GUIDANCE NOTE 3

An Architect's General Obligation to Provide Information

Obligation to Provide Information

Section 60 of the South Australian Architectural Practice Act 2009 imposes an obligation on architects registered in South Australia to provide information to the Board if any person makes a claim for damages or other compensation against that architect or any other person for negligence committed by the architect. Failure to comply with this obligation is an offence carrying a maximum penalty of \$10,000.

The question for architects is – what constitutes a “claim” for the purposes of this section? The Board provides this note to give architects some guidance about when a “claim” arises and with it the obligation to provide information to the Board.

Interpretation

The word “person” refers not only to an individual but also includes companies.

The negligence complained of must be in connection with the provision of services as a registered architect. A claim against the architect in any other capacity – such as in their capacity as employer – does not have to be notified to the Board.

Claim

The word “claim”, in the context of section 60, means a claim brought by commencing legal proceedings in any court of law. A letter threatening legal proceedings does not of itself give rise to the obligation to provide information to the Board (although it might trigger the architect's obligations to notify insurers – advice from brokers should be sought in this regard). Once an architect has been served with legal proceedings, there is a two stage obligation to provide information to the Board. The same obligation arises if an architect becomes aware that another party is being sued in respect of that architect's negligence even if the architect is not a party to the court proceedings. This will include an architect who provides services for or as director of a corporation if the corporation is served with a claim concerning the provision of architectural services. Different information has to be given at each of the two stages.

First Stage Notification

The first stage of the two stage obligation is that the architect who is being sued (or in respect of whose negligence court proceedings have been issued) has to tell the Board within 30 days of the claim being served and provide the prescribed information. Days mean calendar days but if the last day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the next business day will be sufficient.

Second Stage Notification

The second stage of the two stage obligation arises when the “claim” concludes – either by an out of court settlement or a court order being made. Again, the architect must, within 30 days of the settlement agreement being entered into or the court order being made, provide to the Board the prescribed information.

Prescribed Information

The Architectural Practice (General) Regulations 2010 set out in detail what information is required to be given at each of the two stages.

For the first stage the architect must provide the following information:

1. The nature of the service that is alleged to have been carried out negligently; and
2. Full details of the alleged negligence; and
3. The address of the premises at which the negligence is alleged to have occurred; and
4. The time at which and the date on which the negligence is alleged to have occurred; and
5. by the claimant as a result of the alleged negligence; and
6. The date of the claim.

And, for the second stage the architect must provide to the Board the following information:

1. Information adequate to identify the claim; and
2. Details of any change in information previously provided to the Board relating to the claim; and
3. Details of the order or agreement (including the amount ordered or agreed to be paid).

Although the requirement for the prescribed information to be in writing is not specified in the Act or the Regulations, the Board requests, in the interests of all the parties involved, that all information provided pursuant to section 60 be given in writing.

GUIDANCE NOTE 4

Continuing Architectural Education

Section 13 (1) (f) of the Architectural Practice Act 2009 (SA) (Act) prescribes one of the functions of The Architectural Practice Board of South Australia (Board) being to:

(f) prepare or endorse guidelines on continuing architectural education for registered architects;

Note: The expression "Continuing Professional Development" (CPD) is used interchangeably with the expression "continuing architectural education" (CAE) in this Guidance note. CAE reflects the wording in the Act while CPD is the expression used and understood widely across the local architecture profession. In this note both expressions have the same meaning.

Support for national joint policy

The purpose of this note is to inform registered architects in South Australia that the Board has endorsed the national AACA/RAIA Joint Policy on Continuing Professional Development (CPD) 2006 for practising registered architects here.

Frequently Asked Questions

Following are some relevant excerpts (in italics) from the AACA/RAIA Joint Policy:

Why is there a national uniform requirement for CPD?

The AACA and RAI A agree that there is undeniable benefit to the consumers and practitioners of architecture in Australia if all registered practising architects undertake CPD. To maintain national consistency these activities must be defined and accredited in a uniform manner throughout all the states in Australia in accordance with the current tenet of mutual recognition of architects' registration.

Under the Act, compliance with CAE is not a compulsory requirement for registration as an architect in SA. However, the Board regards engagement with CPD as one indication of an architect's currency of skills, knowledge and understanding which may be presented in countering any claim of unprofessional conduct.

The Boards governing registration of architects in New South Wales, Tasmania, Western Australia and Queensland require all registered architects to gain at least 20 points of CPD (10 formal and 10 informal) across at least two of the AACA competencies; their individual requirements are determined by the responsible authority in the relevant jurisdiction.

What is the CPD framework?

The Framework is set out in the Joint Policy:

3.1 Acceptable CPD Activities

Acceptance of CPD activities shall be subject to the following principles.

CPD must:

- relate to practice as an architect
- be additional to activities already undertaken in the normal course of an architect's practice or employment.

3.2 Type of Activity

An effective CPD regime shall have as its basis the National Competency Standards Architecture NCSA 01 (second edition 2008) –<http://www.aaca.org.au/publications/> which prescribes standards in four units:

- A Design
- B Documentation
- C Project management
- D Practice management

Each of these units is further divided into a detailed set of specific contexts, elements and performance criteria. Any accepted CPD activity must be contained within one or more of these units and address the relevant context, element and performance criteria.

3.3 Informal and formal CPD activity

Accepted CPD activity may comprise either:

- *Formal CPD*
A learning activity with stated learning outcomes that is formally assessed or has significant interaction between presenter and learner; or
- *Informal CPD*
A learning activity with stated learning outcomes that involves no formal assessment process or significant interaction between presenter and learner.

What is the amount of acceptable CPD?

The Board recommends a minimum commitment to CPD by registered practising architects is 20 points per annum.

4.1 Relationship of points to category of activity

Points shall be allocated to specific activities through the process of accreditation. Points are accrued in a minimum of two competency units, as listed above in 3.2, per annum. The allocated points loading shall be made clear to those wishing to participate in an acceptable activity.

- *Formal and Informal CPD Activity: One point for every hour of involvement.*
- *Specific activities shall be allocated a discrete number of points, as appropriate.*

A minimum of 10 points must be for formal CPD activities.

Recording CPD

4.3 A nationally consistent format of recording an architect's involvement and completion of acceptable CPD/CAE activities is required. The form of record shall be common across all jurisdictions that are engaged in mutual recognition of registration status.

Liquor Licensing (General Code of Practice) Notice 2012

under section 11A of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*

1—Short title

This notice may be cited as the *Liquor Licensing (General Code of Practice) Notice 2012*.

2—Commencement

This notice comes into operation on 18 January 2013.

The *Liquor Licensing (Code of Practice) Notice 2011* remains in force until that date.

3—General Code of Practice

- (1) The Schedule sets out the Commissioner's General Code of Practice for the purposes of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*.
- (2) The Minister for Business Services and Consumers has approved the General Code of Practice.

Schedule 1—Commissioner's General Code of Practice

Part 1—Preliminary

1—Citation

This code of practice may be cited as the *General Code of Practice* under the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*.

2—Commencement

This code of practice will come into operation on 18 January 2013.

3—Purpose of the code

- (1) The purpose of this code of practice is to promote the objects of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997* and, in particular -
 - (a) to minimise the harmful and hazardous use of liquor and promote responsible attitudes in relation to the promotion, sale, supply and consumption of liquor;
 - (b) to minimise offence, annoyance, disturbance or inconvenience to people who reside, work or worship in the vicinity of licensed premises;
 - (c) to prevent intoxication and/or disorderly or offensive behaviour on licensed premises;

- (d) to protect the safety, health and welfare of staff and patrons on licensed premises;
 - (e) to protect the safety, health and welfare of minors on licensed premises; and
 - (f) to ensure public order and safety.
- (2) The intention of this code of practice is to commit licensees to:
- (a) make an assessment of the risk of their operational practices;
 - (b) not undertake operational practices involving unacceptable risk;
 - (c) consider and implement measures to manage high risk operational practices; and
 - (d) maintain standards of operational practice that, as a matter of course, address medium and low risk operations.

4—Interpretation

- (1) Expressions defined in the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997* have the same meanings in this code of practice.
- (2) The levels of risk associated with the operational practices of a licensed premises are to be assessed on the basis of what a reasonable person would consider to be:
- (a) low risk;
 - (b) medium risk;
 - (c) high risk; or
 - (d) unacceptable risk.
- (3) When assessing the level of risk associated with the operational practices of a licensed premises and the likelihood of a particular outcome occurring, consideration must be given to the class of licence and the nature of the operational practices being conducted under the licence.
- (4) *Reasonable steps* to prevent, reduce the likelihood of or manage an outcome associated with the operational practices of a licensed premises, will be deemed to have been taken where the licensee is able to demonstrate that they have reasonably assessed the risk and the likely occurrence of the outcome based on the class of licence and the operational practices being conducted under the licence, and have implemented a written management plan which contains reasonable measures to reduce the likelihood of the outcome occurring.
- (5) The existence of a management plan formulated in purported compliance with subclause (4) above, will not constitute *reasonable steps* if it is no longer current and/or the licensee's staff have not received training as to the content of the management plan and the manner in which it is to be implemented.

staff includes any person involved in the service or supply of liquor on licensed premises whether they are a paid staff member or a not.

5—Mandatory nature of the code

- (1) Under section 42 of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*, it is a condition of every licence that the licensee must comply with this code of practice.
- (2) This code of practice is in addition to, and does not derogate from, licence conditions imposed by the licensing authority.
- (3) If this code of practice is inconsistent with a licence condition imposed by the licensing authority, the licence condition so imposed will prevail to the extent of the inconsistency. Further, this code of practice is cumulative upon all other obligations imposed by law, including those imposed by or under the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*.

Note -

Under section 45 of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*, non-compliance will constitute an offence by the licensee and, if it involves conduct of another person that the other person knows might render the licensee liable to a penalty, by that other person. Disciplinary action may also be taken under Part 8 of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997* in respect of the non-compliance.

6—Application of this code of practice under 11A(3) of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*

- (1) This code of practice does not apply to a licence in respect of which an exemption is granted by the Liquor and Gambling Commissioner, taking into account the nature and extent of the operations conducted under the licence.
- (2) In addition to subclause (1), the Commissioner may exempt a licensee from a specified provision of this code of practice.

Part 2—Required training and practices

7—Responsible service of alcohol training

- (1) A licensee must ensure that all staff involved in the service or supply of liquor on the licensed premises complete nationally accredited responsible service of alcohol training.
- (2) The training must be completed -
 - (a) in the case of a person who is such a staff member immediately before 18 January 2013 - before 18 January 2014; and
 - (b) in the case of a person who becomes such a staff member on or after 18 January 2013 - within three months after commencing that employment.
- (3) The licensee must ensure that where an application is granted under section 56(2), 63(2), 71(4) or 73(7) of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*, and the person in question has been identified as not having the appropriate knowledge, experience and skills for the purposes specified in those sections, that person must satisfactorily complete responsible service of alcohol training within three months of approval being granted under those sections or within such other period of time as approved by the Liquor and Gambling Commissioner.

- (4) Subclause (1) does not apply in relation to -
- (a) a producer's licence that does not authorise the sale or supply of liquor for consumption on licensed premises;
 - (b) a wholesale liquor merchant's licence;
 - (c) a direct sales licence;
 - (d) a limited club licence unless this clause is applied in relation to the licence by a licence condition imposed by the licensing authority, taking into account the nature and extent of the operations conducted under the licence; or
 - (e) a limited licence unless this clause is applied in relation to the licence by a licence condition imposed by the licensing authority, taking into account the nature and extent of the operations conducted under the licence.
- (5) The licensee must produce evidence of the completion of responsible service of alcohol training by persons as required by this clause or by licence conditions, within 7 days of being requested to do so by an authorised officer (within the meaning of section 122 of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*).
- (6) In this clause -

responsible service of alcohol training means a vocational education and training course in responsible service of alcohol accredited under the *National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011* of the Commonwealth.

8—Practices relating to minors

- (1) A licensee must take reasonable steps to prevent -
- (a) minors consuming or being supplied with liquor on the licensed premises; and
 - (b) minors unlawfully entering or remaining on the licensed premises or any part of the licensed premises that is out of bounds to minors.
- (2) A licensee must not promote, advertise or conduct their operations in a way that tends to encourage minors to consume liquor.

9—Practices promoting responsible attitude to consumption of liquor on licensed premises

- (1) A licensee must not promote, advertise or conduct their operations in a way that tends to encourage the rapid or excessive consumption of liquor or that discourages a responsible attitude to the consumption of liquor.
- (2) A licensee must not offer gender-based promotions involving free or discounted liquor.
- (3) Except where liquor is sold for consumption off licensed premises only, or where liquor is supplied by way of sample only, a licensee must at all times -

- (a) ensure that free cool drinking water is readily available to patrons on the licensed premises; and
- (b) ensure that at least one non-alcoholic beverage (other than water) is available for purchase at a price that does not exceed the price of the least expensive alcoholic beverage available for purchase.

10—Practices relating to drink spiking

- (1) A licensee must take reasonable steps to reduce the likelihood of drink spiking occurring on the licensed premises.
- (2) A licensee must cooperate with and assist police in any investigation relating to alleged drink spiking.
- (3) In this clause -

drink spiking includes any addition of alcohol or other substance to a person's drink without the person's knowledge or permission (whether at all or in the quantity added).

11—Practices relating to intoxication and disorderly, offensive, abusive or violent behaviour

- (1) A licensee must take reasonable steps -
 - (a) to prevent the sale or supply of liquor to intoxicated persons or to persons in circumstances where their speech, balance, coordination or behaviour is noticeably impaired and it is reasonable to believe that the impairment is the result of the consumption of liquor or illicit substances;
 - (b) to reduce the likelihood of incidents of intoxication and/or disorderly, offensive, abusive or violent behaviour on licensed premises; and
 - (c) to manage incidents related to intoxication and/or disorderly, offensive, abusive or violent behaviour that may occur on licensed premises.

12—Practices relating to disturbances

- (1) A licensee must take reasonable steps -
 - (a) to prevent undue offence, annoyance, disturbance, noise or inconvenience to people who reside, work or worship in the vicinity of the licensed premises, resulting from entertainment or activities on the licensed premises or the conduct of people making their way to or from the licensed premises; and
 - (b) to ensure public order and safety.

Part 3—Required measures promoting compliance with the code

13—Risk assessment and reasonable steps

- (1) A licensee must consider the measures that will be implemented in conducting operations under the licence for the purposes of compliance with this code of practice and, in particular, the measures that will be taken to comply with the requirements to take reasonable steps.
- (2) The measures must be contained in a management plan.
- (3) The management plan must be reviewed and if necessary, modified every two years or when operations under the licence alter in such a way that warrants a review and modification of the management plan to be undertaken.

14—Induction and refresher training

- (1) A licensee must provide to all staff involved in the service or supply of liquor on the licensed premises, training in relation to the management plan to be implemented to address the risks associated with the operational practices.
- (2) The training must be provided -
 - (a) in the case of a person who is such a staff member immediately before 18 January 2013 - before 18 July 2013 and at least once in each subsequent period of two years; and
 - (b) in the case of a person who becomes such a staff member on or after 18 January 2013 - on induction into that employment and at least once in each subsequent period of two years.
- (3) The licensee must produce evidence of the completion of the training by persons as required by this clause within 7 days of being requested to do so by an authorised officer (within the meaning of section 122 of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*).

15—Guidelines

The Commissioner may issue guidelines designed to assist in risk assessment and training for compliance with this code of practice.

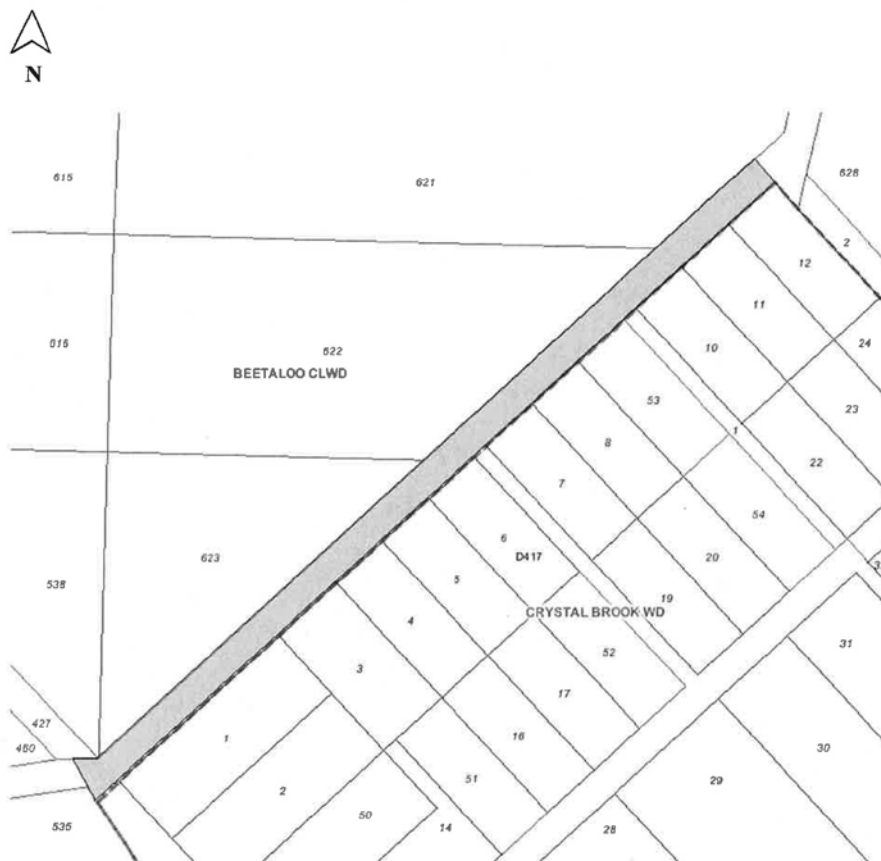
