.

4. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

5. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder shall have in their possession a copy of this notice and must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.
