## EXPLOSIVES ACT 1936 SECTION 48: PROHIBITION OF CERTAIN EXPLOSIVES

Proclamation By The Governor

#### (L.S.) MARJORIE JACKSON-NELSON

PURSUANT to section 48 of the *Explosives Act 1936*, I, the Governor, judging that it is expedient for the public safety to do so and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council make the following proclamation:

#### Revocation

1. The proclamation made under section 48 of the Act on 21 June 1990 (see *Gazette* 21 June 1990 p. 1642) is revoked.

#### Interpretation

2. In this proclamation—

'bomb' means a device designed or adapted to explode and cause damage to property or death or personal injury;

'cracker shell' means a 12 gauge cartridge designed and manufactured principally for use in scaring and dispersing birds and other animals and containing a projectile that explodes;

'Crown' means the Crown in right of the Commonwealth or a State or a Territory of the Commonwealth;

'distress signal' means a pyrotechnic device intended for signalling or warning or similar purposes and includes a marine flare or signal, landing flare, highway flare, highway fusee, line-carrying rocket, anti-hail rocket, cloud seeding rocket, avalanche rocket, railway fog signal or smoke generator;

#### 'firework' means-

- (a) a manufactured firework item; or
- (b) an item designed or adapted so as to contain or include an explosive that on ignition burns or explodes, or both, to produce a visual effect or aural effect, or both; or
- (c) flash powder or other pyrotechnic substance,

but does not include a distress signal, a model rocket motor or a cracker shell.

#### Prohibition

- 3. The manufacture, keeping, conveyance or sale of the following explosives is prohibited:
  - (a) a bomb;
  - (b) a hand-grenade;
  - (c) a projectile that contains an incendiary, tracer, explosive, lachrymatory, nauseating, toxic or other similar substance, whether or not the projectile forms part of a cartridge, other than—
    - (i) a distress signal; or
    - (ii) a cracker shell; or
    - (iii) a firework.

Authorisation of certain explosives otherwise prohibited

- 4. Clause 3 does not apply to the manufacture, keeping, conveyance or sale of an unclassified explosive that is designed or being developed—
  - (a) for use in underground mining activities; or
  - (b) for military purposes of the Crown or a foreign government,

if that manufacture, keeping, conveyance or sale is in accordance with the terms of an authorisation of the Director granted under regulations made under the Act.

- 6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

#### NATIONAL PARKS REGULATIONS 2001

Closure of the Gammon Ranges National Park

PURSUANT to Regulation 8 (3) (d) of the National Parks Regulations 2001, I, Edward Gregory Leaman, the Director of National Parks and Wildlife, close to the public the whole of the Gammon Ranges National Park from 6 p.m. on Friday, 31 May 2002 until 6 p.m. on Friday, 7 June 2002.

The internal roads within the park will be closed to the public, however, the following main public access roads within the park will be exempted from the closure:

The main road connecting Copley-Nepabunna-Balcanoona;

The main road connecting Blinman-Wirrealpa;

The main road connecting Yunta-Balcanoona-Arkaroola;

The main road connecting Arkaroola-Umberatana.

Tourist facilities located at Arkaroola will remain open during the period of closure.

#### Use of Firearms Within the Reserve

Pursuant to Regulations 8 (4), 20 (1) and 41 of the National Parks Regulations, I, Edward Gregory Leaman, the Director of National Parks and Wildlife grant permission to members of Sporting Shooters SA permitted by law to carry a firearm to enter and remain in the Gammon Ranges National Park for the purpose of taking feral animals from 6 p.m. on Friday, 31 May 2002 until 6 p.m. on Friday, 7 June 2002.

This permission is conditional upon the observance by each of those persons of the requirements of the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972, the National Parks Regulations 2001 and the National Parks and Wildlife (Hunting) Regulations 1996, including those requiring compliance with the directions, requests, requirements and orders of Wardens.

The purpose of the closure is to ensure the safety of the public during a feral animal-culling program within the reserve during the periods indicated.

#### ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1961

Operation of B-Double Vehicles up to 25 m in Length

PURSUANT to the provisions of Section 161A of the Road Traffic Act 1961 and Regulation 35 of the Road Traffic (Miscellaneous) Regulations 1999, I, T. N. Argent, Executive Director, Transport SA, as an authorised delegate of the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning, hereby approve B-Double Vehicles up to an overall length not exceeding 25 m, to operate on routes specified by this Notice and in accordance with the document titled *Operation of Medium Combination Vehicles in South Australia, Edition No. 1* (clauses 1-6 and 8-10 only), issued by Transport SA, and

PURSUANT to the provisions of Section 163AA of the Road Traffic Act 1961, I, T. N. Argent, Executive Director, Transport SA, as an authorised delegate of the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning, hereby exempt B-Doubles transporting baled wool from Rule 72 Height of the Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules 1999.

Both the exemption and approval are subject to the following conditions:

#### 1. Special Conditions

- 1.1 This Notice and the document titled 'Operation of Medium Combination Vehicles in South Australia', Edition 1 (clauses 1-6 and 8-10 only), issued by Transport SA or a legible copy of each shall be carried by the driver of the vehicle at all times when operating under this approval and exemption and be produced when requested by an Inspector appointed under the Road Traffic Act 1961 and/or Motor Vehicles Act 1959, or a Police Officer.
- 1.2 This Notice can stand alone or can be read in conjunction with an individual permit issued by Transport SA.
- 1.3 The vehicle is not under 'Notice of Suspension to Operate as a Medium Combination Vehicle' issued by the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning.
- 1.4 When the B-Double is travelling along Main South Road between Cape Jervis and Delamere, the drive axle group of a tandem drive prime mover shall have a mass of not less than 14 tonnes when the B-Double is carrying a load of more than 10 tonnes.
- 1.5 After disembarking from the ferry at Cape Jervis, the B-Double must allow all other passenger vehicles disembarking from the ferry to proceed towards Myponga before the B-Double proceeds.

#### Definitions

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:

- 2.1 'B-Double' means a combination consisting of a prime mover towing 2 semi-trailers where the first semi-trailer is connected to the prime mover by a fifth wheel coupling and the second semi-trailer is connected to the first semi-trailer by a fifth wheel coupling.
- 2.2 'Maintenance Management Scheme' means a scheme that is recognised by Transport SA as meeting the requirement of the maintenance management module (including audit requirements) of the National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme (NHVAS).
- 2.3 'National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme' (NHVAS) means the comprehensive accreditation package developed by the National Road Transport Commission and approved by the Australian Transport Council on 14 November 1997.
- 2.4 'valid National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Maintenance Module label' and 'valid TruckSafe label' means a label:
  - (a) issued to an accredited operator (whose accreditation status has not been cancelled or suspended); and
  - (b) displayed on the nominated vehicle (owned or captured by the operator),

for which the label was originally issued by the accrediting authority.

#### 3. General Conditions

- 3.1 The vehicles defined herein are operated in accordance with the conditions specified in the document titled 'Operation of Medium Combination Vehicles in South Australia' Edition 1, (clauses 1-6, 8-10 only) issued by Transport SA and as amended by this Notice.
- 3.2 Where a B-Double is carrying dangerous goods on the Adelaide-Crafers Highway the vehicle combination shall be fitted with an approved anti-lock brake system in accordance with Transport SA's specifications. Refer to Permit Information Bulletin titled 'B-Double Anti-lock Brake Systems'.
- 3.3 The gross mass of the vehicle and/or combination does not exceed the gross vehicle and/or gross combination mass limits specified in the document titled 'Operation of Medium Combination Vehicles in South Australia', Edition 1 (clauses 1-6 and 8-10 only), issued by Transport SA.
- 4. Inspection and Maintenance Accreditation Requirements
  - 4.1 All South Australian registered vehicle units (prime movers and semi-trailers) must be either:
    - (a) inspected and display a current inspection label as detailed in the document titled 'Operation of Medium Combination Vehicles in South Australia' Edition 1, issued by Transport SA, or
    - (b) accredited under a Maintenance Management Scheme and display a valid National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Maintenance Module label or valid TruckSafe label.

- 4.2 Vehicles registered in New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia and Australian Capital Territory must comply with specified inspection and accreditation requirements of their home state or territory.
- 4.3 Vehicles registered in the Northern Territory must display either current South Australian inspection labels or current Northern Territory inspection and rating labels in accordance with the Mutual Recognition Agreement between South Australia and the Northern Territory, or be accredited under a Maintenance Management Scheme and display either a valid National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Maintenance Module labels or valid TruckSafe labels.

#### 5. Registration Categories

5.1 Vehicles operating under this Notice shall be registered in accordance with the Charge Codes shown in Table 1.

Note: A charge code is displayed on the truck and prime mover registration certificate and registration label.

#### 6. Transport of Baled Wool

- 6.1 Baled wool may be carried subject to the following conditions:
  - 6.1.1 The baled wool shall not be loaded more than four layers high.
  - 6.1.2 The maximum overall vehicle height including the baled wool shall not exceed 4.6 m.
  - 6.1.3 The overall width of all axles or axle groups of the vehicle carrying the load, excluding the front axle or axle group, when measured between two vertical parallel planes located at the outer extremities of the tyres, shall not be less than 2.1 m.
  - 6.1.4 Hauliers operating under provisions of this Notice should be aware that some bridges, signs, overhead wires, trees and signals may not provide sufficient clearance for the passage of a 4.6 m high vehicle.

#### 7. Routes

- 7.1 B-Double Vehicles up to 25 m in length, operating in accordance with this Notice, shall operate only on the approved routes and in accordance with the additional conditions specified in the maps 'Route Network for B-Double Vehicles up to 25 m in Length' as included in this Notice.
- 7.2 B-Doubles are not permitted to assemble or disassemble along the route, or otherwise deviate from the route unless allowed by this Notice or under an individually issued permit.
- 7.3 B-Doubles may only stop in parking bays showing a 'Truck Parking Area' sign for rest purposes or vehicle checks but not for assembly or disassembly purposes. The sign shall comply with Australian Standard AS 1742.6 service symbol sign S13. The signs display a white 'P' and symbolic articulated vehicle on a blue background.
- 7.4 Approval to operate B-Double Vehicles up to 25 m in length in accordance with the route maps 'Medium Combination Vehicles Route Network' included in the document 'Operation of Medium Combination Vehicles in South Australia' Edition 1, issued by Transport SA, is revoked.

This Notice is valid from 12 o'clock midnight on 8 May 2002 and the Notice titled 'Operation of B-Double Vehicles up to 25 m in Length' that appeared in the *South Australian Government Gazette* dated 21 February 2002 is revoked at midnight on 8 May 2002.




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












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




























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





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







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





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


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





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


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


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





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


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


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



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
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#### ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1961

Higher Mass Limits for Vehicles Fitted with Road Friendly Suspensions

PURSUANT to Section 163AA of the Road Traffic Act (the Act), 1961, I, T. N. Argent, Executive Director, Transport SA, as an authorised delegate of the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning, hereby exempt vehicle configurations fitted with Road Friendly Suspensions as described in Table 1 of this Notice, from the following provisions of the Road Traffic (Mass and Loading Requirements), Regulations 1999:

- Schedule 1, Part 1—Mass Limits, Table 1—Mass Limits for Single Axle and Axle Groups, in so far as it relates to axle or axle mass limits for axle or axle group configurations specified in table 2 of this Notice.
- Schedule 1, Part 1—Mass Limits, Clause 3 (1) (2) and (3) Mass Limits relating to axle spacing.
- Schedule 1, Part 1, Clause 4 (1) Mass limits for combinations,

for travel on only those routes specified in this Notice, in accordance with approvals granted under Section 161A of the said Act.

This exemption is subject to the following conditions:

### 1. Special Conditions

- 1.1 This Notice or a legible copy shall be carried by the driver of the vehicle at all times when operating under this exemption and be produced when requested by an Inspector appointed under the Road Traffic Act 1961 and/or Motor Vehicles Act 1959, or a Police Officer.
- 1.2 Drivers of road trains when operating under this exemption must also carry a copy of:
  - 1.2.1 The current South Australian Government Gazette notice titled 'Operation of Road Train Vehicles in South Australia': and
  - 1.2.2 The information booklet titled 'Operation of Road Train Vehicles in South Australia' Edition No. 1 (Part 1 clauses 1-6, 8-10 and Part 2 clauses 11-17 only), issued by Transport SA.
- 1.3 Drivers of B-Doubles when operating under this exemption must also carry a copy of:
  - 1.3.1 The current South Australian Government Gazette notice titled 'Operation of B-Double Vehicles up to 25 m in Length', and
  - 1.3.2 The information booklet titled 'Operation of Medium Combination Vehicles in South Australia' Edition No. 1 (clauses 1-6, 8-10 only) issued by Transport SA.
- 1.4 Drivers of Car Carrier Combinations, other than B-Doubles or Road Trains, which are more than 19 m long when operating under this exemption must also carry a copy of:
  - 1.4.1 The current *South Australian Government Gazette* notice titled 'Operation Car Carrier Combinations up to 25 m in Length'; and
  - 1.4.2 The information booklet titled 'Operation of Medium Combination Vehicles in South Australia' Edition No. 1 (clauses 1-6, 8-10 only), issued by Transport SA.
- 1.5 In addition to the conditions specified in this notice, B-Doubles, Car Carrier Combinations and Road Trains must comply with all the conditions of the respective South Australian Government Gazette Notices under which they operate, with the exception of the axle and/or axle group mass limits and gross mass limits covered by this Notice for Higher Mass Limits.

### 2. Approved Vehicles

2.1 Only the axle groups specified for vehicles and/or combinations nominated in Table 1 with the corresponding configuration codes and which are fitted with road friendly suspensions are approved to operate, at higher mass limits, under this Notice.

#### 3. Definitions

- 3.1 For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:
  - 3.1.1 'Car Carrier Combination' means a rigid motor vehicle (but not including a prime mover) designed to carry motor vehicles, fitted with a tandem axle group at the rear, towing a trailer designed to carry motor vehicles which has a tandem axle group or triaxle group at the rear, and where the front of the trailer is connected to the rear of the motor vehicle by a coupling. The overall length of the vehicle combination, including any load shall not exceed 25 m.
  - 3.1.2 'General Access Vehicle' means a vehicle included under vehicle configuration a or d (not longer than 12.5 m), or b or c (not longer than 19.0 m), as specified in Table 1. For General Access Vehicles, this Notice shall stand alone.
  - 3.1.3 'Mass Management Accreditation Scheme' means a scheme that is recognised by Transport SA as meeting the requirement of the mass management module (including audit requirements) of the National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme (NHVAS).
  - 3.1.4 'National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme' (NHVAS) means the comprehensive accreditation package developed by the National Road Transport Commission and approved by the Australian Transport Council on 14 November 1997.
  - 3.1.5 'Restricted Access Vehicle' means a vehicle included under vehicle configuration b (longer than 19 m) or e or f, as specified in Table 1. For these Restricted Access Vehicles, this Notice shall be read in conjunction with the relevant *South Australian Government Gazette* notice approval.
  - 3.1.6 'Road Friendly Suspension' means a suspension system certified as complying with the performance criteria detailed in the Federal Office of Road Safety Vehicle Standards Bulletin 11—Certification of Road Friendly Suspension Systems, April 1999.
  - 3.1.7 'valid National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Mass Module label' or a 'valid Mass Management Accreditation (Pilot) Program (Victorian) label' means a label:
    - (a) issued to a scheme member (whose accreditation status has not been suspended or cancelled); and
    - (b) displayed on the nominated vehicle (owned or captured by the operator),

for which the label was originally issued by the accrediting authority.

#### 4. Axle Mass Limits and Axle Spacing

- 4.1 The total mass on the axle or axle group shall not exceed the limits listed in Table 2 for the specified axle or axle group.
- 4.2 The mass limits specified in Table 2 shall only apply to axles or axle groups fitted with a road friendly suspension (except for the steer axle on the Road Train prime mover).

- 4.3 The total mass of a vehicle or combination, as determined by Schedule 1, Part 1, clause 3 of the Road Traffic (Mass and Loading Requirements) Regulations 1999, relating to axle spacing, can only be exceeded by the amount that the sum of the masses of the axle or axle groups, operating under higher mass limits, exceed the mass limits specified in the column titled Mass Limit (tonnes) in Table 2 above.
- 4.4 The total mass of a vehicle combination, other than a road train or B-double, can only exceed 42.5 tonnes by the amount that the sum of the masses of the axle or axle groups, operating at higher mass limits, exceed the mass limits specified in the column titled Mass Limit (tonnes) in Table 2 above.

#### 5. Mass Management Accreditation

- 5.1 Vehicles or vehicle configurations fitted with triaxle groups must be accredited under one of the following Mass Management Accreditation Schemes where any axle or axle group is specified and loaded in accordance with Table 2 above:
  - 5.1.1 Mass Management Module of the National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme.
  - 5.1.2 National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme for Mass Management, known as the Mass Management Accreditation (Pilot) Program (Victorian).
- 5.2 The Prime Mover must display a valid National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Mass Module label or a valid Mass Management Accreditation (Pilot) Program (Victorian) label.
- 5.3 All tri-axle trailers in the vehicle combination must display a valid National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Mass Module label or a valid Mass Management Accreditation (Pilot) Program (Victorian) label, where displaying labels on trailers is a requirement of the accrediting agency.
- Drivers of vehicles accredited in South Australia must carry documented evidence (which may be the Route Compliance Certificate) of route planning, confirming that a higher mass limit route is available by reference to the maps contained in this Notice, in accordance with Standard 4 of the Mass Management Module of the National Heavy Vehicle Accreditation Scheme.
- 5.5 Vehicles accredited in states and territories other than South Australia under the schemes specified in 5.1 may operate in South Australia under the terms and conditions and on the routes detailed in this Notice provided the driver:
  - 5.5.1 has determined that a higher mass limit route is available by reference to the maps contained in this Notice;
  - 5.5.2 records the route details on a Route Compliance Certificate and has signed the Certificate;
  - 5.5.3 carries the Route Compliance Certificate in the vehicle when operating at higher mass limits;
  - 5.5.4 produces the Certificate if requested by an Inspector appointed under the Road Traffic Act 1961 and/or Motor Vehicles Act 1959, or a Police Officer; and
  - 5.5.5 the scheme member retains the original copy of the Certificate for a period of not less than 12 months from the date it is signed for auditing purposes.

#### 6. Routes

- Vehicle configurations included under a or d (not longer than 12.5 m) or b or c (not longer than 19.0 m), as specified in Table 1 shall operate only on the approved routes specified in the maps titled 'Route Network for General Access Vehicles fitted with Road Friendly Suspension' as included in this Notice.
- B-Doubles operating in accordance with the South Australian Government Gazette notice titled 'Operation of B-Double Vehicles up to 25 m in Length', may operate at higher mass limits only where routes specified in the South Australian Government Gazette Notice 'Operation of B-Double Vehicles up to 25 m in Length', are also routes specified in the maps 'Route Network for General Access Vehicles fitted with Road Friendly Suspension', as included in this Notice.
- 6.3 Car Carrier Combinations operating in accordance with *South Australian Government Gazette* notice titled 'Operation of Car Carrier Combinations up to 25 m in Length', may operate at higher mass limits only where routes specified in the *South Australian Government Gazette* Notice 'Operation of Car Carrier Combinations up to 25 m in Length', are also routes specified in the maps 'Route Network for General Access Vehicles fitted with Road Friendly Suspension', as included in this Notice.
- 6.4 Double and Triple Road Trains operating in accordance with the *South Australian Government Gazette* Notice titled 'Operation of Road Train Vehicles in South Australia', may operate at higher mass limits only where routes specified in the *South Australian Government Gazette* Notice titled 'Operation of Road Train Vehicles in South Australia', are also routes specified in the maps 'Route Network for General Access Vehicles fitted with Road Friendly Suspension', as included in this Notice.
- 6.5 B-Double vehicles registered under the Commonwealth of Australia *Interstate Road Transport Act 1985*, operating at higher mass may operate on the routes specified in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* notice titled 'Determination of Routes for B-Double Vehicles Carrying Higher Mass Limits Under the Federal Interstate Registration Scheme (FIRS)'.
- 6.6 Vehicle combinations other than B-Doubles and Rigid Truck and Trailers registered under the Commonwealth of Australia Interstate Road Transport Act 1985, operating at higher mass may operate on the routes specified in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette notice titled 'Determination of Routes for Vehicles, Other than B-Doubles and Rigid Truck and Trailer Combinations, Carrying Higher Mass Limits Under the Federal Interstate Registration Scheme (FIRS)'.

## 7. Vehicle Specifications

- 7.1 General requirements:
  - 7.1.1 The vehicle and/or combination shall not be driven or loaded in excess of the manufacturers rating for axle, suspension, tyre and coupling capacities or in excess of the manufacturers gross vehicle mass and gross combination mass ratings.

- 7.1.2 South Australian registered vehicles shall not exceed the Gross Vehicle Mass and/or Gross Combination Mass as shown on the certificate of registration for that vehicle.
- 7.1.3 Vehicles registered in other States and Territories shall comply with the requirements of Clause 7.1.1 or the Gross Vehicle Mass and/or Gross Combination Mass as shown on the certificate of registration for that vehicle.
- 7.1.4 Vehicles manufactured on or after 1 July 2000 must be fitted with certified Road Friendly Suspension systems.
- 7.1.5 Vehicles manufactured prior to 1 July 2000, must at least be fitted with suspensions that use air bags in conjunction with effective dampers with the air bag being the principal suspension medium. The air bag suspension systems fitted to these vehicles are deemed to be Road Friendly until 1 July 2002.
- 7.1.6 Vehicles manufactured prior to 1 July 2000 may be fitted with certified Road Friendly Suspension systems, but must be fitted with certified Road Friendly Suspensions by 1 July 2002 to be eligible for Higher Mass Limits under this Notice.
- 7.2 B-Double Coupling Requirements:
  - 7.2.1 The 'D' rating for fifth wheel couplings and king pins shall be equal to or greater than 112 kN.
- 7.3 Road Train Coupling Requirements:
  - 7.3.1 For Double Road Train vehicle units manufactured prior to 1 July 1991, the minimum 'D' rating for the fifth wheel couplings and king pins shall be equal to or greater than 135 kN and the minimum 'D' rating for tow couplings and drawbar eyes shall be equal to or greater than 15 tonnes.
  - 7.3.2 For Double Road Train vehicle units manufactured on or after 1 July 1991 and Triple Road Trains, the minimum 'D' rating for the fifth wheel couplings and king pins shall be equal to or greater than 173 kN and the minimum 'D' rating for tow couplings and drawbar eyes shall be equal to or greater than 19 tonnes.

This Notice is valid from 12 o'clock midnight on 8 May 2002 and the Notice titled 'Higher Mass Limits for Vehicles Fitted with Road Friendly Suspensions' that appeared in the *South Australian Government Gazette*, dated 21 February 2002, is revoked at midnight on 8 May 2002.




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




































# Township Maps Route Network for General Access Vehicles fitted with Road Friendly Suspension





# PART 1 PRELIMINARY

# Citation

**1.** These regulations may be cited as the *Offshore Minerals Regulations 2002*.

# Commencement

**2.** These regulations will come into operation on 4 May 2002.

# **Interpretation**

- **3.** In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
- "Act" means the Offshore Minerals Act 2000;

"Department" means the department of the Minister involved in the administration of the Act and these regulations.

# PART 2 LICENCES

# Application for licence

- **4.** For the purposes of sections 54(1)(e), 138(1)(e) and 199(1)(e) of the Act, each map that accompanies an application for an exploration licence, retention licence or mining licence must—
  - (a) be in a form and scale approved by the Minister; and
  - (b) show the relevant blocks by distinctive colour tinting or edging.

# **Special conditions**

- **5.** (1) A person who obtains a licence is liable for, and will indemnify and keep indemnified the South Australian Government against, all actions, suits, claims and demands resulting from the erection or placing by the person of a structure or object on or over a part of the seabed, or the escape of a deleterious substance into the sea, while conducting offshore exploration or mining activities associated with the licence and, for this purpose, a licence must not be registered or granted unless and until the relevant person has entered into an agreement with the Minister (to the Minister's satisfaction) that complies with the requirements of subregulation (2).
- (2) An agreement complies with the requirements of this subregulation if the relevant person agrees to indemnify and to keep indemnified the South Australian Government against all actions, suits, claims and demands resulting from the erection or placing by the person of a structure or object on or over a part of the seabed, or the escape of a deleterious substance into the sea, while conducting offshore exploration or mining activities associated with the licence.
- (3) A person holding a licence must not permit the escape of a deleterious substance into the sea other than in accordance with a program approved by the Minister.
- (4) A person who obtains a licence must not commence offshore exploration or mining activities associated with the licence unless or until the Minister for the time being administering the *Fisheries Act* 1982 certifies that the Minister is satisfied that the operations will not contravene the *Fisheries Act* 1982.
- (5) A reference in this regulation to offshore exploration or mining activities associated with a licence includes any activity undertaken for the purposes of, or incidental to, the conduct of offshore exploration or mining activities.
  - (6) In this regulation—
  - "South Australian Government" means the Crown in right of the State and includes all Ministers of the Crown.

# Obligations associated with exploration licence (s. 117(1)(c))

- **6.** The following obligations are associated with an exploration licence:
- (a) the licence holder must, as soon as reasonably practicable, report to the Minister the discovery in the licence area of minerals potentially capable of economic production;

- (b) the licence holder must conduct operations under the licence (including managing waste resulting from offshore exploration or mining activities) in accordance with a program approved, from time to time, by the Minister designed to—
  - (i) minimise damage to the seabed or subsoil in coastal water or resulting from the escape of deleterious substances; and
  - (ii) ensure that, in drilling or other underground investigations, no interconnection between groundwater aquifers occurs;
- (c) the licence holder must allow an inspector, at any reasonable time, to enter and remain in the licence area for the purpose of surveying the area, examining the condition of the licence area and undertaking any other activity associated with the administration of the Act or these regulations;
- (d) exploration or other reports, and geological data and samples, required to be submitted under the Act or these regulations to the Minister must be submitted by times, and in a manner and form, determined by the Minister.

## Obligations associated with retention licence or mining licence (ss. 176(1)(c) and 253(1)(c))

- 7. The following obligations are associated with a retention licence or mining licence:
- (a) the licence holder must conduct operations under the licence in an orderly and skilful manner in accordance with a program for mining and rehabilitation of the environment approved, from time to time, by the Minister;
- (b) the licence holder must submit to the Minister, from time to time at the Minister's request, a current plan of survey of the licence area in the form required by the Minister;
- (c) the licence holder must allow an inspector, at any reasonable time, to enter and remain in the licence area for the purpose of surveying the area, examining the condition of the licence area and undertaking any other activity associated with the administration of the Act or these regulations;
- (d) exploration or other reports, and geological data and samples, required to be submitted under the Act or these regulations to the Minister must be submitted by times, and in a manner and form, determined by the Minister.

# Registration of transfer of licence (s. 338)

- **8.** (1) For the purposes of section 338 of the Act, an instrument of transfer, after endorsement by the Minister under section 365 of the Act and payment of stamp duty, must be lodged, together with a copy of the instrument of transfer, the licence, and the fee prescribed by the Schedule, within 30 days after the Minister gives his or her consent to the transfer, or such later time as the Minister may allow.
- (2) The late lodgment fee prescribed by the Schedule is payable if an instrument of transfer is lodged later than 30 days after the Minister gives his or her consent to the transfer.

# Surrender of part of exploration licence (s. 100)

**9.** (1) The holder of an exploration licence seeking to surrender some of the blocks covered by the licence on application under section 100 of the Act must, within 60 days after making the application, submit to the Minister a technical report of the exploratory operations carried out in the area sought to be excluded from the licence.

- (2) The Minister may, after being satisfied that no fees are outstanding, approve an application to surrender some of the blocks covered by an exploration licence.
- (3) The Minister may, if the Minister thinks fit, waive compliance with a requirement under subregulation (1) or (2).

# PART 3 BALLOT PROCEDURES

# **Definitions for this Part**

10. In this Part—

"applicant" includes a person authorised in writing by an applicant to represent the applicant at a drawing of lots under this Part;

"delegate" means an officer, employee or agent of the Department who is authorised by the Minister to conduct a drawing of lots under this Part;

"working day" means any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday.

# Multiple applications—exploration and mining licences: time of lodgement (ss. 58(2)(b) and 203(2)(b))

11. For the purposes of sections 58(2)(b) and 203(2)(b) of the Act, the prescribed time is the period between 9 am and 5 pm on each working day on which applications may be lodged.

# Multiple applications—drawing of lots (ss. 58(2) and 203(2))

- 12. For the purposes of sections 58(2) and 203(2) of the Act, the prescribed way of drawing lots is as follows:
  - (a) not less than 7 days before the drawing of lots, the delegate must give notice in writing of the time and place of the draw to each applicant at the principal office of the applicant;
  - (b) subject to paragraph (c), the draw must be carried out in the presence of all applicants;
  - (c) the draw may be carried out in the absence of an applicant who has been notified of the time and place of the draw in accordance with paragraph (a) and who does not attend the draw at the notified time and place;
  - (d) the delegate must write the name of each applicant on a separate paper of the same kind as the paper on which the name of each other applicant is written;
  - (e) the papers and writing may be examined by each person present at the draw;
  - (f) the papers must be folded in the same manner by the delegate and placed by him or her in an otherwise empty receptacle, the interior surface of which will not snag the papers;
  - (g) an officer, employee or agent of the Department other than the delegate must draw the papers individually from the receptacle without looking into the receptacle;
  - (h) the delegate must record—
    - (i) on each paper, the place of the paper in the order of drawing papers from the receptacle; and
    - (ii) on each application, the number that corresponds to the place in the draw of the paper relating to the application.

# PART 4 RECORDS

# **Records and samples**

- 13. A licence holder must—
- (a) maintain complete and detailed records of—
  - (i) geological mapping;
  - (ii) surveys of workings;
  - (iii) logs of drill holes;
  - (iv) location and type of samples taken;
  - (v) results of analyses and testing of samples;
  - (vi) results of geophysical surveys; and
- (b) at the request of the Minister or an inspector, produce the records for examination by the Minister or an inspector; and
- (c) furnish the Minister with such information relating to the surveys and other operations conducted under the licence, and such geological samples obtained in the course of those operations, as the Minister may require.

#### Records and samples—additional requirements for mining licence (s. 261)

- **14.** The holder of a mining licence must, in addition to the requirements of regulation 13, maintain complete and detailed records of all minerals recovered under the licence, including the following:
  - (a) records of the quantity of minerals recovered during each royalty period;
  - (b) records of the quantity and value of minerals disposed of, whether by sale or otherwise, during each royalty period;
  - (c) records of the quantity and value of minerals held (in the form in which they are disposed of) by the holder of the licence at the beginning and the end of each royalty period;
  - (d) records of all royalty that became payable during each royalty period in connection with the disposal of minerals.

# Mining licence—returns to be made (s. 261)

- **15.** (1) The holder of a mining licence must furnish a return to the Minister within one month of the last day of each royalty period.
  - (2) A return must be in a form that shows—
  - (a) the quantity of each mineral recovered by the holder of the mining licence during the royalty period to which the return relates; and

- (b) the quantity and value of each mineral disposed of, whether by sale or otherwise, during that period; and
- (c) the quantity and value of each mineral held (in the form in which it is disposed of) by the holder of the mining licence at the beginning and end of that period; and
- (d) the location in which each mineral was recovered with respect to the boundary of the area over which the mining licence was granted.

# PART 5 RESTORATION OF ENVIRONMENT

# **Definition for Part 5**

16. In this Part—

"unused mining property" means property (including a structure or equipment) that—

- (a) has been brought into coastal waters for use in offshore exploration or mining activities; and
- (b) is not being used and is not intended to be used in exploration or mining activities in accordance with a licence.

# Removal of unused mining property (s. 401)

- **17.** (1) The holder or former holder of a licence must remove all unused mining property from coastal waters—
  - (a) unless paragraph (b) applies—within 3 months of the expiry, cancellation, transfer or surrender of the licence; or
  - (b) within a period determined by the Minister by notice in writing to the holder or former holder of the licence.
- (2) If the Minister gives a notice under subregulation (1)(b), the Minister may, by a further notice in writing, extend a period previously determined by the Minister.

# Disposal of unused mining property (s. 401)

- **18.** (1) If unused mining property is not removed in accordance with regulation 17, the Minister may cause the property to be removed and may direct that the property be sold by public auction.
  - (2) Any unused mining property unsold after the public auction may be sold by private treaty.
- (3) The costs incurred by the Minister or a person acting under the direction of the Minister in removing or disposing of unused mining property under this regulation—
  - (a) are recoverable as a debt from the holder or former holder of the relevant licence; and
  - (b) may be deducted from the proceeds of any sale referred to in subregulations (1) and (2).
- (4) Any balance remaining following the sale of unused mining property is to be paid to the Treasurer who must, on receipt of an application by the holder or former holder of the relevant licence, pay the proceeds to the applicant.
- (5) If application under subregulation (4) is not made within 2 years of the date of the sale, the proceeds of sale must be paid into the Consolidated Account.

# Direction to rehabilitate mining area (s. 402)

19. (1) The Minister may, by notice in writing, direct a person who is the holder or former holder of a licence to take specified steps, within the period specified in the notice, to rehabilitate an area in coastal waters that has been damaged or affected by offshore exploration or mining activities carried on by the person.

- (2) The Minister may, by a further notice in writing, extend the period referred to in subregulation (1).
- (3) If a person fails to comply with a direction given to the person under this regulation, the Minister may cause to be taken any of the steps specified in the notice in which the direction was given.
- (4) Any costs and expenses incurred by the Minister or a person acting under the authorisation of the Minister under subregulation (3) are to be deducted from any amount of security held by the Minister under the Act in relation to the relevant licence or former licence.

# PART 6 MISCELLANEOUS

#### **Fees**

**20.** The fees set out in the Schedule are prescribed for the purposes of the Act.

# Copies of documents (s. 370)

**21.** The Minister or an inspector may take a copy of any document produced to the Minister or inspector in accordance with section 370 of the Act.

### Testing and analysis of samples (s. 371)

**22.** The Minister or an inspector may test or analyse any sample given to the Minister or the inspector in accordance with section 371 of the Act.

# Change of name and address

**23.** The holder of a licence must notify the Minister in writing of a change in name or address within 30 days of the change.

#### Service of documents

- **24.** A notice or document required or authorised by or under the Act or these regulations to be given to or served on a person (other than a person who holds or may hold native title in a licence area<sup>1</sup>) may—
  - (a) be served on the person personally; or
  - (b) be posted in an envelope addressed to the person—
    - (i) at the person's last known address; or
    - (ii) if the person has an address for correspondence or service—at that address; or
  - (c) transmitted by facsimile transmission to a facsimile number provided by the person (in which case the notice or document will be taken to have been given or served at the time of transmission).

# **Offences**

- **25.** (1) A person who contravenes or fails to comply with a provision of these regulations is guilty of an offence.
- (2) A person who is guilty of an offence against these regulations is liable to a fine not exceeding \$1 000.
