FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 79

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 79 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, it will be unlawful for any licensed person with a fishery licence subject to a condition fixing a cockle quota entitlement to engage in the class of fishing activity specified in Schedule 1, during the period specified in Schedule 2.

- 1. Taking or an act preparatory to or involved in the taking of mud cockles (*Katelysia* species) from the Port River Cockle Fishing Zone.
- 2. The Port River Cockle Fishing Zone means the waters of or near Port Gawler contained within and bounded by a line commencing at the line of Mean High Water Springs closest to latitude 34°40′12.26″S, longitude 138°26′35.25″E (end of Port Gawler Road), then beginning easterly following the line of Mean High Water Springs to the location closest to latitude 34°46′59.03″S, longitude 138°28′40.48″E, then north-westerly to the point of commencement, but excluding any land or waters so encompassed that lie landward of the line of Mean High Water Springs.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 79

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 115

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 115 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, Garry Warrick, RSD 9, Section 209/210, Loxton, S.A. 5333 (the 'exemption holder') or a person acting as his agent, is exempt from Clauses 72 and 121 of Schedule 6 of the Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2007, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when emptying the 'carp separation cage' located at Lock 1, Blanchetown, (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from 30 September 2010 until 31 July 2011, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- 1. The exemption holder may only take and retain carp (Family Cyprinidae) and non-native species when undertaking the exempted activity.
- 2. All native species taken in the course of the exempted activity must be immediately returned to the water.

- 3. Non-native species must not be returned to the water alive.
- 4. The exemption holder may use Damien Wilksch and/or Trevor Bottrill to assist in the exempted activity.
- 5. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer.
- 6. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Management Act 2007, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.


FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 115

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 115 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, Northern Zone Rock Lobster Fishers with Marine Scalefish Access Option B or Option C and all Marine Scalefish Fishers with a fishery licence that is not subject to a condition fixing a cockle quota entitlement within the Coffin Bay Cockle Fishing Zone (the 'exemption holder') are exempt from Regulation 7 of Schedule 2 of the Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2007, but only insofar as the exemption holder may engage in the activity described in Schedule 1 for personal bait only and in the area specified in Schedule 2 for the period commencing on 20 October 2010 until 30 June 2011.

SCHEDULE 1

The taking of mud cockles (*Katelysia* species) no less than 3.3 cm along their greatest dimension (according to Diagram 1 below).

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. All waters within the Coffin Bay Cockle Fishing Zone.
- 2. The Coffin Bay Cockle Fishing Zone means the waters of or near Coffin Bay contained within and bounded by a line commencing at the line of Mean High Water Springs closest to latitude 34°30′36.68″S, longitude 135°22′46.38″E (generally south-west of Farm Beach), then beginning south-westerly following the line of Mean High Water Springs to the location closest to latitude 34°27′20.32″S, longitude 135°13′00.83″E (Point Burgess), then south-easterly to the point of commencement, but excluding any land or waters so encompassed that lie landward of the line of Mean High Water Springs.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007: SECTION 115

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 115 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, David Corston (the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 2141, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5607 is exempt from section 52 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, but only insofar as the exemption holder may take turbo (Turbo undulatus) for the purpose of trade or business from South Australian coastal waters (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions in Schedule 1, from 20 October 2010 until 30 October 2011, unless revoked or varied earlier.

- 5. If the exemption holder is not able to land Turbo at the estimated time or place notified in accordance with Condition 4 above, they must notify PIRSA Fisheries by calling 1800 065 522 before the estimated time provided and provide a new time of landing or place of landing.
- 6. Within half an hour of landing Turbo the exemption holder must weigh the Turbo and complete the daily log sheet in accordance with Condition 7.
- 7. The exemption holder must provide the Director of Fisheries separate statistical catch and effort information, in the form of a log sheet as provided by the Director. The exemption holder must complete the log sheet every day and submit a completed monthly log to the Director no later than the 15th day of the month following the month to which the log sheet relates, (G.P.O. Box 1625, Adelaide, S.A. 5001). The log sheet must be submitted to the Director at the address specified on the approved log sheet. If no fishing activity was undertaken or no fish were taken on a day or during a month, a nil return must still be completed and submitted to the Director.
- 8. The exemption holder must allow a departmental officer to accompany the exemption holder at any time during fishing operations.
- 9. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must carry or have about or near his person a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer upon request.

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 115 of the Fisheries Management Act 2007, the holder of a Northern Zone Rock Lobster Fishery Licence issued pursuant to the Fisheries Management (Rock Lobster Fisheries) Regulations 2006 (the 'exemption holders') are exempted from the provisions of Regulation 5 of the Fisheries Management (Vessel Monitoring Scheme) Regulations 2007, but only insofar as an exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when using a registered

boat that is endorsed on the licence to undertake fishing activity for the sole purpose of fishing for species other than southern rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) and giant crabs (*Pseudocarinus gigas*) without having a fitted and operational vessel monitoring system (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from 1 November 2010 until 31 May 2011, unless this notice is varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- 1. The exemption holder may only conduct the exempted activity from a boat that is registered and endorsed on their Northern Zone Rock Lobster Fishery Licence and that is less than 6 m in length.

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Aquaculture Variation Regulations 2010*.

In these regulations, a provision under a heading referring to the variation of specified regulations varies the regulations so specified.

Part 2—Variation of Aquaculture Regulations 2005

4—Variation of regulation 3—Interpretation

Regulation 3(1), definitions of *reporting day* and *reporting year*—delete the definitions and substitute:

reporting day, in relation to a licence, means—

- (a) if the licence authorises the farming of finfish—31 January; or
- (b) in any other case—31 August;

reporting year, in relation to a licence, means—

- (a) if the licence authorises the farming of finfish—a period of 12 months commencing on 1 December; or
- (b) in any other case—a period of 12 months commencing on 1 July;

Schedule 1—Transitional provision

For the purposes of the *Aquaculture Regulations 2005*, the reporting year, in relation to a licence, that ends on 30 November or 30 June next following the commencement of this Schedule will be taken to comprise the period from the end of the previous reporting year in relation to the licence until that 30 November or 30 June (even though that period may exceed 12 months).
