ATTACHMENT A RECORD KEEPING REQUIREMENTS FOR GROUP I HERBICIDE USE

Record Keeping Element for Group I Herbicide Use	Interpretation
Herbicide user details	The person who applied the herbicide must record their name, address, contact telephone number and qualification. If the application was undertaken by a pest control business as defined in the Controlled Substances (Pesticides) Regulations 2003, the name, address and contact details of the business must also be recorded.
Property details—general	The person who applied the herbicide must also record the name, address and contact phone number of the person in charge of the land where the herbicide was applied if it is not the user.
Specific details of the herbicide application site	The person who applied the herbicide must record a description of the area on the property where the herbicide was applied and its size such that the boundaries are clear. The record must include the name of the crop or situation treated.
Date and time of the herbicide application	The person who applied the herbicide must record the application date(s) and the start and finish times. The record must also include interruptions, including those due to unsuitable weather conditions and applications that extend over more than one day.
Specific details of the application equipment type used	The person who applied the herbicide must record the type of equipment used to apply the herbicide.
 Specific details of the application equipment settings used: Nozzle type and flow rate Spray pressure Spray volume per hectare Travel speed 	The person who applied the herbicide must record the name of the nozzle manufacturer and the specific model description.
Product used	The person who applied the herbicide must record the full product name of the Group I herbicide and any other adjuvants in the tank mix.
Application rate used	The person who applied the herbicide must record the rate used as described on the herbicide label as either rate per hectare or rate per water volume.
Weather conditions: • Wind speed in km/hour • Wind direction • Temperature in degrees Celsius	The person who applied the herbicide must record temperature, wind speed and direction at the start and finish times. The record must also include interruptions due to changes resulting from unsuitable weather conditions and applications that take more than one day.

It is the responsibility of the person who applied the herbicide to ensure the accuracy and completeness of the records.

Records must be made within 24 hours of completing application of the herbicide and kept for two years.

Records must be kept by the person in charge of the land where the herbicide was applied.

If the application was undertaken by a pest control business as defined in the Controlled Substances (Pesticides) Regulations 2003, records must be kept by the business and a copy provided to the person in charge of the land.

Records do not have to be kept on a specific form. Any format, electronic or hard copy that clearly shows the required data is acceptable.

Records do not need to be consolidated in one format or location. Reference can be made to details held with other records to reduce data entry requirements.

In this proclamation—

Act means the Tobacco Products Regulation Act 1997;

prescribed period means the period commencing on 12 November 2013 and ending on 30 November 2013;

prescribed production means the stage production of *The Boys* and *A Single Act* produced by the Flinders University Drama Centre.

4—Application of proclamation

This proclamation applies to the following persons:

- (a) a person employed by, or in relation to, the prescribed production;
- (b) an occupier of the Rehearsal Room, Flinders University Drama Centre, University Drive, Bedford Park, South Australia;
- (c) an employer with responsibility for a workplace consisting of the Rehearsal Room in relation to the prescribed production.

5—Exemption from section 46 of the Act

- (1) A person to whom this proclamation applies is exempt from the operation of section 46 of the Act in relation to smoking occurring in the course of a performance or rehearsal of the prescribed production during the prescribed period.
- (2) An exemption under this clause is subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) smoking may only occur on a stage on which the prescribed production is being performed or rehearsed, or in a rehearsal room used in relation to the prescribed production;
 - (b) the area in which smoking may occur under the exemption must be well ventilated;
 - (c) the audience for a performance of the prescribed production must be warned that there will be smoking during the performance;
 - (d) a person may only smoke a tobacco product of a kind contemplated by paragraph (g) of the definition of *tobacco product* in section 4 of the Act.

(3) If a person contravenes or fails to comply with a condition of an exemption specified in subclause (2), the exemption does not, while the contravention or non-compliance continues, operate in that person's favour.
