1—Short title

This notice may be cited as the *Motor Vehicles (Approval of Motor Bikes and Motor Trikes) Notice 2008.*

2—Commencement

This notice will come into operation on the date of publication in this Gazette.

3—Approved motor bikes and motor trikes
