FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, the holder of a licence issued pursuant to the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991 (the 'exemption holder'), is exempted from Regulations 13C (2) (b) and 13C (2) (c) of the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 December 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- 1. The exemption holder is exempted from Regulation 13C (2) (b) of the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991, insofar as they must cause two copies only of the completed form CDR1 to be transported with the abalone.

- 3. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any other regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

The waters south of a line drawn from Cape Donnington to Corny Point and west of a line drawn from Troubridge Point to Marsden Point, at least 3 nautical miles from the shore and at least 1 nautical mile from any isles.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Antony Smith, P.O. Box 1375, Berri, S.A. 5343, is exempt from section 34 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as he may take freshwater mussels (*velesunio ambiguus*) from the River Murray in South Australia (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions in Schedule 1 for the purposes of trade or business, from the date of this notice until 16 January 2004, unless revoked or varied earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- 1. The exemption holder may take mussels by diving and collection by hand.
- 2. The exemption holder may take no more than 60 kg of mussels during the exempted period.
- 3. The exemption holder may only engage in the exempted activity when also fishing pursuant to River Fishery Licence No. R54, and may only use a boat to engage in the exempted activity if that boat is registered by endorsement on River Fishery Licence No. R54.
- 4. The exemption holder must not cause or permit a person to act as his agent when engaging in the exempted activity unless that person may lawfully act as an agent for the exemption holder in relation to River Fishery Licence No. R54.
- 5. Immediately prior to commencing the exempted activity, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the following details:
 - The licence number and person(s) conducting the activity.
 - The exact location(s) of the fishing activities.
 - The quantity of mussels to be collected during that fishing activity.
- 6. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holders must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer as requested.
- 7. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
