FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Ben Roennfeldt (the 'exemption holder'), or a person acting as his agent, is exempt from the provision of the Fisheries Act 1982 and the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 but only insofar as he may engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2 from 7 October 2003 to 31 December 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of fish from the Glenelg River in accordance with the experimental procedures provided to PIRSA Fisheries in relation to the investigation entitled 'Hook retention by black bream (*Acanthopagrus butcheri*) in the Glenelg River'.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are to be collected for scientific and research purposes only and must not be sold.

2. All fish not required for scientific or research purposes must be immediately returned to the water.

3. At least 24 hours before undertaking the exempted activity, the exemption holder must contact the PIRSA Fisheries Office at Kingston on (08) 8767 2358 and advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit of the proposed time and place that the exempted activity will commence.

4. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if requested.

5. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Antony Smith, P.O. Box 1375, Berri, S.A. 5343 (the 'exemption holder') is exempt from paragraph 34(1)(a) of the Fisheries Act 1982 but only insofar as he may use the device described in Schedule 1 to take carp in the area specified in Schedule 2 for the purpose of trade or business (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 October 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

A mesh net having a maximum length of 50 m and a minimum mesh size of 18 cm and a maximum mesh size not exceeding 30 cm.

SCHEDULE 2

The waters of Gurra Gurra Lagoon, upstream of the Bookpurnong Road causeway bridge.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holder must not use more than two nets at any one time in the permitted area.

2. The exemption holder must not undertake any other fishing activity whilst undertaking the exempted activity.

3. The exemption holder may only use a boat to engage in the exempted activity if that boat is registered by endorsement on River Fishery Licence No. R54.

4. All fish other than carp taken in the course of the exempted activity must be immediately returned to the water.

5. Immediately prior to commencing the exempted activity, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the following details:

- the licence number and person(s) conducting the activity;
- the exact location of the fishing activities; and
- the number of nets being used.

6. The exemption holder must ensure that the nets are checked and all fish removed at least once during each 24 hour period.

7. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holders must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer as requested.

8. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
