FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Philip Connell, of Tory M Fishing Charters, P.O. Box 88, American River, Kangaroo Island, S.A. 5221 (the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from clause 66 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holders may exceed the prescribed boat limits during a chartered fishing trip on the *Tory M* in accordance with the allowable limits specified in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3, from the date of gazettal until 30 June 2005, unless varied or revoked earlier

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Tory M* from Philip Connell for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to the nearest whole number if necessary) for those species of scalefish (except King George whiting) subject to a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, in any one day.
- 2. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds three, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than 10 King George whiting in any one day.

SCHEDULE 3

- 1. The principal exemption holder, its employees or agents must not take any fish during the chartered fishing trip.
- 2. The principal exemption holder must not use any boat other than the $Tory\ M$ for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.
- 3. Neither the principal exemption holder nor the other exemption holders may sell any fish taken pursuant to this notice.
- 4. The principal exemption holder must not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.
- 5. The principal exemption holder must contact PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to commencing the exempted activity and advise of the time and date of departure of the *Tory M* and the estimated time of return to port.
- 6. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.
- 7. The exemption holders must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Scotte Wedderburn (the 'exemption holder'), from the School of Earth and Environmental Sciences, The University of Adelaide, S.A. 5005, is exempt from Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as he may engage in the collection of Murray Hardy Head from the waters listed in Schedule 1 using the gear specified in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 November 2005, unless varied or revoked earlier.

The waters of the River Murray in South Australia.

SCHEDULE 2

- One 10 m by 1 m seine net.
- · Eight fyke nets.
- 10 box traps.

SCHEDULE 3

- 1. The specimens collected pursuant to this notice may be used for scientific research purposes only and must not be sold. Any native fish other than those specified in this notice that are captured must be immediately returned to the water.
- 2. No more than one tissue sample is to be taken from each animal, and no more than 10 animals are to be sampled from each site, with no more than 350 samples to be collected in total from South Australian waters.
- 3. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522, at least 24 hours prior to undertaking the exempted activity, and answer a series of questions about the exempted activity. The exemption holder will need to have a copy of the exemption with them at the time of making the call and be able to provide information about the area and time of the exempted activity, the vehicles and boats involved, the number of agents undertaking the exempted activity and other related questions. Failure to do so, will result in a breach of permit conditions.
- 4. The exemption holder must advise the relevant Department of Environment and Heritage Officer (National Parks and Wildlife District Ranger) at least 24 hours prior to undertaking the exempted activity within a national park.
- 5. The exemption holder must not conduct any other fishing activity including recreational fishing whilst undertaking the exempted activity.
- 6. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing to the Director of Fisheries, (G.P.O. Box 1625, Adelaide, S.A. 5001) within 14 days of the expiry of this notice, giving the following details:
 - the date, soak time and location of collection;
 - the number of nets used;
 - the description of all species collected (fish, invertebrates, turtles);
 - the number of each species collected; and
 - any other information regarding size, breeding or anything deemed relevant or of interest that is able to be volunteered.
- 7. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, the holder of a prawn fishery licence issued pursuant to the Scheme of Management (Prawn Fisheries) Regulations 1991, or their agent listed in Schedule 1 (the 'exemption holders') are exempt from the notices made under section 43 of the Fisheries Act 1982, prohibiting the taking of western king prawns (Melicertus latisulcatus), in that the exemption holders shall not be guilty of an offence when using prawn trawl nets in accordance with the conditions of their fishery licence for the purpose of stock assessment survey (the 'exempted activity') subject to the conditions contained in Schedule 2.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. The exemption is valid from 2030 hours on 13 November 2004 until 0600 hours on 14 November 2004, unless varied or revoked.
- 2. The exemption holder must comply with the instructions from the Stock Assessment Coordinator and work in the allotted trawl station.
- 3. All fish, other than prawns taken during the exempted activity for stock assessment purposes, or fish retained for other research purposes, are to be returned to the water immediately after capture.
- 4. All prawns taken during the exempted activity are to be processed in accordance with the instructions of the Stock Assessment Coordinator.
- 5. All prawns taken during the exempted activity must be removed from the vessel in accordance with the instructions of the Stock Assessment Coordinator prior to that vessel undertaking normal fishing activity.
- 6. Prawns taken pursuant to the exempted activity are not permitted to be retained by the exemption holder, agent or crew.
- 7. The exemption holder must return to the designated port of landing by 0900 hours on the last day of the survey.
- 8. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with Fisheries Act 1982, or any other regulations made under that Act, except whereby specifically exempted by this notice.
