Partial Reopening of Ngarkat Conservation Park

PURSUANT to Regulations 8 (3) (a), 8 (3) (b) and 8 (3) (d) of the National Parks and Wildlife (National Parks) Regulations 2001, I, Grant Anthony Pelton, Director, Regional Co-ordination, Partnerships and Stewardship, formerly entitled Director, Public Land Management and Operational Support, Regional Services, authorised delegate of the Director of National Parks and Wildlife, reopen the whole of Ngarkat Conservation Park, which has been closed as a result of bushfire and/or fire danger since 6.20 p.m. on Friday, 17 January 2014, effective 5 p.m. on Friday, 28 February 2014, with the exception of the Ngarkat Block and the McCallum Block, as detailed below, which will both remain closed until further notice.

The Ngarkat Block and the McCallum Block are adjoining areas of the reserve bounded by the following roads and tracks, some of which are included in the continued closure:

Piggery Track (closed);

Bann Hill Track (open to the public);

South Boundary Track (closed);

Bunns Boundary Track (closed); and

Ngarkat Highway (open to the public).

Note: the section of South Boundary Track to the west of the Bann Hill Track intersection will reopen as detailed above to allow access to Gosse Hill Track.

The continued closure is necessary to ensure the safety of the public and for the proper management of the reserve as a result of bushfires and/or fire danger.

- 6. Paragraph 1 of the orders made by J. Bleby on 19 April 2005 in Action 297 of 2004, is revoked forthwith.
- 7. Liberty to Kazimir Kowalski to apply for permission under paragraphs 1, 2 or 3 of this order.
- 8. Liberty to Kazimir Kowalski and Mitsubishi Motors Australia Ltd to apply in respect of paragraph 6 of this order.
- 9. Kazimir Kowalski is to pay 75% of the Attorney-General's costs of action to be adjudicated.
- 10. Kazimir Kowalski is to pay the Attorney-General's costs of Kazimir Kowalski's application dated 4 January 2013 for permission to amend the Counter Summons and of the Attorney-General's application dated 30 July 2012 to strike out the Counter Summons.
- 11. Insofar as it is necessary, permission is granted to Kazimir Kowalski to appeal against these orders.
