DEVELOPMENT ACT 1993, SECTION 48: DECISION BY THE DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT COMMISSION AS DELEGATE OF THE GOVERNOR

Preamble

- 1. The decision of the Governor under section 48 of the Development Act 1993, to approve the development of Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development located adjacent to Chappell Drive, Glenelg was published in the *Gazette* on 8 June 2000.
- 2. An amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Gazette* on 7 December 2000.
- 3. A further amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Gazette* on 1 March 2001.
- 4. Another further amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Gazette* on 17 May 2001.
- 5. Another further amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Gazette* on 28 February 2002.
- 6. Another further amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Gazette* on 3 October 2002.
- 7. Another further amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development was subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission and published in the *Gazette* on 20 March 2003.
- 8. A subsequent amended proposal to develop the Holdfast Shores Stage 2A development has now been under consideration under Division 2 of Part 4 of the Development Act 1993.
 - 9. The proposed amendments include:
 - Division of primary strata Lot 3 to create 8 secondary strata lots for community title with an associated scheme description.

- 10. The amendments to the development are contained in:
 - (a) Plan of division and associated scheme description of primary strata community Lot 3, Community Plan 21562, Hundred of Noarlunga for secondary strata community allotments by Alexander & Symonds Pty Ltd received by Planning SA on 26 November 2003 held in Development Assessment Commission docket number 110/C569/03.
- 11. The Development Assessment Commission has, in considering the application, had regard to all relevant matters under section 48 (5) of the Development Act 1993.
- 12. The Development Assessment Commission is satisfied that the amendments do not require the preparation of a further or amended Development Report.

Decision

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Development Act 1993, the Development Assessment Commission, as delegate of the Governor, grants development approval to the amended Holdfast Shores Stage 2A proposal located adjacent to Chappell Drive, Glenelg for a hotel, car parking, landscaping and associated works, subject to conditions.

 - (a) a private certifier or the City of Holdfast Bay has certified to the Development Assessment Commission that all work that constitutes building work under the Development Act 1993, complies with the Building Rules;
 - (b) an Environmental Management Plan (EMP) has been prepared in consultation with the Environment Protection Authority and the City of Holdfast Bay to address the management issues during construction. Matters to be addressed in the EMP must include:
 - traffic management during construction, including transport beyond the development site;
 - control and management of construction noise;
 - dust and mud control;
 - working hours;
 - stormwater management during construction;
 - site security and fencing;

- disposal of building waste and refuse;
- protection and cleaning of roads and pathways;
- · site clean up; and
- (c) adherence to all relevant Environment Protection Authority codes of practice for construction sites.
- 3. Subject to conditions 3A and 3B, the hotel must not be used or occupied for the purposes outlined in the application until:
 - (a) all car parks proposed for Stage 2A have been established in accordance with the plans listed in Condition 1 (e);
 - (b) plans for street furniture and directional signs for Stage 2A (including siting, elevations and materials) have been prepared by the proponent to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay;
 - (c) plans for public art for Stage 2A in accordance with plan 21 entitled 'Public Art Masterplan' and dated December 1999 (including siting, elevations and materials) have been prepared by the proponent to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay;
 - (d) lighting of all external areas has been provided to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission to ensure the safety of users of the pedestrian paths and plazas; and
 - (e) (i) plans for the drainage of stormwater from the Stage 2A site (including siting, elevations and materials) have been prepared by the proponent to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay;
 - (ii) stormwater infrastructure has been installed in accordance with the plans prepared pursuant to condition 3 (e) (i) to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay; and
 - (iii) stormwater infrastructure is operational.
 - 3A Notwithstanding condition 3 the hotel may be used and occupied for the purposes outlined in the application before the construction of the part of the basement car park marked out and indicated by the notation 'Defer Basement Construction' on the plan referred to in paragraph 8 (b) of the Preamble subject to:
 - (a) a temporary car park having first been established in accordance with the plan referred to in paragraph 8 (c) of the Preamble; and
 - (b) that temporary car park being available for use for the purposes of the approved development until that part of the basement car park has been constructed and is available for use.
 - 3B If the construction of Holdfast Shores Stage 2B shall not have been commenced by substantial works on the site on or before the 30 day of June 2006 [or such later date as the Development Assessment Commission may fix at any time] the construction of the part of the basement car park referred to in condition 3A must be undertaken forthwith and commenced by substantial works on the site within three calendar months of that date [or of any later date fixed by the Development Commission] [or within such extended period as the Development Assessment Commission may allow].
- 4. Street furniture and directional signs for the Stage 2A development must be established in accordance with the plans prepared pursuant to condition 3 (b) within six months of the first occupation of the hotel to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission.
- 5. Public art for the Stage 2A development must be established in accordance with the plans prepared pursuant to condition 3 (*c*) within six months of the first occupation of the hotel to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission.
- 6. The car parking areas must be designed in accordance with Australian Standards 2890.1-1993 and line markings must be maintained in good and substantial condition at all times.

- 7. The pedestrian paths and plazas proposed in the application, including the area situated between the existing Glenelg Surf Life Saving Club and the hotel building, must be open for pedestrian use from the commencement of use and occupation of the hotel and must then be kept open for pedestrian use at all times.
- 8. An iron-barred gate of at least 1.5 m in height must be constructed at the entrance to the stairwell on the south-eastern corner of the hotel building.
- 9. Access for service deliveries and waste disposal vehicles at the hotel plaza level must only be allowed between 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. daily.
- 10. The proposed toilets to replace the existing toilets adjoining the kiosk on the north-eastern side of the site must be established to the satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the City of Holdfast Bay prior to the demolition of these existing toilets.
- 11. Driveways, parking and manoeuvring areas and footpaths must be kept illuminated during the hours of darkness when the bar and lounge facilities are open to the public, and such lights must be directed and screened so that drivers are not distracted by lights.
- 12. Landscaping proposed in the application must be established before the first occupation of the hotel and plants must be maintained in good health and condition at all times. A plant must be replaced if or when it dies or becomes seriously diseased within the first growing season after the plant dies or becomes seriously diseased.
- 13. Vegetation proposed to be established along the western edge of the undercroft parking of the hotel must:
 - provide sufficient foliage and density of planting to screen the undercroft to ensure that the presence of cars is not obtrusive when viewed from the promenade; and
 - not unreasonably inhibit ventilation from the undercroft parking areas (which may require pruning or thinning of the vegetation from time to time).
- 14. Management of stormwater from the Stage 2A site must comply with the Environment Protection Authority's 'Stormwater Pollution Prevention Code of Practice for Local, State and Federal Government' during construction of the Stage 2A development.
- 15. The quality of any stormwater entering the Holdfast Shores marina from the Stage 2A development must comply with the guidelines applicable to secondary recreational use and the protection of aquatic ecosystems within the ANZECC Australian Water Quality Guidelines for Fresh and Marine Waters (November 1992), or any standard that may be subsequently substituted therefore.
- 16. Stormwater from the Stage 2A site must not be disposed of by way of a pipe or similar structure that conveys the stormwater to the beach
- 17. Site works, construction work and truck movements to and from the site must only be carried out between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- 18. Payment of \$1 620.00 shall be made into the Planning and Development Fund (1 allotment @ \$1 620.00 per allotment). Cheques shall be made payable and marked 'Not Negotiable' to the Development Assessment Commission and payment made on Level 5, Roma Mitchell House, 136 North Terrace, Adelaide, (opposite the Railway Station) or sent to G.P.O. Box 1815, Adelaide.

Notes to the Applicant:

- 1. The plans and documents referred to in Condition 1 of the approval together describe the development hereby approved.
- 2. No advertising signs are hereby approved. The display of any additional advertising sign will require separate approval.
- 3. Noise emissions from the Stage 2A development will be subject to the Environment Protection (Industrial Noise) Policy 1994 and the Environment Protection Act 1993.
- 4. The proponent should consult with Adelaide Airport Ltd on crane operations prior to construction.

Preamble

- 1. The decision of the Governor's Deputy under section 48 of the Development Act 1993, to approve the development of a Glass Bottle Manufacturing Facility located 3.5 km north-east of Gawler, was published in the *Gazette* on 10 May 2001.
- 2. The development was the subject of a Development Report and an Assessment Report under section 46 and 46D of the Development Act 1993.
- 3. Amendments to the development approval were subsequently considered and approved by the Development Assessment Commission, and published in the *Gazette* on 31 May 2001, 11 October 2001, 26 June 2003 and 2 October 2003.
- 4. A further amended proposal to further develop the landscaping has been under consideration by the Development Assessment Commission as delegate of the Governor under Division 2 of Part 4 of the Development Act 1993.
- 5. The proposed amendment includes the changes to the land-scaping plan, species selection, irrigation and soil management resultant changes and additions to the conditions imposed on the approval published in the *Gazette* on 2 October 2003.
 - 6. The amendments to the development are contained in:
 - (a) The following plan submitted by Resource Development Pty Ltd on 19 February 2004 Entitled Stage 2 Landscape Plan, Drawing No. V627/D/L/1801 Rev A5.
 - (b) Letter from Leighton Contractors Pty Ltd dated 19 February 2004.
- 7. The Development Assessment Commission is satisfied that the amendments do not require the preparation of a further or amended Development Report.
- 8. The Development Assessment Commission has, in considering the matter, had regard to all relevant matters under section 48 (5) of the Development Act 1993.

Decision

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Development Act 1993, the Development Assessment Commission, as delegate of the Governor, grants development approval to the amended Glass Bottle Manufacturing Facility located 3.5 km north-east of Gawler.

Unless varied by the following conditions.

- 2. No works may be commenced unless and until:
 - (a) a private certifier or the Light Regional Council has certified to the Development Assessment Commission that all work that constitutes building work under the Development Act complies with the Building Rules; and
 - (b) a Construction Environmental Management Plan (CEMP) to address management issues during construction has been prepared by the proponent to the reasonable satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission in consultation with the Environment Protection Agency (a branch of the Department for Environment and Heritage).

The matters addressed in the CEMP shall include, but not be limited to:

- dust control during demolition and construction;
- stormwater management during demolition and construction;
- waste water disposal;
- site clean up during demolition and construction;
- disposal of all waste;
- measures for controlling noise impacts from all activities and equipment; and
- hours of work.
- 3. Prior to the commencement a detailed flood and stormwater management plan be prepared to the reasonable satisfaction of the Development Assessment Commission. Such plan should consider water sensitive water design aspects and 'best practice' measures for progressively treating run-off prior to disposal, such as the use of vegetated swales, retention basins (e.g. ephemeral wetlands), gross pollutant traps, oil/grease traps and silt traps. The disposal of run-off and use of 'treated' water, such as for irrigating landscape/amenity plantings or use in plant processes, should also be addressed. In particular, such plan must include measures to ensure that:

- Development does not increase the flood risk to any other property by provision being made to ensure that stormwater run-off leaving the site post-development does not exceed that which would be expected in its natural state for a 100 year ARI flood event.
- Development is designed to adequately manage stormwater by provision being made to ensure that run-off from the site post-development is suitably collected, treated and disposed of. This shall be achieved by adopting the following principles:
 - the peak rate of stormwater run-off from the development should not exceed that which would be expected from the site in its natural state for all storms up to and including a 20 year ARI event. This will require run-off detention and storage.
 - the volume of stormwater run-off from the development shall not exceed that which would be expected from the site in its natural state, for all storms up to and including a 20 year ARI event. This will require run-off retention including re-use and/or other means of depletion as may be necessary.
 - provision for stormwater run-off treatment should be incorporated to ensure that all stormwater run-off from the development meets appropriate quality standards.
- 4. All landscaping indicated on Drawing V627/D/L/1801 Rev A5 shall be established within 6 months of the date of this approval and shall be maintained and nurtured at all times with any diseased or dying plants being replaced.
- 5. Noise associated with the operation of the proposed development must not exceed an equivalent noise level of 38 dB(A) at any noise sensitive receiver, when measured in accordance with the Environment Protection (Industrial Noise) Policy 1994. This condition shall be achieved for neutral weather conditions.
 - 6. During construction, stormwater management must ensure:
 - surface stormwater from outside the construction site is diverted around all disturbed areas;
 - surface stormwater on the construction site is intercepted and redirected to protect all exposed areas;
 - erosion and sediment control structures are installed prior to the commencement of all site disturbance and construction works;
 - all stockpiles/spoil heaps are surrounded by a silt fence at the down-slope toe of the stockpile; and
 - provision is made on site for the collection and temporary storage of all site debris and waste. Storage facilities used to store waste materials must be located away from all drainage paths to prevent litter and debris from entering the stormwater system, be covered to prevent the entry of stormwater or dispersal by wind, and be sealed to prevent leakage.
- 7. Areas containing materials such as fuels and chemicals that have the potential to contaminate stormwater must be adequately bunded. (This requirement would be satisfied by compliance with Australian Standards (AS3780.8) for storage tank and bund design).

General Environmental Duty

The applicant is reminded of its general environmental duty, as required by section 25 of the Environment Protection Act, to take all reasonable and practical measures to ensure that its activities on the whole site, including during construction, do not pollute the environment in a way which causes or which may cause environmental harm.

Traffic Management

The applicant is advised to contact Transport SA in regard to proposed transport routes for the delivery of raw materials and the distribution of finished product, so that any possible traffic impacts on the Gawler township and the local road network are satisfactorily addressed and minimised.

The holders of these approvals must ensure that the empty containers which belong to their respective class of containers hereby approved as Category B Containers are collected from collection depots approved under section 69 of the Act by the party named in Column 5 of Schedule 1 of this Notice; and

- (ii) Approved Refund Markings:
 - (a) The holders of these approvals must ensure that each container which belongs to their respective class of containers hereby approved as Category B Containers bears the refund marking approved by the Authority in respect of that class of containers.
 - (b) The refund marking that appears on each container that belongs to the class of containers hereby approved, must be a minimum 1.5 mm for the smallest letter in the statement and a minimum 3 mm for the numeric ('5') in the statement.
