FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Tracy Warland or her agent (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 2236, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5607 is exempt from the Fisheries Act 1982 but only insofar as she shall not be guilty of an offence when engaging in the collection of marine amphipods from beach-cast seagrass wrack (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), from the waters described in Schedule 1, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 December 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

South Australian coastal waters adjacent to Port Lincoln.

SCHEDULE 2

1. All specimens taken shall be for the supplementing of the diet for the seahorse captive breeding program and may not be sold.

2. No more than 20 collections of beach-cast seagrass are to be collected during the term of this permit.

3. No more than one 60 L bin of seagrass castings is to be taken per calendar month.

4. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with details of the person undertaking the exempted activity, the proposed location and dates on which collections are to be made.

5. The exemption holder shall only conduct the activity from beaches below the high water mark within the permitted area.

6. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

7. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically permitted by this notice. Dated 22 January 2004.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Tracy Warland, P.O. Box 2236, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5607, (the 'exemption holder), or a person acting as her agent, is exempt from the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when engaging in the collection of aquatic and benthic flora and fauna from marine coastal waters (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from 1 Febru-ary 2004 until 31 December 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The specimens collected pursuant to this notice may be used for display purposes only at South Australian Seahorse Marine Services, 5 Mallee Crescent, Port Lincoln and must not be sold, released or removed from the site without the written permission of the Director of Fisheries.

2. One undersize rock lobster may be collected pursuant to this notice. All other size limits must be adhered to.

3. The exemption holder may not take more than 10 of any species pursuant to this notice, except those species that have a daily bag limit prescribed in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000. Any species that has a prescribed bag limit is limited to that bag limit, or 10 fish, whichever is the lesser.

4. The exemption holder must not take any species that are protected in accordance with section 42 of the Fisheries Act 1982 or of the family Syngnathidae.

5. The exemption holder must not collect any marine organisms from within:

- an aquatic reserve declared under section 47 of the Fisheries Act 1982;
- a rock lobster sanctuary described in clause 85 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000; or
- the Whyalla cuttlefish closure.

6. At least 24 hours prior to engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must contact PIRSA Fisheries Compliance on 1800 065 522 with the following information:

- the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity;
- the intended location for conducting the exempted activity;
- the method of conducting the exempted activity; and
- if using a boat to conduct the exempted activity, the description of the boat and the intended area of launching and retrieval.

7. The exemption holder must provide a written report on the number of animals taken, specific location and their condition to the Director of Fisheries (Attention: Kristy Power, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within 7 days of the completion of each collection.

8. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if requested.

9. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically permitted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Tracy Warland, P.O. Box 2236, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5607, (the 'exemption holder'), or a person acting as her agent, is exempt from the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when engaging in the collection of the organisms listed in Schedule 1 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from 1 February 2004 until 31 December 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- Up to 2 egg-bearing male and 2 female weedy seadragons (*Phyllopteryx taeniolatus*);
- Up to 10 spotted pipefish (Stigmatopora argus);
- Up to 10 wide-bodied pipefish (Stigmatopora nigra);
- Up to 10 short-snouted seahorses (*Hippocampus breviceps*); and
- Up to 10 pot bellied seahorses (*Hippocampus abdominalis*) or (*Hippocampus bleekeri*).

SCHEDULE 1

1. All specimens taken pursuant to this notice are for broodstock only and may not be sold or traded without written consent from the Director of Fisheries.

2. Seadragons of the same sex must not be collected within 5 km of each other.

3. No more than 5 short-snouted seahorses (*Hippocampus breviceps*) shall be collected within 5 km of any one collection site.

4. No more than 5 pot bellied seahorses (*Hippocampus abdominalis*) or (*Hippocampus bleekeri*) shall be collected within 5 km of any one collection site.

5. No more than 5 spotted pipefish (*Stigmatopora argus*) of the same sex shall be collected within 5 km of any one collection site.

6. No more than 5 wide-bodied pipefish (*Stigmatopora nigra*) of the same sex shall be collected within 5 km of any one collection site.

7. All specimens taken pursuant to this notice must be retained at the site endorsed on land based Aquaculture Licence No. FT00550.

8. The exemption holder must provide a written report on the number of animals taken, specific location and their condition to the Director of Fisheries (Attention: Kristy Power, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within 7 days of the completion of each collection.

9. At least 24 hours prior to engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must contact the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the following information:

- the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity;
- · the intended location for conducting the exempted activity;
- · the method of conducting the exempted activity; and
- if using a boat to conduct the exempted activity, the description of the boat and the intended area of launching and retrieval.

10. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if requested.

11. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Kate Hutson (the 'exemption holder') or her agents of Department of Environmental Biology, University of Adelaide, Adelaide, S.A. 5005 is exempt from sections 41 and 44 (2) (*b*) of the Fisheries Act 1982 and Regulation 7 and Clauses 1, 60 and 66 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 but only insofar as the exemption holder may engage in the collection of up to 100 fish of each species listed in Schedule 1, either above or below the minimum legal length, in the waters of Spencer Gulf, Coffin Bay and Gulf St Vincent, using the gear described in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

Bream (Acanthopagrus butcheri) Mullet (Family Mugilidae) Mulloway (Argyrosomus hololepidotus) Salmon (Arripis truttaceus) Snapper (Chrysophrys auratus) Sweep (Scorpis spp.) Tailor (Pomatomus saltatrix) Tommy ruff (Arripis georgianus) Silver Trevally (Pseudocaranx dentex) Whiting (Family Sillaginidae) Yellowtail kingfish (Seriola grandis)

SCHEDULE 2

- 2 hand lines or rod and lines per person;
- 2 fish traps with maximum size of 3 m long, 2 m wide and 2 m high, mesh size not less than 4 mm.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and must not be sold.

2. The specimens collected may be taken from or near any aquaculture site, excluding from within any cage within a site.

3. The exemption holder must have written consent from the aquaculture licence holder prior to entering a site to undertake the exempted activity.

4. The exemption holder may take a maximum of 10 fish of any one species from a location on any one collection day, with a maximum of 2 collections per site during the term of this exemption.

5. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the names of the people undertaking the exempted activity, the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

6. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the collection of fish pursuant to this notice to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Roger Hill, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within 14 days of any collection, giving the following details:

- the date, time and location of collection;
- the description of all species collected; and
- the number of each species collected.

7. While engaged in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

8. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
