Magistrates Court of South Australia Amendment 50 to the Magistrates Court Rules 1992

 Terms of the warrant The above Magistrate is satisfied following a telephone or facsimile application that there are reasonable grounds for believing that: there may be at the particular premises named above, then or within the next 72 hours, records, devices or other things that may provide evidence of an Australian road law offence; or a vehicle has been involved in an accident and - the vehicle is or has been located at the particular premises named above; or the particular premises are or may be otherwise connected (directly or indirectly) with the vehicle or any part of its equipment or load. 								
The above Magistrate has authorised that the above authorised officer may, with necessary and reasonable help and force, enter and search the above particular premises, and seize and remove any records, devices or other things that the authorised officer believes on reasonable grounds provide, or may on further inspection provide, evidence of an Australian road law offence.								
The followings conditions and limitations apply to this warrant, namely:								
The above authorised officer may apply for this warrant to be varied or renewed. This warrant will be enforced for a period of days (not longer than 45 days) and can be executed at any time.
