FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Darren Hicks of Australian Water Quality Centre, PMB 3, Salisbury, S.A. 5108 (the 'exemption holder'), or his agents, is exempt from section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982 and the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder may engage in the collection of aquatic organisms in the waters specified in Schedule 1, using the gear specified in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 November 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

The waters below the following reservoirs:

Myponga Reservoir, Little Para Reservoir, Mount Bold Reservoir, South Para Reservoir, Kangaroo Creek Reservoir.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1 dab net per person.
- 1 seine net with a maximum length of 25 m and minimum mesh size of 15 mm.
- 1 seine net with a maximum length of 3.5 m and a minimum mesh size of 8 mm.
- 1 seine net with a maximum length of 6 m and a minimum mesh size of 12 mm.
- 40 fish traps with a maximum size of 40 cm x 25 cm, minimum opening of 5 cm.

SCHEDULE 3

- 1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and must not be sold.
- 2. On completion of scientific assessment, all native fish captured must be released into the area of capture and non-native fish must be disposed of appropriately.

- 3. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the names of the people undertaking the exempted activity, the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.
- 4. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.
- 5. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Vitomir Pantelic, 67 Wilpena Terrace, Kilkenny, S.A. 5009 (the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from the bag and boat limit provisions of clauses 66, 77A and 77C of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, if the number of other exemption holders on the permitted boat exceeds six, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Sea Ranger* (the 'permitted boat') from the principal exemption holder in South Australia, for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. The exemption holders may take no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to nearest whole number if necessary) for each species of fish referred to in Clauses 66, 77A and 77C of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, for each exemption holder on board the permitted boat, excluding the principal exemption holder and his employees or assistants.
- 2. The principal exemption holder must not use any other boat other than the permitted boat for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.
- 3. The principal exemption holder must not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.
- 4. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.
- 5. The principal exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.
- 6. The principal exemption holder must not cause, suffer or permit any other exemption holder to contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.
