PLANNING ACT 1982, SECTION 62(4): REVOCATION OF
OPEN SPACE PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

Proclamation By The Governor

(L.S.) E. J. NEAL

Preamble

1. On 30 September 1982 the division of certain land in the Hundred of Wallaroo was, by proclamation under the *Planning and Development Act 1966*, prohibited in order to preserve the land for open space (see *Gazette* 30 September 1982 p. 920).

2. Section 21 of the *Statutes Repeal and Amendment (Development) Act 1993* provides that a proclamation made under section 61 of the *Planning and Development Act 1966* continues in force and effect as if the *Planning Act 1982* had not been repealed, and that the *Planning Act 1982* continues to apply in relation to the proclamation (see also the schedule to the *Planning Act 1982*).

3. It is now desirable to revoke the prohibition insofar as it affects certain land.



DEVELOPMENT ACT 1993: SECTION 46 (1)

*Notice**Preamble*

Section 46 (1) of the Development Act 1993, allows the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning to apply that section to a specified kind of development or project if the Minister is of the opinion that a declaration under that section is appropriate or necessary for the proper assessment of development or a project of major environmental, social or economic importance.

Notice

PURSUANT to Section 46 (1) of the Development Act 1993, being of the opinion that a declaration under that section is appropriate for the proper assessment of development of major environmental, social and economic importance, I declare that section 46 of the Act applies in that part of the State, to all development of a kind specified in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1

The following kinds of development are specified if undertaken in, or in relation to, that part of the State specified in Schedule 2:

- (a) building work;
- (b) change in the use of land;
- (c) division of allotments;
- (d) construction of roads, streets and thoroughfares;
- (e) the excavating or filling (or excavation and filling) of land, or the forming of a levee or mound; and
- (f) all other kind of development,

for the purpose of, or ancillary to, establishing or operating a residential waterfront development, marina and boat harbour facility, public boat ramp facility and sites for holiday unit accommodation and a tourist resort development (including the provision of infrastructure for water supply, stormwater disposal and effluent disposal).

DEVELOPMENT ACT 1993, SECTION 48: DECISION BY THE DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT COMMISSION AS DELEGATE OF THE GOVERNOR

Preamble

1. The decision of the Governor under section 48 of the Development Act 1993, to approve the development of the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development located adjacent to Chappell Drive, Glenelg was published in the *Gazette* on 8 June 2000.

2. An amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Gazette* on 7 December 2000.

3. A further amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Gazette* on 1 March 2001.

4. A subsequent amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development has now been under consideration under Division 2 of Part 4 of the Development Act 1993.

5. The proposed amendments include the division of allotment 1, certificate of title, volume 5711, folio 325, in DP 53445 into two allotments, (proposed allotment 700 and 701) to accommodate the construction of the approved Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development.

6. The amendments to the development are contained in:

- (a) the letter from Alexander Symonds on behalf of Holdfast Shores Consortium to the Development Assessment Commission dated 6 April 2001;
- (b) the following plans prepared by Alexander Symonds:
Map Reference 6628-50-j & h dated 10.5.01.

7. The Development Assessment Commission has, in considering the application, had regard to all relevant matters under section 48 (5) of the Development Act 1993.

8. The Development Assessment Commission is satisfied that the amendments do not require the preparation of a further or amended Development Report.

Decision

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Development Act 1993, the Development Assessment Commission, as delegate of the Governor, grants development approval to the amended Holdfast Shores Stage 2A proposal located adjacent to Chappell Drive for land division, hotel, car parking, landscaping and associated works, Glenelg subject to conditions.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL:

1. The Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development must be undertaken in accordance with:

- (a) the following plans contained in the Development Report dated December 1999, as they relate to the proposals for Stage 2A, except to the extent that they are varied by the plans described in paragraphs (c), (d) and (e):
 - Site plan, Plan 5;
 - Pedestrian movement, Plan 7;
 - Vehicular movement, Plan 8;
 - Urban spaces, Plan 9;
 - Hotel environs study, Plan 18;
 - Public art Masterplan, Plan 21; and
 - Hotel: landscaping plan, Plan 36; and

2. No works may be commenced unless and until:
- (a) a private certifier or the City of Holdfast Bay has certified to the Development Assessment Commission that all work that constitutes building work under the Development Act 1993, complies with the Building Rules;
 - (b) an Environmental Management Plan (EMP) has been prepared in consultation with the Environment Protection Authority and the City of Holdfast Bay to address the management issues during construction. Matters to be addressed in the EMP must include:
 - traffic management during construction, including transport beyond the development site;
 - control and management of construction noise;
 - dust and mud control;
 - working hours;
 - stormwater management during construction;
 - site security and fencing;

5. Public art for the Stage 2A development must be established in accordance with the plans prepared pursuant to condition 3 (c) within six months of the first occupation of the hotel to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission.

6. The car parking areas must be designed in accordance with Australian Standards 2890.1-1993 and line markings must be maintained in good and substantial condition at all times.

7. The pedestrian paths and plazas proposed in the application, including the area situated between the existing Glenelg Surf Life Saving Club and the hotel building, must be open for pedestrian use from the commencement of use and occupation of the hotel and must then be kept open for pedestrian use at all times.

8. An iron-barred gate of at least 1.5 m in height must be constructed at the entrance to the stairwell on the south-eastern corner of the hotel building.

9. Access for service deliveries and waste disposal vehicles at the hotel plaza level must only be allowed between 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. daily.

10. The proposed toilets to replace the existing toilets adjoining the kiosk on the north-eastern side of the site must be established to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay prior to the demolition of these existing toilets.

ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION ACT 1993, SECTION 32 (1): AMENDMENT OF ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION POLICY

Notice By The Minister

Preamble

1. Regulation 4A(2) of the *Environment Protection (General) Regulations 1994* (see *Gazette* 27 October 1994 p. 1346), as varied, specifies the kinds of amendments that can be made by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*, to the *National Environment Protection (Used Packaging Materials) Measure* under section 32(1) of the *Environment Protection Act 1993*.

2. It is now proposed to make amendments of the specified kinds.

NOTICE

PURSUANT to section 32 of the *Environment Protection Act 1993* and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, I amend the *National Environment Protection (Used Packaging Materials) Measure*:

- (a) by striking out clause 1 and substituting the following clause:

Citation

1. This policy may be cited as the *Environment Protection (Used Packaging Materials) Policy 2001*;

- (b) by inserting in clause 2 "or on the Covenant ceasing to be in force, whichever occurs first" after "date of commencement";
- (c) by inserting after the definition of "**consumer packag-ing**" in clause 3 the following definition:

"**council**" means a council constituted under the *Local Government Act 1999*;

- (d) by inserting after the present contents of clause 3 (now to be designated as subclause (1)) the following subclause:

(2) In this policy, the expression "Mandatory pro-vision" followed by a statement as to the category of an offence is to be taken to signify that contravention of the provision at whose foot the expression appears will be an offence of the category so stated for the purposes of Part 5 of the Act;

- (e) by striking out Parts 3 and 4 and substituting the following Parts:

PART 3

OBLIGATIONS OF BRAND OWNERS

Application of Part

8. This Part does not apply in relation to the following:

- (a) consumer packaging:
- (i) that is a container to which Division 2 of Part 8 of the Act applies; or
 - (ii) that is of a type declared by the Authority by notice published in the *Gazette* to be consumer packaging to which this policy does not apply;
- (b) brand owners:
- (i) who do not contribute significantly to the waste stream; or
 - (ii) who are signatories to, and comply with, the Covenant; or
 - (iii) who can satisfy the Authority that they:
 - (A) engage in practices that produce equivalent outcomes to those achieved through the Covenant; or
 - (B) are part of an industry or industry sector for which arrangements exist that produce equivalent outcomes to those achieved through the Covenant.

(2) In making a declaration under subclause (1)(a)(ii), the Authority must have regard to:

- (a) the practices and achievements of Covenant signatories; and
- (b) the materials that are collected for re-use, recycling or energy recovery whether through kerbside recycling collection or otherwise; and
- (c) the state of technologies for re-use, recycling or energy recovery; and
- (d) any competitive issues that may arise from including or excluding particular materials.

(3) For the purposes of subclause (1)(b)(i), a brand owner will only be taken to be a brand owner that does not contribute significantly to the waste stream if the brand owner's products:

- (a) amount to 1 per cent or less of the notional market share for the products; and
- (b) are sold only within the State.

(4) In this clause:

“**notional market share**”, in relation to products, means the estimated value of the State's share of national annual retail sales of such products determined in accordance with the following formula:

$$NM = A \times \frac{PSA}{PA}$$

Where—

NM is the notional market share.

A is the value, determined by the Authority, of national annual retail sales of such products.

PSA is the most recent estimate of the population of South Australia published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

PA is the most recent estimate of the population of Australia published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

Brand owner to prepare action plan

9. (1) A brand owner must:

- (a) prepare, maintain and implement an action plan in accordance with this clause; and
- (b) comply with the plan.

Mandatory provision: Category B offence.

(2) The action plan must contain the following information:

- (a) how the brand owner intends to ensure that consumer packaging in which the brand owner's products are sold, or consumer packaging that is substantially the same as that packaging, is recovered and re-used, recycled or used for energy recovery; and
- (b) the quantity of each type of consumer packaging proposed to be recovered and re-used, recycled or used for energy recovery; and
- (c) how the brand owner intends to inform the public of the way in which the consumer packaging may be recovered.

(3) The quantity referred to in subclause (2)(b) must be at least equivalent to the levels of recovery and re-use, recycling or use for energy recovery agreed between participating jurisdictions in relation to the relevant type of consumer packaging or, in the absence of such an agreement, the levels achieved by signatories to the Covenant in relation to that type of packaging.

(4) A prosecution must not be commenced against a brand owner under this clause unless:

- (a) the Authority has served the brand owner with a notice, in writing, giving particulars of an alleged contravention of the clause and requiring the brand owner to comply with the clause within 3 months of the date of service of the notice; and

- (b) the Authority is satisfied that the brand owner has failed to comply with the requirement specified in the notice.

Records to be kept by brand owners

10. (1) A brand owner must, within three months of the end of a financial year, record the following information in relation each type of material used as consumer packaging by the brand owner during that financial year:

- (a) the number of units of packaging;
- (b) the total weight of material used;
- (c) the total weight of material recovered;
- (d) the total weight of recovered material re-used and recycled in Australia;
- (e) the total weight of recovered material re-used and recycled through export;
- (f) the total weight of recovered material used for energy recovery;
- (g) the total weight of recovered material disposed of to landfill;
- (h) the recovery rate calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$RR = \frac{WMR}{WMS} \times 100$$

Where—

RR is the recovery rate

WMR is the weight of material recovered from the post-consumer waste stream

WMS is the weight of material sold as packaging within Australia.

Mandatory provision: Category B offence.

(2) A brand owner must:

- (a) keep a record required under this clause for a period of five years commencing on the last day of the financial year to which the record relates; and
- (b) at the request of the Authority, make a record required to be kept under this clause available for inspection by the Authority.

Mandatory provision: Category B offence.

PART 4

OBLIGATIONS OF COUNCILS

Reporting obligations

11. A council that has, during a financial year or any part of a financial year, operated a kerbside recycling collection service must, within three months after the end of that financial year, provide the Authority with the following information:

- (a) the number of residential and non-residential premises in the council's area;
- (b) the number of residential and non-residential premises in the council's area that were covered by the service;
- (c) the participation rate for the service;
- (d) the fee charged by the council in respect of the service;
- (e) the total weight of each recyclable material collected;
- (f) the total weight of each recyclable material collected that was then disposed of to landfill.

An amendment specified in this notice comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

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

The City of Unley has resolved to establish a subsidiary pursuant to Section 42 of the Local Government Act 1999 to re-establish, enhance and sustain the position of the City of Unley in the retail and commercial business market place.

Pursuant to clause 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 of the Local Government Act 1999 I approve the establishment of the Unley Street Life Trust.

The charter of the Unley Street Life Trust is set out below.

CHARTER OF THE UNLEY STREET LIFE TRUST

1. Establishment

- 1.1 The Unley Street Life Trust (“the Trust”) is established by the City of Unley (“the Council”) as a subsidiary under Section 42 of the Local Government Act 1999 (“the Act”) on the day of 2001 and this Charter governs the affairs of the Trust.
- 1.2 The Trust is established to re-establish, enhance and sustain the position of the City of Unley in the retail and commercial business market place by developing, funding and managing integrated programs for the Council’s retail “strip” centres (“the commercial precincts”). A commercial precinct is defined by reference to the properties subject to a separate rate, as determined annually by the Council.
- 1.3 The structure and operations of the Unley Street Life Trust are to have an overarching application to the commercial precincts across the City, as well as an ability to undertake separate projects as may be required by the individual commercial precincts which pay a separate levy.
- 1.4 This Charter must be read in conjunction with Schedule 2 to the Act. The Trust shall conduct its affairs in accordance with Schedule 2 except as modified by this Charter.

2. Objects & Purposes

- 2.1 The Trust has been established with the following objects and purposes –
 - 2.1.1 to re-establish, enhance and sustain the City’s position in the retail and commercial business market place;
 - 2.1.2 to develop and adopt strategies to –
 - 2.1.2.1 focus strategic management decisions on the commercial precincts;
 - 2.1.2.2 develop, manage, co-ordinate and fund economic development initiatives which recognise local differences; and
 - 2.1.2.3 continually refine and redefine the strategic management framework for each precinct in response to changes in circumstances;

- 2.1.3 to improve the economic viability of the commercial precincts and generally across the City of Unley;
 - 2.1.4 to position the commercial precincts in a way that sustains retail, business and economic growth and maintains economic viability;
 - 2.1.5 to promote and co-ordinate strategic management actions in a way that will ensure ongoing participation and commitment from traders, investors, property owners and the Council;
 - 2.1.6 to enhance the diversity and vibrancy of the commercial precincts with the objective of enriching the quality of life in the City of Unley; and
 - 2.1.7 to undertake such other matters, purposes and things incidental to and in furtherance of these objects.
- 2.2 The Trust is not involved in a significant business activity as defined in the Clause 7 Statement prepared under the Competition Principles Agreement of the National Competition Policy.

3. The Board – Role & Membership

- 3.1 The Trust will be governed by a Board.
- 3.2 The Board is responsible for the administration of the affairs of the Trust. The Board must ensure insofar as it is practicable, that the Trust observes the objectives set out in this Charter, that information provided to the Council is accurate and that the Council is kept informed of the solvency of the Trust as well as any material developments which may affect the operating capacity and financial affairs of the Trust.
- 3.3 The Council will appoint fifteen (15) members to the Board drawn from the Council and the business and general community as follows –
 - 3.3.1 three to represent the interests of Unley Road businesses;
 - 3.3.2 three to represent the interests of King William Road businesses;
 - 3.3.3 three to represent the interests of Goodwood Road businesses;
 - 3.3.4 one to represent the interests of Glen Osmond Road businesses located in the Council area;
 - 3.3.5 one to represent the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society;
 - 3.3.6 one to be drawn from the local commercial business sector; and

- 3.3.7 three who must be able to demonstrate relevant business knowledge, to represent the Council.
- 3.4 Members of the Board shall not be entitled to a sitting fee.
- 3.5 Nominations for appointment by the Council will be called from persons representing the interests of the commercial precincts defined at Clause 1.2 . In the event that nominations for any position exceed the membership numbers available, the Council will appoint the member(s) on merit.
- 3.6 There will be a Chairperson and a Deputy Chairperson of the Board, both of whom shall be appointed by the Council from amongst the three (3) Council representatives for a term not exceeding three years. In the absence of the Chairperson, the Deputy Chairperson will act as the Chairperson. In the absence of the Chairperson and the Deputy Chairperson the Board will elect one of their number to act as the Chairperson for that meeting.

4. **Term of Office – The Board**

- 4.1 Subject only to the following sub-clauses, the term of office of each member of the Board will be as determined by the Council.
- 4.2 A Board Member will be appointed by the Council for a term not exceeding three years specified in the instrument of appointment and at the expiration of the term of office, is eligible for reappointment.
- 4.3 The term of office of a member of the Board will cease upon the Council providing written notice to the Board member, which will provide reasons for the taking of such action, or upon the happening of any other event through which the member would be ineligible to remain as a member of the Board.

(see Clause 4, Part 1 of Schedule 2 to the Act)

- 4.4 The Board may by a two thirds majority vote of the members present (excluding the member subject to this Clause 4.4) make a recommendation to the Council requesting that the Council terminate the appointment of the member in the event of:
- 4.4.1 any behaviour of the member which in the opinion of the Board amounts to impropriety;
- 4.4.2 serious neglect of duty in attending to the responsibilities of a member of the Board;
- 4.4.3 breach of fiduciary duty to the Board or the Council;
- 4.4.4 breach of the duty of confidentiality to the Board and the Council;

- 4.4.5 breach of the propriety requirements of the Board; or
 - 4.4.6 any other behaviour which may discredit the Board.
- 4.5 The Council will appoint a replacement member for any member whose term of office becomes vacant and in so doing will have regard to any recommendation of the Board.

5. **Proceedings of the Board**

- 5.1 The Board shall meet together for the despatch of business at least once in every two (2) calendar months.
- 5.2 Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes and in the event of an equality of votes the Chairperson shall have a casting vote in addition to a deliberative vote.
- 5.3 A quorum for a meeting of the Board shall be one-half of the actual number of members in office (ignoring any fraction) plus one. A meeting of the Board will not commence until a quorum of members is present and a meeting may not continue unless there is a quorum of members present.
- 5.4 For the purpose of this Clause, the contemporary linking together by a telephone, audio-visual or other instantaneous means ("*telecommunication meeting*") of a number of members of the Board provided that at least a quorum is present, is deemed to constitute a meeting of the Board. Each of the Board members taking part in the telecommunication meeting, must be able to hear and be heard by each of the other Board members present. At the commencement of the meeting, each Board member must announce his/her presence to all other Board members taking part in the meeting. A Board member must not leave a telecommunication meeting by disconnecting his/her telephone, audio visual or other communication equipment, unless that Board member has previously notified the Chairperson of the meeting.
- 5.5 In the event that there is not a quorum present at two consecutive meetings of the Board, then an extraordinary meeting of the Board may be convened in the same manner as for a special meeting (see Clause 5.7), at which the business which was on the agendas for the two previous but failed meetings may be transacted at the extraordinary meeting of the Board. Decisions made at such a meeting will be binding on all members of the Board.
- 5.6 Subject only to any specific requirement of this Charter, all matters for decision at a meeting of the Board will be decided by a simple majority of the members present and entitled to vote on the matter. All members present and entitled to vote on a matter are required to cast a vote. Subject to Clause 5.2 all members are entitled only to a deliberative vote. Board members may not vote by proxy.

- 5.7 A special meeting of the Board may be held at any time and may be called at the request of the Chairman or at the written request of two members of the Board.
- 5.8 Notice of all meetings will be given in accordance with the provisions applicable to a committee meeting under Part 2 of Chapter 6 of the Act and the associated Regulations.
- 5.9 Meetings of the Board will be open to the public in accordance with Part 3 of Chapter 6 of the Act unless the Board resolves otherwise.
- 5.10 The Board must ensure that accurate written minutes of its proceedings are entered in books kept for that purpose and that the minutes are produced for verification at the subsequent meeting of the Board.
- 5.11 A minute that is entered, confirmed and signed in accordance with clause 5.10 is, in the absence of proof to the contrary, proof of the proceedings to which the minute relates.
- 5.12 Where minutes have been entered, confirmed and signed in accordance with clause 5.10, it is to be taken, in the absence of proof to the contrary, that:
- 5.12.1 the meeting to which the minutes relate was held;
 - 5.12.2 the proceedings recorded in the minutes occurred; and
 - 5.12.3 all appointments of officers or auditors recorded in the minutes were validly made.
- 5.13 Meetings of the Board will be conducted in accordance with Council Policy 1.1.29 (as varied from time to time) except as modified by this Charter or by express resolution of the Council.

6. Propriety of Members of the Board

- 6.1 The principles regarding conflict of interest prescribed at Division 3 of Part 4 of Chapter 5 of the Act will apply to all members of the Board as if they were elected members of the Council.
- 6.2 The members of the Board will not be required to comply with Division 2, Chapter 5 (Register of Interests) of the Act.
- 6.3 The members of the Board will at all times act in accordance with their duties of confidence and confidentiality and individual fiduciary duties including honesty and the exercise of reasonable care and diligence with respect to the Board as required by Part 4, Division 1, Chapter 5 of the Act and Clause 7 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 to the Act.

7. Powers

- 7.1 The Trust is constituted as a body corporate under the Act and in all things acts through the Board.
- 7.2 The Trust has:
- 7.2.1 the power to incur expenditure necessary in the performance of its functions and duties in accordance with the objectives of this Charter and within budgets approved by the Council;
 - 7.2.2 the power to sue and be sued in its corporate name;
 - 7.2.3 the power to enter into any kind of contract or arrangement approved by the Council;
 - 7.2.4 the planning, costing, endorsement and reporting upon projects to the Council and to stakeholders of the Trust;
 - 7.2.5 the power to make application for funds and other revenue deemed necessary for the performance of its powers, functions and duties;
 - 7.2.6 the duty where required by the Council to return surplus revenue to the Council at the end of any financial year;
 - 7.2.7 with the approval of the Council, the power to invest funds in accordance with Part 4 of Chapter 9 of the Act;
 - 7.2.8 the power to promote and market the commercial precincts and generally of retail and business activities in the Council area;
 - 7.2.9 the power to co-ordinate projects and related activities necessary to meet the requirements of the Trust's business plan; and
 - 7.2.10 the power to do anything else necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, the exercise, performance or discharge of its powers, functions or duties.
- 7.3 The Trust may only borrow funds with the approval of the Council.
- 7.4 The Trust will have a common seal which may be affixed to documents requiring execution under common seal and must be witnessed by the Chairperson of the Board and one other Board member.
- 7.5 The common seal must not be affixed to a document except to give effect to a resolution of the Board. The Chairperson will maintain a register which records the resolutions of the Board giving authority to affix the common seal and details of the documents to which the common seal has been affixed with particulars of the persons who witnessed the fixing of the seal and the date.

- 7.6 The Board may by instrument under seal authorise a person to execute documents on behalf of the Trust. The Chairperson will maintain a register of such resolutions and details of any documents executed in this way, together with particulars of the person executing the document.
- 7.7 Funds raised through separate rates applied to a defined commercial precinct, must be expended in accordance with project plans specifically designated and approved for that commercial precinct.
- 7.8 Subject to Clause 7.2.6 funds that remain unspent in relation to specific commercial precinct projects, may be accumulated for expenditure in a later period within the commercial precinct from which the surplus was generated.
- 7.9 The Trust must operate within the Council's Unley Street Life Trust Funding Policies 7.2.01 (City-Wide Expenditure) and 7.2.02 (Funding Processes and Requirements) as varied from time to time.

8. **Committees**

- 8.1 The Board may establish committees for such purposes and with terms of reference as the Board determines from time to time.
- 8.2 The members of committees need not be members of the Board.
- 8.3 The Chairperson of the Board is ex officio a member of all committees.
- 8.4 The Board may not delegate any of its powers or functions to a committee and any determination of a committee shall be by way of recommendation to the Board.

9. **Administrative Matters**

- 9.1 The Council may appoint an officer or officers to assist the Trust to –
 - 9.1.1 record and distribute minutes of meetings of the Trust;
 - 9.1.2 record and maintain accounts and financial transactions relating to the funds of the Trust;
 - 9.1.3 communicate with representatives of traders and commercial groups involved in the activities of the Trust;

- 9.1.4 assist with the efficient and effective management of the operations and affairs of the Trust;
 - 9.1.5 assist the Trust with the implementation of its policies and lawful decisions;
 - 9.1.6 to provide advice and reports to the Board on the exercise and performance of the Trust's powers and functions; and
 - 9.1.7 to assist with the administration of the affairs of the Trust generally.
- 9.2 With the consent of the Council, the Board may engage professional consultants and it may authorise the Chairperson to employ such other officers on its behalf as are required for the efficient and effective management of the operations and affairs of the Trust.

10. **Financial Contributions to the Trust**

- 10.1 The Board will annually determine and recommend to the Council the funds required by the Trust to enable it to function.
- 10.2 The Board is accountable to the Council to ensure that the Trust functions in accordance with its objects and purposes and within approved budgets.
- 10.3 The Trust must, by 31 March in each year, make recommendations to the Council in respect of the separate rates to be levied upon the commercial precincts for the purpose of raising revenue in order to meet the objectives of the Trust's business plan and individual commercial precinct projects.

11. **Budget**

- 11.1 The Trust must prepare a draft budget for each financial year, which is based on specific project plans.
- 11.2 The Trust must submit a draft budget to the Council in time for it to receive appropriate consideration and approval by the Council within the Council's normal budget development process.
- 11.3 The Trust may adopt its budget only after it has been approved by the Council.
- 11.4 The Trust must provide a copy of its final budget to the Council within five business days after adoption by the Trust.
- 11.5 The Trust must reconsider its budget in accordance with Regulation 7 of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1999.

(See Clause 9, Part 1, Schedule 2 to the Act for the contents of the budget.)

12. Business Plan

- 12.1 The Trust shall prepare and adopt an annual business plan and submit it to the Council for approval.
- 12.2 The business plan must include –
- 12.2.1 performance targets that the Trust is to pursue;
 - 12.2.2 a statement of the financial and other resources and internal processes that will be required to achieve the Trust's performance targets; and
 - 12.2.3 the performance measures that are to be used to monitor and assess the performance of the Trust against the targets set at Clause 12.2.1 above.
- 12.3 The Trust must review the Business Plan in conjunction with the Council on at least an annual basis and in any event by the 31 March.
- 12.4 The Trust may, after consultation with and the approval of the Council, amend its business plan at any time.

(See Clause 8, Part 2, Schedule 2 to the Act for the content of the Business Plan).

13. Accounting

The Trust must ensure that its accounting records, accounts and financial statements are prepared and maintained in accordance with all relevant Australian Accounting Standards.

(See Regulations 8 and 9, Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1999 in relation to particular accounting practices).

14. Audit

- 14.1 The auditor of the Trust shall be the Council's current auditor.
- 14.2 The Trust must provide its audited financial statements to the Chief Executive Officer of the Council by 31 August in each year.

(See Part 5, Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1999 in relation to the Trust's audit responsibilities).

- 14.3 The Trust is not obliged to establish an audit committee, but subject to the approval of the Council may do so if determined appropriate by the Board.

(See Clause 13, Part 1, Schedule 2 to the Act for the functions of an Audit Committee).

15. Liabilities

- 15.1 Liabilities incurred or assumed by the Trust are guaranteed by the Council.
- 15.2 All borrowings of the Trust require the prior approval of the Council (which may be absolute or conditional).
- 15.3 The Trust is required to apply for membership of the Local Government Association Mutual Liability Scheme. In the event that membership is not approved, the Trust must take out and maintain public liability insurance cover of at least \$20 million per claim or such other amount as the Council may from time to time determine.

16. Finance

- 16.1 The Council Administration will provide the Trust with banking and account keeping services at no cost.
- 16.2 The Board must act prudently in the handling of all financial commitments of the Trust and will be provided with quarterly financial reports by the Council officers appointed pursuant to Clause 9.1 .

17. Reports & Information

- 17.1 The Trust must submit its annual report on its work and operations including its audited financial statements, to the Council before 31 August in each year.
- 17.2 At any time, on written request from the Council, the Board shall report to the Council on matters being undertaken by the Trust.
- 17.3 The Trust must, at the written request of the Council, furnish to the Council information or records in the possession or control of the Trust as the Council may require in such manner and form as the Council may require.

(See Clause 11, Schedule 2 to the Act.)

18. Alteration to the Charter

- 18.1 This Charter may be amended by resolution of the Council.
- 18.2 The Council will ensure that the amended Charter is published in the Gazette.

18.3 Before the Council votes on a proposal to alter this Charter it must take into account any recommendations of the Board.

18.4 This Charter is to be reviewed every two (2) years.

19. Direction by the Council

19.1 In accordance with Schedule 2 to the Act the Trust is at all times subject to the direction and control of the Council.

19.2 A direction given by the Council under this Clause must be in writing and will be available at the Council's principal office.

20. Dissolution of the Trust

20.1 The Trust may be dissolved by the Minister in the circumstances envisaged by Clause 16, Part 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act.

20.2 In the event of there being net assets upon dissolution and after realisation of all assets and meeting all liabilities, the net assets will vest in the Council.

20.3 In the event of there being an insolvency of the Trust at the time of dissolution, the Council will be responsible to pay the liabilities of the Trust.

Services****BACKGROUND**

Council received a report in August 2000 (GP&ED Item 11) and adopted a Draft Charter for the Unley Street Life Trust, in order to take up Section 42 of the Local Government Act 1999, which enables Councils to establish Subsidiaries.

The Council amended clause 5.8.5 of the Draft Charter, ensuring that reasons are to be provided for any removal from office, and further resolved that:

- “3. *Legal advice and the views of the Unley Street Life Trust be obtained in relation to the Draft Charter for the Unley Street Life Trust contained in Attachment 4 of this report.*
- “4. *The final Draft Charter, including any subsequent amendments be submitted to Council in due course, for endorsement.*”

This report presents the legal advice obtained and the views of the Trust, and seeks the next step in establishing a Subsidiary.

DISCUSSION

Legal advice was sought on 5 September 2000. Attachment 1 provides the response received from Norman Waterhouse Lawyers.

The Draft Charter presented in August contained no aspects that were legally improper or outside the provisions in Schedule 2 to the Act, but the lawyers offered a different format for the document and added some provisions. The Administration accepted the change in style, but some of the local nuances had been lost.

There was discussion with Norman Waterhouse, based on the details in Attachment 1, and some of their proposals were further amended. These largely concerned preservation of the local principles and procedures that have been developed between the Trust and the Council.

In accordance with Council's resolution, a Draft Charter was presented to the Street Life Trust on 19 December 2000, but was deferred to 23 January 2001. Attachment 2 provides the report received by the Trust, and details the main changes to the Draft Charter that resulted from the legal advice in September.

ITEM 36**UNLEY STREET LIFE TRUST – DRAFT CHARTER – contd.**

The minutes from the Trust's January meeting had not been endorsed at the time of preparing this report, but a number of Officers were in attendance and it is understood that the following changes to the Draft Charter were formally resolved by the Trust.

Clause 2.1.1

Change the word "Council's" to "City's". This has been included in the proposed Draft Charter in Attachment 3.

Clause 5.10

Delete this Clause, subject to legal advice. Norman Waterhouse lawyers advised on 25 January 2001 that this clause may be deleted without a detrimental effect on the intention of the Charter. Reliance may be placed upon Section 62 and Schedule 2, Clauses 34 and 38 to ensure that members deal with information appropriately. Clause 5.10 as was presented to the Trust, i.e. the amended version received from Norman Waterhouse in Attachment 1, has been deleted from the Draft Charter now presented for Council's consideration. The subsequent clauses have been re-numbered.

Clause 9.2

The need to obtain Council's consent, and the process for doing so, was queried. This clause is consistent with clause 7.2.3 which provides that any kind of contract or arrangement must be approved by the Council. The Draft has not been amended. The Administration's expectation is that this "consent of the Council" will be administered via an appropriate delegation, following formal approval of the Subsidiary by the Minister.

A new Clause 18.4

The Trust sought the addition of a provision that "This Charter is to be reviewed every two (2) years." Norman Waterhouse has advised that there is no legislative provision that prevents the Council from inserting this clause. Schedule 2, Clause 3(4) of the Act empowers the Council to review the Charter at any time, and requires a review when necessary in consequence of a review of the Council's strategic management plan. Therefore this clause has been added to the proposed Charter.

SUMMARY

The City Manager observes that this group has effectively become a Council Committee, which was basically what Council had sought to avoid in the first place. The concept of the traders being released from the Council bureaucracy and empowered to take control of their own livelihoods seems to have been lost in the legislation. The City Manager contends this should be brought to the attention of the Minister for Local Government, expressing concern.

ITEM 36**UNLEY STREET LIFE TRUST – DRAFT CHARTER – contd.**

The Draft Charter for the Unley Street Life Trust that was endorsed by the Council in August 2000, has been considered and amended by Norman Waterhouse Lawyers and by the Unley Street Life Trust. The document contained in Attachment 3 is now proposed as the Draft Charter that should go forward to the Minister, seeking approval for the establishment of the Unley Street Life Trust as a Subsidiary.

Statement of Environmental Objectives for Existing Regulated Activities

PURSUANT to section 104 (1) of the Petroleum Act 2000 (the Act) I, Robert Anthony Laws, Director Petroleum, Office of Minerals and Energy Resources, Department of Primary Industries and Resources SA, Delegate of the Minister for Minerals and Energy, pursuant to Delegation dated 25 September 2000, *Gazetted* 28 September 2000, do hereby publish the following document as having been approved as a statement of environmental objectives under the Act.

DEVELOPMENT ACT 1993

Development Plan Format Review and Orderly Residential Development Concept Plans—Plan Amendment Report—Draft for Public Consultation

THE City of Salisbury has prepared a draft Plan Amendment Report (PAR) to amend the Development Plan. The Development Plan Format Review component of this PAR affects the whole of the Salisbury Council area, whilst the orderly residential development concept plans affect areas within the suburbs of Burton, Paralowie, Salisbury, Salisbury Downs, Parafield Gardens and Salisbury Plain.

Council is seeking to update the Development Plan to produce a user-friendly document, integrate metropolitan policies with council-wide policies and clarify public notification arrangements.

The key structural and policy changes are:

- (1) The consolidation of the Metropolitan Objectives and Principles and the Salisbury council-wide policies to avoid overlapping policies, to delete repetitive policies and to delete policies not associated with the Salisbury

Council area. The consolidation will not result in any changes to existing policy.

- (2) A new structure to the council-wide Objectives and Principles of Development Control to make the document easier to understand.
- (3) The inclusion of two new Tables—Complying Development and Category 1 Development for Public Notification Purposes—based on, but no more onerous than, the Development Regulations 1993.
- (4) Inclusion of public notification categories in all zones. This is based on, but no more onerous than, the Development Regulations 1993.

Further, it has come to light that a series of orderly residential development concept plans (contained in the *Orderly Residential Development Supplementary Development Plan (SDP)*) have been in interim operation since 1 February 1990. That is, whilst council has had regard to the eleven concept plans when assessing residential development in the defined area, the concept plans have not been technically consolidated within council's Development Plan. This amendment will incorporate the concept plans into the Development Plan.

The amendment does not propose or require rezoning of any land within the affected areas.

The draft Plan Amendment Report and Statement of Investigations will be available for public inspection and purchase during normal office hours at the Council Office (12 James Street, Salisbury, S.A. 5108) from Thursday, 17 May 2001 to Tuesday, 17 July 2001. A copy of the Plan Amendment Report can be purchased, at \$7.50 per copy, from the Council office.

Written submissions regarding the draft amendment will be accepted by the City of Salisbury until 5 p.m. on Tuesday, 17 July 2001. The written submission should also clearly indicate whether you wish to speak at the public hearing on your submission.
