# CHILDREN'S PROTECTION LAW REFORM (TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS AND RELATED AMENDMENTS) ACT 2017

SECTION 38

Persons taken to be Approved Carers under the Children and Young People (Safety) Act 2017

I Catherine Taylor, Chief Executive of the Department for Child Protection South Australia, hereby prescribe, pursuant to section 38 of the *Children's Protection Law Reform (Transitional Arrangements and Related Amendments) Act 2017*, the following persons as persons who are taken to be approved as approved carers under section 72 of the *Children and Young People (Safety) Act 2017*:

(1) A person who was, immediately before the commencement of section 38 of the Children's Protection Law Reform (Transitional Arrangements and Related Amendments) Act 2017 –

- (a) caring for a child or young person who is under the guardianship or in the custody of the Minister; and
- (b) has been the subject of an approval granted by the Department for Child Protection in relation to the care of a child or children; and
- (c) is a relative of the child in their care.

Relative of the child means a step-parent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfather or grandmother of the child.

(2) A person who is employed by a relevant commercial care agency and was, immediately before the commencement of section 38 of the *Children's Protection Law Reform (Transitional Arrangements and Related Amendments) Act 2017*, employed by a relevant commercial care agency to provide out of home care for children or young people who are under the guardianship or in the custody of the Minister.

Relevant commercial care agency means Hessel Care Foundation, HenderCare Foundation, Baptist Care (SA) Incorporated, Community Accommodation and Respite Agency (CARA) Incorporated or Minda Incorporated.

(3) A person who is a family day care educator registered with the Department for Education to provide family day care pursuant to the Early Childhood Services (Registration and Standards) Act 2011 and who, immediately before the commencement of section 38 of the Children's Protection Law Reform (Transitional Arrangements and Related Amendments) Act 2017, was caring for a child or young person who is under the guardianship or in the custody of the Minister, with such care arrangements made pursuant to an administrative agreement between the Chief Executive, Department for Child Protection and the Chief Executive, Department for Education.



This notice may be cited as the *Liquor Licensing (Dry Areas) Notice 2018*.

## 3. Interpretation

- (1) Pursuant to section 131 (1ab) of the Act, The Barossa Council has declared that consumption and possession of liquor in the area described in the Schedule is prohibited in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule.

  - (c) a person who is permanently or temporarily residing at premises within the area or on the boundary of the area and who enters the area solely for the purpose of passing through it to enter those premises or who enters the area from those premises for the purpose of leaving the area.

The consumption of liquor is prohibited and the possession of liquor is prohibited.

## 2. Period of prohibition


