

# Receipts

# Taxation

Taxation receipts for the first three months of 2005-06 are similar to collections for the first three months of 2004-05. Lack of growth reflects the abolition of debits tax with effect from 1 July 2005, resulting in only residual collections in the September quarter 2005. Stamp duty receipts are also slightly down reflecting the timing of large share duty transactions in the September quarter 2004 and the abolition of mortgage duty on refinancing and loans for owner occupied loans which took effect from 1 July 2005.

# Royalties

Royalty receipts were lower in the September quarter 2005 compared to the same period last year due to the later timing of royalty receipts from the Olympic Dam mine.

# Commonwealth - General Purpose Grants

The Commonwealth's GST payment profile for 2005-06 results in a higher proportion of budgeted GST revenue for 2005-06 being received in the September quarter 2005, relative to the comparable position in 2004-05. In addition, an earlier overpayment of \$22 million in transitional assistance was recovered by the Commonwealth in the September quarter 2004. This had the effect of lowering the level of general purpose grants in that quarter.

# Commonwealth - Specific Purpose Grants

The increase in the level of Commonwealth Specific Purpose Payments in the first three months of this year, compared to the same period last year, reflects the timing of payments from the Commonwealth.

# Other Receipts

Other Receipts are higher in the September 2005 quarter compared to the September 2004 quarter because of repayments of equity capital contributions from SA Water in line with the 2005-06 Budget.

# **Payments**

Payments have been made pursuant to the *Appropriation Act*, passed at the time of the 2005-06 State Budget and in accordance with various Acts for which specific appropriation has been authorised.

Payments made from the Consolidated Account in the first quarter of 2005-06 were higher than the same quarter in 2004-05. This due to increase in appropriation payments to agencies as approved in the 2005-06 Budget.

## Note

Considerable caution should be exercised in interpreting the quarterly statement of Consolidated Account transactions. Unlike the State budget, which comprises transactions on an accrual basis, the information reflected in the quarterly statements is limited to cash transactions. In addition, the Consolidated Account does not capture all the transactions undertaken by the general government sector (in particular, it does not record receipts to and payments from special deposit accounts). Finally, it should be noted that the timing of receipts and payments could be volatile within a particular year. As a result, apparently significant movements between years may only be due to changes in the timing of receipts and payments, and therefore may not have implications for the underlying budget position.
