PUBLIC SECTOR MANAGEMENT ACT 1995 SECTION 7: STRUCTURE OF PUBLIC SERVICE—DEPARTMENT OF WATER, LAND AND BIODIVERSITY CONSERVA-TION

Proclamation By The Governor

PURSUANT to section 7 of the Public Sector Management Act 1995 and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, I—

- (a) establish an administrative unit and assign to it the title Department of Water, Land and Biodiversity Conservation;
- (b) abolish the Department for Water Resources;
- (c) transfer the employees referred to in the Schedule to the Department of Water, Land and Biodiversity Conservation;
- (d) declare that, for financial accounting and reporting purposes, the transfer of employees of the Department of Primary Industries and Resources to the Department of Water, Land and Biodiversity Conservation pursuant to this proclamation, and any associated transfer of functions or duties, will be taken to occur on 1 May 2002.

SCHEDULE

Transfer of Employees to new Department

Employees of the Department of Primary Industries and Resources in the following sections of the Sustainable Resources Group:

- (a) Pastoral Management;
- (b) Water Management (including Mt Lofty Catchment, Dryland Salinity, and Lower Murray Rehabilitation);
- (c) Animal and Plant Control Commission;
- (d) Land Management and Revegetation;
- (e) Strategic and Environmental Services (other than Policy, Planning and Environmental Services);
- (f) Landcare and Landcare Education.
- All employees of the Department for Water Resources.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE HARBORS AND NAVIGATION ACT 1993

No. 18 of 2002

At the Executive Council Office at Adelaide, 8 April 2002

PURSUANT to the *Harbors and Navigation Act 1993* and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, I make the following regulations.

SCHEDULE

Restricted Waters

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Harbors and Navigation (Control of Caulerpa Taxifolia) Regulations 2002.*

Commencement

2. These regulations will come into operation on 9 April 2002.

Interpretation

3. In these regulations—

"Act" means the Harbors and Navigation Act 1993.

Restricted waters: s. 27

4. The activities specified in an entry in the Schedule are prohibited in the waters described in that entry ("**restricted waters**") during the periods specified in that entry.

Offences

5. (1) A person who, without the approval of the CEO, contravenes or fails to comply in restricted waters with a prohibition applying in the waters according to the Schedule is guilty of an offence (but it is a defence to a charge of such an offence for the defendant to prove that the defendant was taking part in a rescue operation or otherwise acting in an emergency).

Maximum penalty:	\$1 250
Expiation fee:	\$160.

(2) If a vessel is involved in the commission of an offence against subregulation (1), the owner of the vessel is also guilty of an offence (but it is a defence to a charge of such an offence for the owner to prove that the vessel was operated in the manner constituting the offence without the owner's consent).

Maximum penalty:	\$1 250
Expiation fee:	\$160.

(3) A prohibition applying in restricted waters according to the Schedule does not apply in relation to an authorised person in the exercise of powers under the Act or regulations under the Act.

SCHEDULE

Restricted Waters

Waters

1. The waters known as West Lakes.

Period Continuous until 9 May 2002.

Prohibited activities

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- The taking of vessels into the waters or causing or permitting vessels to enter or remain in the waters.
- Any aquatic activity in the waters including swimming, bathing or scuba diving.
