FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Kenneth J. Sincock (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), 63 Wells Street, Streaky Bay, S.A. 5680, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M499, is exempt from the provision of Clause 61, Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking up to 150 razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) in any one day, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from South Australian coastal marine waters from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- 1. All razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken pursuant to this notice shall be used for bait only.
- 2. The total number of razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken in any one day, shall be no greater than 150.
- 3. The exemption holder must include all razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken under this exemption on his monthly catch and effort summary provided to the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI).
- 4. Whilst engaged in the collection activity the exemption holder must have in or about his possession the copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer forthwith, if and when an officer requests the exemption holder to produce it.
- 5. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Peter Bell (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 298, Kingscote, S.A. 5223, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M040, is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking undersized fish of the species cockles (*Katelysia spp.*) (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), within those waters specified in Schedule 1, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

The waters in the vicinity of Kingscote bounded as follows: Commencing at a point at high water mark at Cape Rouge, latitude 35°35′52″S, and longitude 137°37′32″E, then along the geodesic (190°T), to a point at high water mark on the south coast on the Bay of Shoals, latitude 35°38′18″S, and longitude 137°37′05″E, then following the line of high water mark in a generally easterly and southerly direction to a point at high water mark at the landward end of the Kingscote jetty, latitude 35°39′15″S and longitude 137°38′32″E, then along the geodesic (133°T) for a distance of 2.3 nautical miles to position latitude 35°40′32″S longitude 137°41′00″E, then along the geodesic (033°T) for a distance of 2.1 nautical miles to a position latitude 35°38′50″S longitude 137°42′15″E, then along the geodesic (325°T) to a point at high water mark on Marsden Point, latitude 35°33′55″S and longitude 137°38′07″E, then following the line of high water mark in a generally southerly direction back to the point of commencement.

SCHEDULE 2

1. Any fish taken by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must be not less than 27 mm in length measured at the greatest dimension.

- 2. Any fish taken by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must be used for bait only and must not be sold.
- 3. While engaged in the exempted activity, the exemption holder shall carry or have about or near his person, a copy of this notice and must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.
- 4. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulation made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Raymond Woolford, c/o Fishing Charters Tumby Bay, 7 Gardner Avenue, Tumby Bay, S.A. 5605 (hereinafter referred to as the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from the provisions of Clauses 66, 70, 73, 77A, 77B and 77C of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, insofar as the exemption holders may exceed the bag or boat limits as specified in Schedule 2 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Investigator* (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted boat') from the principal exemption holder in South Australia, for the purpose of recreational fishing for scalefish, abalone, blue crab or sand crab, and rock lobster.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than one rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) per other exemption holder in any one day where the number of other exemption holders exceeds eight, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants.
- 2. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than one abalone (*Haliotis spp.*) per other exemption holder in any one day where the number of other exemption holders exceeds ten, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants.
- 3. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than 20 blue crab or sand crab or a combination thereof per other exemption holder in any one day, where the number of other exemption holders exceeds six, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants.
- 4. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to nearest whole number if necessary) (for those species of scalefish subject to such a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000) per other exemption holder in any one day, where the number of other exemption holders exceeds six, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants.

SCHEDULE 3

- 1. This exemption is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.
- 2. The principal exemption holder shall not use any other boat other than the permitted boat for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.

- 3. The principal exemption holder shall not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.
- 4. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder shall have in his possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.
- 5. The principal exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.
- 6. The principal exemption holder shall not cause, suffer or permit any other exemption holder to contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, James Brook (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 111, Normanville, S.A. 5204 is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982 but only insofar as the exemption holder may engage in the collection of pipefish (Family Syngnathidae) from the waters of Gulf St Vincent adjacent to the District Council of Mallala using a seine net (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 August 2002, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- 1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and may not be sold. All specimens retained must be delivered to the University of Adelaide or to the South Australian Museum.
- 2. All fish not retained for scientific or research purposes must be returned to the water immediately.
- 3. The seine net must have a maximum length of 6 m, maximum drop of 2 m and a minimum mesh size of 2 mm.
- 4. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity, details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.
- 5. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the outcomes of the collection of fish pursuant to this notice to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Roger Hill, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within 14 days of the expiry of this notice, giving details of the date and time of collection, a description of all species collected and the number of each species collected.
- 6. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.
- 7. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
