#### FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Dr Rod Connolly or persons acting as his agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') from School of Environmental and Applied Sciences, Griffith University, PMB 50, Gold Coast Mail Centre, Qld 9726 is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982 to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), using the gear specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 March 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

## SCHEDULE 1

The collection of Snapper (*Pagrus auratus*), King George Whiting (*Silaginodes punctata*), Australian Salmon (*Arripis trutta*), Garfish (*Hyporhamphus melanochir*), Flathead (*Platycephalus* spp), Mulloway (*Argyosomus hololepidotus*), Stripped Trumpeter (*Pelates sexlineatus*), Common Pipefish (*Stigmatopora nigra*), Blue Swimmer Crab (*Portunus pelagicus*) and Western King Prawn (*Penaeus latisulcatus*), including species below the legal minimum length (if applicable) from marine waters of South Australia.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1 rod and line per person.
- 1 fyke net (the maximum length of each wing which does not exceed 5 m, and minimum mesh size 6 mm).
- 1 seine net (the maximum length of which does not exceed 10 m, maximum depth of which does not exceed 2 m and minimum mesh size of 1 mm).
- 1 seine net (the maximum length of which does not exceed 40 m, maximum depth of which does not exceed 2.5 m and minimum mesh size of 10 mm).
- 1 gill net (the maximum length of which does not exceed 35 m, maximum depth of which does not exceed 1.5 m and minimum mesh size of 25 mm).

- 1 gill net (the maximum length of which does not exceed 100 m, maximum depth of which does not exceed 2.5 m and minimum mesh size of 50 mm).
- 1 beam trawl net (the maximum width of which does not exceed 1 m).
- 1 otter trawl net (the maximum width of which does not exceed 2.5 m).

### SCHEDULE 3

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and may not be sold.

2. A maximum of 30 fish of each species may be collected per location, with a maximum of 10 fish of each species per sample.

3. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity; details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

4. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the outcomes of the research and the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention Roger Hill, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within 3 months of the expiry of this notice, giving the following details:

- the date and time of collection;
- the description of all species collected; and
- the number of each species collected.

5. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice. Dated 17 May 2002.
