- 7. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice and such a notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer immediately upon request.
- 8. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Management Act 2007 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.


