## EDUCATION REGULATIONS 2012

*Notice of Policy by the Minister for Education*

PURSUANT to Regulation 60(2)(a) of the *Education Regulations 2012*, I, the Minister for Education publish the following Capacity Management Plan for the purposes of the enrolment of a child at the Brighton Secondary School:

## CAPACITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

*Brighton Secondary School*

This Capacity Management Plan sets out the conditions for enrolment at Brighton Secondary School (“the school”).

**Brighton Secondary School zone**

A school zone is a defined area from which the school accepts its core intake of students. Brighton Secondary School operates a school zone within the area bounded by:

Jetty Road (Glenelg), Maxwell Terrace, Buttrose Street, Wilson Terrace, Frederick Street, Gillespie Street, McGilp Avenue, Ranelagh Street, Mocalta Street, Bells Road, Stevens Street, Baker Street, Diagonal Road, Morphet Road, Sturt Road, Laurence Street, Gemmill Street, Oraston Avenue, Gregory Street, Brighton Road, Wheatland Street and the coastline.

An online map of the Brighton Secondary School zone and a search tool to indicate if an applicant’s home address is within the school zone is available at: <https://www.education.sa.gov.au/findaschool>

*Student Enrolment Numbers***Year 8**

The student enrolment ceiling for Year 8 is limited to **300**, unless there are more applications that have met the enrolment criteria below.

**Selective Entry Special Interest Programs**

The school’s special interest programs (music, volleyball, Bright Programs) are limited as follows:

- Maximum of 65 out of zone enrolments in each year level across all special interest programs, depending on in-zone enrolment demand.

Selective entry numbers are included in the year 8 enrolment ceiling of **300** students. Entries to the program are subject to the eligibility requirements published by the school, available from <https://www.brightonss.sa.edu.au/special-interest-programs/>.

**International Education Program**

The maximum number of international students who can be offered enrolment at the school in the International Education Program is limited to **24** students per year in year levels 9-12.

*Enrolment Criteria – By Year Level***YEAR LEVEL: 8**

Applications for enrolment from parents of prospective Year 8 students require that the student must be enrolled in a government or non-government school in South Australia at the time the parents apply for enrolment through the Year 7-8 transition process (administered by the Department for Education).

The applicant must meet one of the following requirements to be eligible for a Year 8 allocation through the Year 7-8 transition process:

- the child is living in the Brighton Secondary School zone
- the child has received and accepted an offer for selective entry by the school to participate in their selective entry special interest programs

- the child identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander through the Enter for Success program (by the end of term 4)
- the child has been granted enrolment due to special or extenuating circumstances, including but not limited to a child in care where there is a custody or guardianship order made under the *Children and Young People (Safety) Act 2017*.

#### **Application for Year 8 from students living outside the zone with siblings currently at the school**

There is no automatic entry for Year 8 students who live outside the school's zone and have older siblings who currently attend the school.

#### **Late applications for Year 8 from students living in the school zone**

Families who move into the school zone, or who are already living in the school zone but lodge their application for enrolment after the department's Year 7-8 transition process is completed (end of term 2), will have their applications considered if or when vacancies exist, with priority consideration afforded to those applicants already on the school's enrolment register.

In these cases, applications will be considered based on siblings at the school, the distance of the child's residence from the school and any other personal needs, such as curriculum (excluding special interest programs), transportation/location convenience, and social/family links.

The school will notify parents by the beginning of week 1, term 4 if a vacancy is available for their child to attend the following school year.

If no vacancies exist, the applicants will be placed on the enrolment register and referred for enrolment to other neighbouring schools.

#### **YEAR LEVEL: 9 -12**

Applications for enrolment from parents of prospective students living in the school zone will be considered if or when vacancies exist, with priority consideration afforded to those applicants already on the enrolment register.

In these cases, applications will be considered based on siblings at the school, the distance of the child's residence from the school and any other personal needs, such as curriculum, transportation/location convenience, and social/family links.

The school will notify parents by the beginning of week 1, term 4 if a vacancy is available for their child to attend the following school year.

If no vacancies exist the applicants will be encouraged to remain at their current high school, or referred for enrolment to other neighbouring schools, and upon an applicant's request will be placed on the school's enrolment register.

#### **Out of zone applications with siblings currently at the school**

There is no automatic entry for siblings who live outside of the school zone to enrol in Year levels 9 to 12 at Brighton Secondary School.

#### *Enrolment Criteria - General*

#### **Special Circumstances**

Enrolment applications for special consideration based on compelling or unusual reasons, including but not limited to a child in care where there is custody or guardianship orders made under the *Children and Young People (Safety) Act 2017*, may be granted by the Principal in consultation with the Education Director. These applications will be assessed on a case by case basis.

#### *Enrolment Process*

#### **Enrolment Register**

Parents whose child's name has been placed on the enrolment register will be contacted if vacancies become available.

The enrolment register will be reviewed and updated annually by the school.

The position that a child's name appears on the register is confidential and will only be disclosed as required by law.

#### **Monitoring and enforcement**

It is the responsibility of the parents applying for enrolment to be able to verify to the satisfaction of the school that the information provided is true and factual.

The Principal is responsible for the implementation of this Capacity Management Plan and all decisions on enrolments.

This Capacity Management Plan will be reviewed as required.

### 1—Short title

This notice may be cited as the *Motor Vehicles (Approval of Motor Bikes and Motor Trikes) Notice 2019*.

### 2—Commencement

This notice will come into operation on the date of publication in this Gazette.

### 3—Approved motor bikes and motor trikes

For the purposes of Schedules 2 and 3 of the *Motor Vehicles Regulations 2010* and the transitional provisions of the *Motor Vehicles Variation Regulations 2005* (No 233 of 2005), the motor bikes and motor trikes specified in Schedule 1 are approved.

## Schedule 1—Approved motor bikes and motor trikes

The following are approved:

- All motor bikes and motor trikes built before December 1960 with an engine capacity not exceeding 660ml
- All motor bikes and motor trikes with an engine capacity not exceeding 260 milliliters and a power to weight ratio not exceeding 150 kilowatts per tonne, except the following:

BY-LAW MADE UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

*Permits and Penalties By-law 2019—By-law No. 1 of 2019*

To provide for a permit system, set penalties for breaches of by-laws, provide for certain matters pertaining to liability and evidence, set regulatory requirements, clarify the construction of Council's by-laws and for related purposes.

**Part 1 – Preliminary**

1. **Short Title**

This by-law may be cited as the *Permits and Penalties By-law 2019*.

2. **Commencement**

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

### 3. Definitions

3.1 In any by-law of the Council, unless the contrary intention is clearly indicated:

- 3.1.1 **authorised person** means a person appointed as an authorised person pursuant to Section 260 of the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.1.2 **Council** means the Wattle Range Council;
- 3.1.3 **drive** a vehicle means to be in control of the steering, movement or propulsion of the vehicle;
- 3.1.4 **driver** of a vehicle means the person driving the vehicle;
- 3.1.5 **motor vehicle** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*;
- 3.1.6 **person** includes a natural person, a body corporate or incorporated association;
- 3.1.7 **road** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.1.8 **vehicle** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961* and the *Australian Road Rules 2014* and includes a motor vehicle.

3.2 In this by-law:

- 3.2.1 **owner** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*;
- 3.2.2 **prescribed offence** means an offence against a by-law of the Council relating to the driving, parking or standing of vehicles.

### 4. Construction

Every by-law of the Council shall be subject to any Act of Parliament and Regulations made thereunder.

### Part 2 – Permits

#### 5. Council May Grant Permits

If any by-law of the Council states that a person needs a ‘permit’ or ‘permission’ to do a specified thing, then the following provisions apply:

- 5.1 the permit must be in writing;
- 5.2 the Council may:
  - 5.2.1 attach conditions to the permit;
  - 5.2.2 change or revoke a condition, by notice in writing; or
  - 5.2.3 add new conditions, by notice in writing;
- 5.3 a person who holds a permit must comply with every condition attached to it. Failure to do so constitutes a breach of this by-law;
- 5.4 the Council may revoke a permit, by notice in writing, if:
  - 5.4.1 the holder of the permit fails to comply with a condition attached to it; or
  - 5.4.2 the permit is of a continuing nature, and the Council has reasonable grounds for revoking it;
- 5.5 the Council may, by resolution, fix, vary or revoke fees or charges for the granting of a permit to do a specified thing.

### Part 3 – Enforcement

#### 6. Penalties

- 6.1 A person who contravenes, or fails to comply with any by-law of the Council is guilty of an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty, being the maximum penalty referred to in the *Local Government Act 1999*, which may be fixed for offences against a by-law.
- 6.2 A person who is convicted of an offence against any by-law of the Council in respect of a continuing act or omission is liable, in addition to the penalty otherwise applicable, to a further penalty, being the maximum penalty referred to in the *Local Government Act 1999* which may be fixed for offences of a continuing nature against a by-law.

#### 7. Liability of Vehicles Owners and Expiation of Certain Offences

- 7.1 Without derogating from the liability of any other person, but subject to this paragraph, if a vehicle is involved in a prescribed offence, the owner of the vehicle is guilty of an offence and liable to the same penalty as is prescribed for the principal offence and the expiation fee that is fixed for the principal offence applies in relation to an offence against this paragraph.
- 7.2 The owner and driver of a vehicle are not both liable through the operation of this paragraph to be convicted of an offence arising out of the same circumstances, and consequently conviction of the owner exonerates the driver and conversely conviction of the driver exonerates the owner.
- 7.3 An expiation notice or expiation reminder notice given under the *Expiation of Offences Act 1996* to the owner of a vehicle for an alleged prescribed offence involving the vehicle must be accompanied by a notice inviting the owner, if they were not the driver at the time of the alleged prescribed offence, to provide the Council or officer specified in the notice, within the period specified in the notice, with a statutory declaration:
  - 7.3.1 setting out the name and address of the driver; or
  - 7.3.2 if they had transferred ownership of the vehicle to another prior to the time of the alleged offence and has complied with the *Motor Vehicles Act 1959* in respect of the transfer - setting out details of the transfer (including the name and address of the transferee).
- 7.4 Before proceedings are commenced against the owner of a vehicle for an offence against this section involving the vehicle, the complainant must send the owner a notice:
  - 7.4.1 setting out particulars of the alleged prescribed offence; and
  - 7.4.2 inviting the owner, if he or she was not the driver at the time of the alleged prescribed offence, to provide the complainant, within 21 days of the date of the notice, with a statutory declaration setting out the matters referred to in subparagraph 7.3.

- 7.5 Subparagraph 7.4 does not apply to:
- 7.5.1 proceedings commenced where an owner has elected under the *Expiation of Offences Act 1996* to be prosecuted for the offence; or
- 7.5.2 proceedings commenced against an owner of a vehicle who has been named in a statutory declaration under this section as the driver of the vehicle.
- 7.6 Subject to subparagraph 7.7, in proceedings against the owner of a vehicle for an offence against this paragraph, it is a defence to prove:
- 7.6.1 that, in consequence of some unlawful act, the vehicle was not in the possession or control of the owner at the time of the alleged prescribed offence; or
- 7.6.2 that the owner provided the complainant with a statutory declaration in accordance with an invitation under this paragraph.
- 7.7 The defence in subparagraph 7.6.2 does not apply if it is proved that the owner made the declaration knowing it to be false in a material particular.
- 7.8 If:
- 7.8.1 an expiation notice is given to a person named as the alleged driver in a statutory declaration under this paragraph; or
- 7.8.2 proceedings are commenced against a person named as the alleged driver in such a statutory declaration, the notice or summons, as the case may be, must be accompanied by a notice setting out particulars of the statutory declaration that named the person as the alleged driver.
- 7.9 The particulars of the statutory declaration provided to the person named as the alleged driver must not include the address of the person who provided the statutory declaration.
8. **Evidence**
- In proceedings for a prescribed offence, an allegation in an Information that:
- 8.1 a specified place was a road or local government land; or
- 8.2 a specified vehicle was driven, parked or left standing in a specified place; or
- 8.3 a specified vehicle was parked or left standing for the purposes of soliciting business from a person or offering or exposing goods for sale; or
- 8.4 a specified place was not formed or otherwise set aside by the Council for the purposes of the driving, parking or standing of vehicles; or
- 8.5 a specified person was an authorised person; or
- 8.6 a specified provision was a condition of a specified permit granted under paragraph 5 of this by-law; or
- 8.7 a specified person was the owner or driver of a specified vehicle; or
- 8.8 a person named in a statutory declaration under paragraph 7 of this by-law for the prescribed offence to which the declaration relates was the driver of the vehicle at the time at which the alleged offence was committed; or
- 8.9 an owner or driver of a vehicle for a prescribed offence was given notice under paragraph 7 of this by-law on a specified day,
- is proof of the matters so alleged in the absence of proof to the contrary.

#### Part 4 – Miscellaneous

##### 9. Revocation

Council's *By-law No. 1 – Permits and Penalties*, published in the *Gazette* on 19 July 2012, is revoked on the day on which this by-law comes into operation.

##### BY-LAW MADE UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

##### *Moveable Signs By-law 2019—By-law No. 2 of 2019*

To set standards for moveable signs on roads, to provide conditions for and the placement of such signs, to protect public safety and to protect or enhance the amenity of the area of the Council.

#### Part 1 – Preliminary

##### 1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Moveable Signs By-law 2019*.

##### 2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

##### 3. Definitions

In this by-law:

- 3.1 **banner** means a moveable sign constituted of a strip of cloth, plastic or other material hung or attached to a pole, fence or other structure;
- 3.2 **footpath** means:

- 3.2.1 a footway, lane or other place made or constructed for the use of pedestrians; or
- 3.2.2 that part of road between the property boundary of the road and the edge of the carriageway on the same side as that boundary;
- 3.3 **moveable sign** has the same meaning as the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.4 **road** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.5 **road related area** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*.

#### Part 2 – Provisions Applicable to Moveable Signs

##### 4. Design and Construction

A moveable sign displayed on a road must:

- 4.1 be of a kind known as an ‘A’ frame or sandwich board sign, an inverted ‘T’ sign, or a flat sign, or, with the permission of the Council, a sign of some other kind;
- 4.2 be designed, constructed and maintained in good condition so as not to present a hazard to any member of the public;
- 4.3 be constructed so as to be stable when in position and to be able to keep its position in adverse weather conditions;
- 4.4 not contain sharp or jagged edges or corners;
- 4.5 not be unsightly or offensive in appearance;
- 4.6 not contain flashing or moving parts, be illuminated internally or rotate;
- 4.7 be constructed of timber, cloth, metal, plastic or plastic coated cardboard, or a mixture of such materials;
- 4.8 be not more than 90cm high, 60cm in width or 60cm in depth;
- 4.9 not have a display area exceeding 1m<sup>2</sup> in total or, if the sign is two-sided 1m<sup>2</sup> on each side;
- 4.10 in the case of an ‘A’ frame or sandwich board sign:
  - 4.10.1 be hinged or joined at the top;
  - 4.10.2 be of such construction that its sides can be and are securely fixed or locked in position when erected;
- 4.11 in the case of an inverted ‘T’ sign, contain no struts or members than run between the display area of the sign and the base of the sign.

##### 5. Placement

A moveable sign displayed on a road must:

- 5.1 not be placed anywhere except on the footpath;
- 5.2 be adjacent to the business premises to which it relates;
- 5.3 in the case of a flat sign, be in line with and against the property boundary of the road;
- 5.4 not be placed on a sealed footpath, unless the sealed part is wide enough to contain the sign and still leave a clear thoroughfare at least 1.2 metres wide;
- 5.5 be placed at least 50cm from the kerb (or if there is no kerb, from the edge of the roadway);
- 5.6 not be placed on a landscaped area, other than on landscaping that comprises only lawn;
- 5.7 not be placed on a designated parking area or within 1 metre of an entrance to any premises;
- 5.8 not be fixed, tied or chained to, leaned against or placed closer than 1.2 metres to any other structure, object or plant (including another moveable sign);
- 5.9 not be placed in a position that puts the safety of any person at risk;
- 5.10 not be placed on a median strip, roundabout, traffic island or on a carriageway;
- 5.11 not be within 6 metres of an intersection of a road;
- 5.12 not be placed so as to obstruct or impede a vehicle door when opened.

##### 6. Restrictions

A moveable sign displayed on a road must:

- 6.1 only contain material which advertises a business being conducted on commercial premises adjacent to the sign or the goods and services available from that business;
- 6.2 be limited to one per business premises;
- 6.3 not be displayed unless the business to which it relates is open to the public;
- 6.4 be securely fixed in position such that it cannot be blown over or swept away;
- 6.5 not be displayed during the hours of darkness unless it is clearly visible.

##### 7. Appearance

A moveable sign displayed on a road must, in the opinion of an authorised person:

- 7.1 be painted or otherwise detailed in a competent and professional manner;
- 7.2 be legible and simply worded to convey a precise message;
- 7.3 be of such design and contain such colours:
  - 7.3.1 that are compatible with the architectural design of the premises adjacent to the sign;
  - 7.3.2 are compatible with the townscape and overall amenity of the locality in which the sign is situated;
  - 7.3.3 which do not detract from or conflict with traffic, safety or direction signs or signals;
- 7.4 contain a combination of colours and typographical styles that blend in with and reinforce the heritage qualities of the locality and the buildings in which the sign is situated; and

7.5 not have any balloons, flags, streamers or other things attached to it.

8. **Banners**

A banner must:

- 8.1 only be displayed on a road, footpath or road related area;
- 8.2 be securely fixed to a pole, fence or other structure so that it does not hang loose or flap;
- 8.3 not be attached to any building, structure, fence, vegetation or other item owned by the Council on a road, or other improvement to a road owned by the Council;
- 8.4 not be displayed more than one month before and two days after the event it advertises;
- 8.5 not be displayed for a continuous period of more than one month and two days in any twelve month period;
- 8.6 not exceed 3m<sup>2</sup> in size.

**Part 3 – Enforcement**

9. **Removal of Unauthorised Moveable Signs**

- 9.1 If:
  - 9.1.1 a moveable sign has been placed on any road or footpath in contravention of this by-law or of Section 226 of the *Local Government Act 1999*, an authorised person may order the owner of the sign to remove the moveable sign from the road or footpath;
  - 9.1.2 the authorised person cannot find the owner, or the owner fails to comply immediately with the order, the authorised person may remove and dispose of the sign;
  - 9.1.3 a moveable sign is removed under subparagraph 9.1.2 of this by-law and is not claimed within 30 days of such removal the authorised person may sell, destroy or otherwise dispose of the moveable sign as the authorised person thinks fit.
- 9.2 Any person who displays an unauthorised moveable sign or who is the owner of an unauthorised moveable sign which has been removed under subparagraph 9.1 of this by-law must pay the Council any reasonable costs incurred in removing, storing or attempting to dispose of the moveable sign before being entitled to recover the moveable sign.

10. **Removal of Authorised Moveable Signs**

A moveable sign must be removed or relocated by the person who placed the moveable sign on a road or footpath or the owner of the sign, at the request of an authorised person if:

- 10.1 in the opinion of the authorised person, and notwithstanding compliance with this by-law, there is any hazard or obstruction or there is likely to be a hazard or obstruction arising out of the location of the moveable sign; or
- 10.2 so required by the authorised person for the purpose of special events, parades, road or footpath works or any other circumstances which, in the opinion of the authorised person, requires relocation or removal of the moveable sign.

**Part 4 – Miscellaneous**

11. **Specified Exemptions**

- 11.1 This by-law does not apply to a moveable sign which:
  - 11.1.1 is a moveable sign that is placed on a public road pursuant to an authorisation under the *Local Government Act 1999* or another Act;
  - 11.1.2 directs people to the open inspection of any land or building that is available for purchase or lease;
  - 11.1.3 directs people to a garage sale that is being held on residential premises;
  - 11.1.4 directs people to a charitable function;
  - 11.1.5 is related to a State or Commonwealth election and is displayed during the period commencing at 5.00pm on the day before the day of the issue of writ or writs for the election and ending at the close of polls on polling day;
  - 11.1.6 is related to an election held under the *Local Government Act 1999* or the *Local Government (Elections) Act 1999* and is displayed during the period commencing four weeks immediately before the date that has been set for polling day and ending at the close of voting on polling day;
  - 11.1.7 is related to a referendum and is displayed during the course and for the purpose of that referendum;
  - 11.1.8 is displayed with permission of the Council and in accordance with any conditions attached to that permission; or
  - 11.1.9 is a sign of a class prescribed in regulations.
- 11.2 Paragraphs 6.2 and 6.3 of this by-law do not apply to a flat sign containing only the banner or headlines of a newspaper or magazine.
- 11.3 Paragraphs 5.2, 6.2, 6.3, 7.3.1, 7.3.2 and 7.4 of this by-law do not apply to a directional sign to an event run by a charitable body.

12. **Prohibition**

- 12.1 The Council may, by resolution, prohibit the display of moveable signs on a road or part of road subject to this paragraph.
- 12.2 A resolution made by the Council under subparagraph 12.1 may prohibit the display of moveable signs absolutely, or at particular times or on particular days.
- 12.3 The Council may only make a resolution under subparagraph 12.1 if, in the opinion of the Council, the display of movable signs on the road would endanger the safety of road users.
- 12.4 Notwithstanding any other paragraph of this by-law, a person must not display a moveable sign on a road or part of a road contrary to a prohibition made by the Council under this paragraph.

13. **Revocation**

Council's *By-law No. 2 – Moveable Signs*, published in the *Gazette* on 19 July 2012, is revoked on the day on which this by-law comes into operation.

## BY-LAW MADE UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

*Roads By-law 2019—By-law No. 3 of 2019*

For the management of public roads.

**Part 1 – Preliminary**1. **Short Title**

This by-law may be cited as the *Roads By-law 2019*.

2. **Commencement**

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

3. **Definitions**

In this by-law, unless the contrary intention appears:

- 3.1 **adjacent land** has the same meaning as in the *Australian Road Rules*;
- 3.2 **animal** includes birds and poultry but does not include a dog;
- 3.3 **camp** includes setting up a camp, or causing or allowing a tent, sleeping bag, caravan or motor home to remain on land for the purpose of staying overnight whether or not any person is in attendance or sleeps on the land;
- 3.4 **dog** has the same meaning as in the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;
- 3.5 **electoral matter** has the same meaning as in the *Electoral Act 1985* provided that such electoral matter is not capable of causing physical damage or injury to any person within its immediate vicinity;
- 3.6 **emergency worker** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic (Road Rules – Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2014*;
- 3.7 **wheeled recreational device** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961* but also includes any vehicle that is an electric personal transporter for the purposes of that Act.

**Part 2 – Management of Roads**4. **Activities Requiring Permission**

A person must not on any road, without the permission of Council:

4.1 **Advertising**

- 4.1.1 display any sign for the purpose of commercial advertising, other than a moveable sign which is displayed on a public road in accordance with the Council's *Moveable Signs By-law 2019*;
- 4.1.2 place or maintain any goods or sign on the road or park or stand a vehicle on the road for the purpose of:
  - 4.1.2.1 soliciting any business from any person; or
  - 4.1.2.2 offering or exposing goods or services for sale
 provided that this subparagraph 4.1.2 shall not apply to a person who is simply travelling along a road.

4.2 **Amplification**

use an amplifier or other device whether mechanical or electrical for the purposes of amplifying sound to the public;

4.3 **Animals**

- 4.3.1 cause or allow any animal, to stray onto, graze, wander on or be left unattended on any road except where the Council has set aside a track or other area for use by or in connection with an animal of that kind and, then only if under the effective control of a person;
- 4.3.2 lead, drive or exercise any animal in such a manner as to endanger the safety of any person;

4.4 **Bridge Jumping**

jump from or dive from a bridge;

4.5 **Camping**

- 4.5.1 erect any tent or other structure of calico, canvas, plastic or similar material as a place of habitation;
- 4.5.2 camp or remain overnight, provided that this clause does not apply to a person where the person camps:
  - 4.5.2.1 in a caravan or motorhome; and
  - 4.5.2.2 within 200m of a sign displayed by the Council indicating that camping in a caravan or motorhome is permitted on that road;

4.6 **Donations**

ask for or receive or indicate that he or she desires a donation of money or any other thing;

4.7 **Driving on Formed Surface**

drive a motor vehicle other than on a portion of the road that has been formed or otherwise set aside by the Council for the driving of motor vehicles, unless it is not reasonably practical to do so;



- 4.8 **Fauna**
- 4.8.1 take, interfere with or disturb any animal or bird or the eggs or young of any animal or bird; or
- 4.8.2 disturb, interfere with or damage any burrow, nest or habitat of any animal or bird;
- 4.9 **Fires**
- light any fire except:
- 4.9.1 in a place provided by the Council for that purpose; or
- 4.9.2 in a portable barbeque, as long as the barbeque is used in an area that is clear of flammable material for a distance of at least four metres; and
- 4.9.3 in accordance with the *Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005*;
- 4.10 **Fishing**
- fish from any bridge or other structure on a road to which the Council has resolved this subparagraph shall apply;
- 4.11 **Flora**
- subject to the *Native Vegetation Act 1991* and the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972*:
- 4.11.1 take, uproot or damage any plant;
- 4.11.2 remove, take or disturb any soil, stone, wood, tender or bark;
- 4.11.3 collect or take any dead wood or timber for the purpose of using the same to make or maintain a fire; or
- 4.11.4 ride or drive any vehicle or allow an animal to run, stand or walk on any flowerbed or garden plot;
- 4.11.5 pick fruit, nuts or berries from any trees or bushes thereon;
- 4.12 **Obstructions**
- 4.12.1 erect, install or place or cause to be erected, installed or placed any structure, object or material of any kind so as to obstruct a road or footway, water-channel, or watercourse in a road;
- 4.12.2 lock, affix, place or park a bicycle or other personal mobility device on a road or road related area, where the bicycle or device may cause an obstruction or unreasonable hazard, other than on a structure or space specifically designed and set aside by the Council for that purpose;
- 4.13 **Preaching**
- preach or harangue;
- 4.14 **Public Exhibitions and Displays**
- 4.14.1 sing, busk or play a musical instrument for the apparent purpose of either entertaining others or receiving money;
- 4.14.2 conduct or hold any concert, festival, show, public gathering, street party, circus, performance or any other similar activity;
- 4.14.3 cause any public exhibitions or displays;
- 4.15 **Wheeled Recreational Devices**
- use a wheeled recreational device on a footpath;
- 4.16 **Working on Vehicles**
- perform the work of repairing, washing, painting, panel beating or other work of any nature on or to any vehicle, except for running repairs in the case of breakdown.

### Part 3 – Miscellaneous

#### 5. Directions

A person must comply with any reasonable direction or request from an authorised person relating to:

- 5.1 that person's use of the road;
- 5.2 that person's conduct and behaviour on the road;
- 5.3 that person's safety on the road;
- 5.4 the safety and enjoyment of the road by other persons.

#### 6. Removal of Animals and Objects

If any animal, goods, materials or object is found on a road in breach of this by-law:

- 6.1 any person in charge of the animal, goods, materials or object shall forthwith remove it from that land on the request of an authorised person; and
- 6.2 any authorised person may remove any animal, goods, materials or object from the road if the person fails to comply with the request, or if no person is apparently in charge of the animal, goods, materials or object and may recover the costs of so doing from the person responsible as a debt.

#### 7. Exemptions

- 7.1 The restrictions in this by-law do not apply to any Police Officer, Council Officer or Council employee acting in the course and within the scope of that person's normal duties, or to a contractor while performing work for the Council and while acting under the supervision of a Council Officer, or to an emergency worker performing emergency duties.
- 7.2 The restrictions in subparagraphs 4.1.1, 4.2, 4.13 and 4.14 of this by-law do not apply to:
- 7.2.1 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which is related to a State or Commonwealth election and is displayed during the period commencing at 5.00pm on the day before the day of the issue of writ or writs for the election and ending at the close of polls on polling day;

- 7.2.2 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which relate to an election under the *Local Government Act 1999* or the *Local Government (Elections) Act 1999* that occurs during the period commencing four weeks immediately before the date that has been set (either by or under either Act) for polling day and ending at the close of voting on polling day; or
- 7.2.3 matters which relate to, and occur during the course of and for the purpose of a referendum.
- 7.3 Subparagraph 4.7 of this by-law does not apply to a motor vehicle being driven to or from adjacent land by the shortest practical route.
8. **Application**  
Subparagraph 4.10 of this by-law shall apply only in such portion or portions of the area as the Council may by resolution direct from time to time in accordance with Section 246(3)(e) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.
9. **Revocation**  
Council's *By-law No. 3 – Roads*, published in the *Gazette* on 19 July 2012, is revoked on the day on which this by-law comes into operation.

##### BY-LAW MADE UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

##### *Local Government Land By-law 2019—By-law No. 4 of 2019*

For the management and regulation of the use of and access to all land vested in or under the control of the Council including the prohibition and regulation of particular activities on local government land.

#### Part 1 – Preliminary

1. **Short Title**  
This by-law may be cited as the *Local Government Land By-law 2019*.
2. **Commencement**  
This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.
3. **Definitions**  
In this by-law, unless the contrary intention appears:
- 3.1 **animal** includes birds and insects but does not include a dog;
- 3.2 **authorised person** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.3 **camp** includes setting up a camp, or causing a tent, caravan or motorhome to remain on the land for the purpose of staying overnight, whether or not any person is in attendance or sleeps on the land;
- 3.4 **e-cigarette** means:
- 3.4.1 a device that is designed to generate or release an aerosol or vapour for inhalation by its user in a manner similar to the inhalation of smoke from an ignited tobacco product; or
- 3.4.2 a device of a kind resolved by the Council and notified by notice in the *Gazette* to be an e-cigarette;
- 3.5 **electoral matter** has the same meaning as in the *Electoral Act 1985* provided that such electoral matter is not capable of causing physical damage or injury to any person within its immediate vicinity;
- 3.6 **emergency worker** has the same meaning as in the *Australian Road Rules* and the *Road Traffic (Road Rules - Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2014*;
- 3.7 **liquor** has the same meaning as defined in the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*;
- 3.8 **local government land** means all land vested in or owned by the Council or under the care, control and management of the Council (except roads);
- 3.9 **motor vehicle** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*;
- 3.10 **open container** means a container which:
- 3.10.1 after the contents thereof have been sealed at the time of manufacture and:
- 3.10.1.1 being a bottle, has had its cap, cork or top removed (whether or not it has since been replaced);
- 3.10.1.2 being a can, it has been opened or punctured;
- 3.10.1.3 being a cask, has had its tap placed in a position to allow it to be used;
- 3.10.1.4 being any form of container, it has been opened, broken, punctured or manipulated in such a way as to allow access to the contents thereof; or
- 3.10.2 is a flask, glass or mug or other container used for drinking purposes;
- 3.11 **tobacco product** has the same meaning as in the *Tobacco and E-Cigarette Products Act 1997*;
- 3.12 **smoke** means:
- 3.12.1 in relation to a tobacco product, smoke, hold, or otherwise have control over, an ignited tobacco product; or
- 3.12.2 in relation to an e-cigarette, to inhale from, hold or otherwise have control over, an e-cigarette that is in use; or
- 3.13 **vehicle** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*;

- 3.14 *waters* includes a body of water, including a pond, lake, river, creek or wetlands under the care, control and management of the Council;
- 3.15 *wheeled recreational device* has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961* but also includes any vehicle that is an electric personal transporter for the purposes of that Act.

## Part 2 – Management of Local Government Land

### 4. Activities Requiring Permission

A person must not without permission on any local government land:

#### 4.1 Advertising

display, paint or erect any sign or hoarding for the purpose of commercial advertising or any other purpose;

#### 4.2 Aircraft

Subject to the *Civil Aviation Act 1988*, land any aircraft on, or take off any aircraft from the land;

#### 4.3 Alteration of Local Government Land

make an alteration to the land, including:

- 4.3.1 altering the construction or arrangement of the land to permit or facilitate access from an adjacent property; or
- 4.3.2 erecting or installing a structure (including pipes, wires, cables, fixtures, fittings and other objects) in, on, across, under or over the land; or
- 4.3.3 changing or interfering with the construction, arrangement or materials of the land; or
- 4.3.4 changing, interfering with or removing a structure (including pipes, wires, cables, fixtures, fittings or other objects) associated with the land; or
- 4.3.5 planting a tree or other vegetation on the land, interfering with the vegetation on the land or removing vegetation from the land;

#### 4.4 Amplification

use an amplifier or other device whether mechanical or electrical for the purpose of amplifying sound or broadcasting announcements;

#### 4.5 Animals

- 4.5.1 cause or allow any animal to stray into or depasture therein;
- 4.5.2 cause or allow an animal to enter, swim, bathe or remain in any waters located on the land;
- 4.5.3 allow any animal to damage any flower bed, garden plot, tree, lawn or other item or place;

#### 4.6 Athletic and Ball Sports

- 4.6.1 to which this sub-paragraph applies, promote, organise or take part in any organised athletic sport;
- 4.6.2 to which this subparagraph applies, play or practice the game of golf;

#### 4.7 Bees

place a hive of bees on such land, or allow it to remain thereon;

#### 4.8 Boat Ramps

subject to the provisions of the *Harbors and Navigation Act 1993* and the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law*:

- 4.8.1 use or launch a boat or other object from any boat ramp or in any area except where a sign or signs are displayed by the Council requiring the purchase of a permit prior to launch;
- 4.8.2 in respect of a permit issued under sub-paragraph 4.8.1:
- 4.8.2.1 the Council shall prescribe a fee at least once in each financial year for permits to use a boat ramp;
- 4.8.2.2 a permit may be purchased for a fee from the Council or its duly authorised agent, or a ticket vending machine installed and maintained by the Council;
- 4.8.2.3 the Council may attach conditions of use to the permit which must be complied with by the permit holder;
- 4.8.2.4 upon request of an Authorised Person, any person about to use (unless they have not yet had the opportunity to purchase a ticket) using or having used a boat ramp, must produce a permit purchased prior to the request in compliance with this by-law;
- 4.8.2.5 the Council, or such other person as the Council may authorise by resolution for that purpose, may exempt organisations involved in search and rescue at sea from the requirement to purchase a permit;
- 4.8.2.6 the Council may, by resolution and the erection of a sign or signs, restrict the use of special areas or boat ramps to either commercial or recreational use, or prohibit their use entirely; and
- 4.8.2.7 this sub-paragraph 4.8.2 will only apply to such parts of the Council's area and at such times as the Council may by resolution determine from time to time;
- 4.8.3 allow any vehicle, boat, yacht or other seagoing craft to remain stationary on any boat ramp longer than is necessary to launch or retrieve a boat;

#### 4.9 Bridge Jumping

jump or dive from any bridge;

- 4.10 **Burials and Memorials**
- 4.10.1 bury, inter or spread the ashes of any human or animal remains;
- 4.10.2 erect any memorial;
- 4.11 **Camping**
- camp or remain overnight, provided that this clause does not apply to a person where the person camps:
- 4.11.1 in a caravan or motorhome; and
- 4.11.2 within 200m of a sign displayed by the Council indicating that camping in a caravan or motorhome is permitted on that land;
- 4.12 **Canvassing and Preaching**
- preach, canvass, harangue or otherwise solicit for religious purposes except on any land or part thereof where the Council has, by resolution, determined this restriction shall not apply;
- 4.13 **Closed Lands**
- enter or remain on any part of the land:
- 4.13.1 at any time during which the Council has declared that the part shall be closed to the public, and which is indicated by a sign adjacent to the entrance to that part;
- 4.13.2 where the land is enclosed with fences and/or walls, and gates have been closed and locked; or
- 4.13.3 where admission charges are payable, for that person to enter that part without paying those charges;
- 4.14 **Depositing Soil**
- deposit any soil, clay, gravel, sand, timber, stones, pebbles or any other matter on the land;
- 4.15 **Distribution**
- give out or distribute any hand bill, book, notice, leaflet, or other printed matter to any bystander, passer-by or other person;
- 4.16 **Donations**
- ask for or receive or indicate that he or she desires a donation of money or any other thing;
- 4.17 **Entertaining**
- 4.17.1 sing, busk or play any recording or upon any musical instrument so as to appear to be for the purpose of entertaining other persons whether or not receiving money;
- 4.17.2 conduct or hold a concert, festival, show, circus, performance or similar activity;
- 4.18 **Fauna**
- 4.18.1 take, interfere with or disturb any animal or bird or the eggs or young of any animal or bird;
- 4.18.2 disturb, interfere with or damage any burrow, nest or habitat of any animal or bird; or
- 4.18.3 use, possess or have control of any device for the purpose of killing or capturing any animal or bird;
- 4.19 **Filming**
- conduct or participate in any filming where the filming is for a commercial purpose;
- 4.20 **Fires**
- subject to the *Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005*; light any fire except:
- 4.20.1 in a place provided by the Council for that purpose; or
- 4.20.2 in a portable barbeque, as long as the barbeque is used in an area that is clear of flammable material for a distance of four metres;
- 4.21 **Fireworks**
- use, discharge or explode any fireworks;
- 4.22 **Flora**
- subject to the *Native Vegetation Act 1991* and the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972*:
- 4.22.1 take, uproot or damage any plant;
- 4.22.2 remove, take or disturb any soil, stone, wood, tender or bark;
- 4.22.3 collect or take any dead wood or timber for the purpose of using the same to make or maintain a fire; or
- 4.22.4 ride or drive any vehicle or allow an animal to run, stand or walk on any flowerbed or garden plot;
- 4.23 **Games**
- 4.23.1 participate in any game recreation or amusement which involves the use of a ball, missile or other object which by the use thereof may cause or be likely to cause injury or discomfort to any person being on or in the vicinity of that land or detract from or be likely to detract from another person's lawful use and enjoyment of that land;
- 4.23.2 to which this sub-paragraph applies, play any organised competition sport, as distinct from organised social play;
- 4.24 **Marine Life**
- introduce any marine life to any waters;*
- 4.25 **Model Aircraft, Boats and Cars**
- subject to the *Civil Aviation Act 1988*:
- 4.25.1 fly or operate a model aircraft or drone aircraft, boat or remote control vehicle in a manner which may cause injury or discomfort to a person on or in the vicinity of local government land or detract from or be likely to detract from another person's lawful use of and enjoyment of the land; or

- 4.25.2 fly or operate a model aircraft or drone aircraft, boat or remote control vehicle on any local government land to which the Council has resolved this subparagraph applies;
- 4.26 **Mooring**
- 4.26.1 moor any boat, house boat, raft or other water craft on or to local government land or in any area that the Council has not set aside for the mooring of any boat, raft or other water craft; or
- 4.26.2 obstruct any boat, raft or other water craft or any mooring place, or any access to any boat, raft, object (either floating or sunk);
- 4.27 **No Liquor**
- 4.27.1 to which this subparagraph applies consume, carry or be in possession or charge of any liquor (provided the land constitutes a park or reserve) save and except on premises in respect of which a licence is in force pursuant to the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*;
- 4.27.2 to which this subparagraph applies, except in sealed containers, consume, carry, be in possession or charge of any liquor in an open container (provided the land constitutes a park or reserve) save and except on premises in respect of which a licence is in force pursuant to the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*;
- 4.28 **Obstructions**
- 4.28.1 erect, install or place or cause to be erected, installed or placed any structure, object or material of any kind so as to obstruct a thoroughfare on the land or footway, water-channel, or watercourse in the land;
- 4.28.2 lock, affix, place or park a bicycle or other personal mobility device on the land where the bicycle or device may cause an obstruction or unreasonable hazard, other than on a structure or space specifically designed and set aside by the Council for that purpose;
- 4.29 **Overhanging Articles**
- suspend or hang any article or thing from any building, verandah, pergola, post or other structure where it might present a nuisance or danger to any person using local government land;
- 4.30 **Picking Fruit etc**
- pick fruit, nuts or berries from any trees or bushes thereon;
- 4.31 **Playing Area**
- use or occupy a playing area:*
- 4.31.1 in such a manner as to damage or be likely to damage the surface of the playing area or infrastructure (above and under ground level);
- 4.31.2 in a manner contrary to the purpose for which the playing area was intended to be used or occupied; or
- 4.31.3 contrary to directions of the Council made by resolution and indicated on a sign displayed adjacent to the playing area;
- 4.32 **Pontoons**
- install or maintain a pontoon or jetty in any waters;
- 4.33 **Rubbish and Rubbish Dumps**
- 4.33.1 interfere with, remove or take away any rubbish that has been discarded at any rubbish dump on local government land;
- 4.33.2 remove, disperse or interfere with any rubbish (including bottles, newspapers, cans, containers or packaging) that has been discarded in a Council rubbish bin on local government land;
- 4.34 **Swimming**
- to which this subparagraph applies, swim or bathe in any pond or lake;
- 4.35 **Tents**
- (except with authority of the Council or other Government authority) erect any tent or other structure of calico, canvass, plastic or similar material as a place of habitation;
- 4.36 **Trading**
- 4.36.1 carry on the business of selling or offering or exposing for sale any goods, merchandise, commodity, article or thing; or
- 4.36.2 set up a van or other vehicle or stall or other structure, tray, carpet or device for the purpose of buying or selling any goods, merchandise, commodity, article or thing;
- 4.37 **Use of Boats**
- subject to the provisions of the *Harbors and Navigation Act 1993* and the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law*, hire out a boat or otherwise use a boat for commercial purposes;
- 4.38 **Vehicles**
- 4.38.1 drive or propel a motor vehicle except on an area or road constructed and identified by the Council for that purpose, by means of signs, devices or fencing and the like;
- 4.38.2 promote, organise or take part in a race, test or trial of any kind in which vehicles take part, except on an area properly constructed for that purpose;
- 4.39 **Wheeled Recreational Devices**
- use a wheeled recreational device on land to which the Council has resolved this subparagraph applies;
- 4.40 **Working on Vehicles**
- perform the work of repairing, washing, painting, panel beating or other work of any nature on or to any vehicle, except for running repairs in the case of breakdown.
5. **Prohibited Activities**
- A person must not on any local government land:

- 5.1 **Animals**
- 5.1.1 send, drive, lead, ride or take any animal or permit any animal to be sent, driven, led, ridden or taken on any land which the Council has, by resolution, declared to be prohibited for such purpose;
- 5.1.2 allow any animal to be let loose or left unattended on any land which the Council has, by resolution, declared to be prohibited for such purpose;
- 5.2 **Annoyances**
- annoy or unreasonably interfere with any other person's use of the land by making a noise or creating a disturbance that has not been authorised by the Council;
- 5.3 **Defacing Property**
- deface, paint, write, cut names or make marks on any tree, rock, gate, fence, building, sign or other property of the Council therein;
- 5.4 **Glass**
- wilfully break any glass, china or other brittle material;
- 5.5 **Missiles**
- throw, roll or discharge any stone, substance or missile to the danger of any person or animal;
- 5.6 **Smoking**
- smoke tobacco or any other substance:
- 5.6.1 in any building or part of any building; or
- 5.6.2 on any land to which this subparagraph applies;
- 5.7 **Toilets**
- in any public convenience:
- 5.7.1 urinate other than in a urinal or pan or defecate other than in a pan set apart for that purpose;
- 5.7.2 smoke tobacco or any other substance;
- 5.7.3 deposit anything in a pan, urinal or drain that is likely to cause a blockage;
- 5.7.4 use it for a purpose for which it was not designed or constructed;
- 5.7.5 enter any toilet that is set aside for use of the opposite sex except where:
- 5.7.5.1 a child under the age of five years accompanied by an adult person; and/or
- 5.7.5.2 to provide assistance to a person with a disability;
- 5.8 **Use of Equipment**
- use any form of equipment or property belonging to the Council other than in the manner and for the purpose for which it was designed or set aside;
- 5.9 **Waste**
- deposit any domestic or commercial waste or other rubbish emanating from domestic or commercial premises in any Council rubbish bin unless permitted by a sign or signs installed by the Council.

### Part 3 – Miscellaneous

#### 6. **Removal of Animals And Directions to Persons**

##### Animals & Objects

- 6.1 If any animal or object is found on part of local government land in breach of a by-law any person in charge of the animal or object shall forthwith remove it from that part on the request of any authorised person.
- 6.2 An authorised person may remove the animal or object if a person fails to comply with the request, or if no person is apparently in charge of the animal or object.

##### Directions

- 6.3 A person on local government land must comply with a reasonable direction from an authorised person relating to:
- 6.3.1 that persons use of the land;
- 6.3.2 that persons conduct and behaviour on the land;
- 6.3.3 that persons safety on the land; or
- 6.3.4 the safety and enjoyment of other persons on the land.
- 6.4 a person who, in the opinion of an authorised person, is likely to commit or has committed, a breach of this by-law must immediately comply with a direction of an authorised person to leave that part of local government land.

##### Recovery

- 6.5 If a person fails to comply with an order of an authorised person made pursuant to section 262 of the *Local Government Act 1999* in respect of a breach of this by-law, the Council may recover its costs and expenses of any action taken under Section 262(3) of the *Local Government Act 1999* from the person to whom the order was directed as a debt.

#### 7. **Removal of Encroachment or Interference**

Any person who encroaches onto, interferes with or alters local government land contrary to this by-law must at the request in writing of an authorised person, cease the encroachment, interference or alteration and remove the source of the encroachment, interference or alteration and reinstate the land to the same standard as the state of the land prior to the encroachment, interference or alteration.

## 8. Council May Do Work

If a person fails to remove an encroachment, interference or alteration on local government land in accordance with a request of an authorised person pursuant to Clause 7 of this by-law, then the Council may:

- 8.1 undertake the work itself; and
- 8.2 recover the cost of doing so from that person as a debt.

## 9. Exemptions

- 9.1 The restrictions in this by-law do not apply to any Police Officer, Council Officer or employee acting in the course and within the scope of that person's normal duties, or to a contractor while performing work for the Council and while acting under the supervision of a Council Officer, or an emergency worker when performing emergency duties.
- 9.2 The restriction in subparagraph 4.19 does not apply to any filming conducted for the purposes of gathering or reporting the news.
- 9.3 The restrictions in clause 4.1, 4.3, 4.4, 4.12, 4.15 and 4.16 of this by-law do not apply to:
  - 9.3.1 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which relate to a Commonwealth or State election that occurs during the period commencing at 5:00pm on the day before the issue of the writ or writs for the election and ending at the close of polls on polling day; or
  - 9.3.2 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which relate to an election under the Act or the *Local Government (Elections) Act 1999* and occurs during the period commencing four weeks immediately before the date that has been set (either by or under either Act) for polling day and ending at the close of voting on polling day; or
  - 9.3.3 related to, and occurs during the course of and for the purpose of a referendum.

## 10. Application of Paragraphs

Any of sub-paragraphs 4.6, 4.8.2, 4.12, 4.23.2, 4.25.2, 4.27, 4.34, 4.39, 5.1 and 5.6.2 of this by-law shall apply only in such portion or portions of the area and at such times as the Council may by resolution direct in accordance with Section 246(3)(e) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

## 11. Revocation

Council's *By-law No. 4 – Local Government Land*, published in the *Gazette* on 19 July 2012, is revoked on the day on which this by-law comes into operation.

The foregoing by-law was duly made and passed at a meeting of the Wattle Range Council held on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of August 2019 by an absolute majority of the members for the time being constituting the Council, there being at least two thirds of the members present.

BY-LAW MADE UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999 AND THE DOG AND CAT MANAGEMENT ACT 1995

*Dogs By-law 2019—By-law No. 5 of 2019*

For the management and control of dogs within the Council's area.

#### Part 1 – Preliminary

##### 1. Short Title

This by-law may be cited as the *Dogs By-law 2019*.

##### 2. Commencement

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

##### 3. Definitions

In this by-law:

- 3.1 **approved kennel establishment** means a building, structure or area approved by the relevant authority, pursuant to the *Development Act 1993* or *Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* for the keeping of dogs on a temporary or permanent basis;
- 3.2 **assistance dog** means a dog trained and used for the purpose of assisting a person who is wholly or partially disabled and includes a dog undergoing training of a kind approved by the Board for assistance dogs;
- 3.3 **authorised person** means a person appointed as an authorised person under the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;
- 3.4 **children's playground** means any enclosed area in which there is equipment, apparatus or other installed devices for the purpose of children's play (or within 3 metres of such devices if there is no enclosed area);
- 3.5 **control**, in relation to a dog, includes the person having ownership, possession or charge of, or authority over, the dog;
- 3.6 **dog** has the same meaning as in the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;
- 3.7 **effective control** means a person exercising effective control of a dog either:
  - 3.7.1 by means of a physical restraint;
  - 3.7.2 by command, the dog being in close proximity to the person, and the person being able to see the dog at all times;
- 3.8 **keep** includes the provision of food or shelter;
- 3.9 **leash** includes any chain, cord or leash;
- 3.10 **local government land** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.11 **park** has the same meaning as in the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;

- 3.12 **premises** includes:
- 3.12.1 land;
  - 3.12.2 a part of any premises or land;
- 3.13 **public place** has the same meaning as in the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*;
- 3.14 **small dwelling** means a self contained residence that is:
- 3.14.1 a residential flat building;
  - 3.14.2 contained in a separate strata unit;
  - 3.14.3 on allotment less than 400m<sup>2</sup> in area; or
  - 3.14.4 without a secure yard of at least 60m<sup>2</sup> in area;
- 3.15 **wetland area** includes any park, reserve, scrub, trail or other land adjacent to a wetland;
- 3.16 **working livestock dog** means a dog:
- 3.16.1 usually kept, proposed to be kept or worked on rural land by a person who is:
    - 3.16.1.1 a primary producer; or
    - 3.16.1.2 engaged or employed by a primary producer; and
  - 3.16.2 kept primarily for the purpose of herding, droving, protecting, tending or working stock, or training for herding, droving, protecting, tending or working stock.

## Part 2 – Dog Management and Control

### 4. Dog Free Areas

- 4.1 A person must not allow a dog in that person's control to be in, or remain in a dog free area.
- 4.2 For the purposes of this paragraph, a **dog free area** is any:
- 4.2.1 local government land or public place to which the Council has resolved this paragraph applies; or
  - 4.2.2 children's playground.
- 4.3 The restrictions in subparagraph 4.1 do not apply to any assistance dog.

### 5. Dog on Leash Areas

- 5.1 A person must not allow a dog under that person's control to be in, or remain in, a dog on leash area unless the dog is secured by a strong leash not exceeding two metres in length which is either:
- 5.1.1 tethered securely to a fixed object capable of securing the dog; or
  - 5.1.2 held by a person capable of controlling the dog and preventing it from being a nuisance or a danger to other persons.
- 5.2 For the purposes of this paragraph, a **dog on leash area** is any:
- 5.2.1 local government land or public place to which the Council has resolved that this paragraph applies;
  - 5.2.2 park when organised sport is being played; or
  - 5.2.3 wetland area.

### 6. Dog Exercise Areas

- 6.1 Subject to paragraphs 4 and 5, a person may enter any dog exercise area for the purpose of exercising a dog under his or her control.
- 6.2 For the purposes of this paragraph, a **dog exercise area** is any:
- 6.2.1 park; or
  - 6.2.2 local government land that the Council has resolved is a dog exercise area.
- 6.3 A person must ensure that any dog under their control remains under effective control while the dog is in a dog exercise area.

### 7. Limit on Dog Numbers

- 7.1 A person must not, without permission, keep any dog on any premises where the number of dogs on the premises exceeds the prescribed limit.
- 7.2 Subject to subparagraph 7.3, the **prescribed limit** on the number of dogs to be kept on premises:
- 7.2.1 within a township, in a small dwelling, is two dogs;
  - 7.2.2 within a township, other than in a small dwelling, is three dogs;
  - 7.2.3 outside a township is three dogs.
- 7.3 For the purposes of calculating the prescribed limit, the following dogs are to be disregarded:
- 7.3.1 any dog that is under three months of age; and
  - 7.3.2 up to five working livestock dogs kept on premises outside a township.
- 7.4 The prescribed limit does not apply to:
- 7.4.1 an approved kennel establishment;
  - 7.4.2 a veterinary practice;
  - 7.4.3 a pet shop;
  - 7.4.4 any premises that the Council has exempted from the requirements of this paragraph; or
  - 7.4.5 any business involving dogs provided that the business is registered in accordance with the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*.



**Part 3 – Miscellaneous****8. Application**

- 8.1 The Council may from time to time, by resolution, identify local government land as a dog exercise area in accordance with subparagraph 6.2.2 of this by-law.
- 8.2 Any of paragraphs 4 and 5.2.1 of this by-law shall apply only in such portion or portions of the area as the Council may from time to time, by resolution, direct in accordance with Section 246 of the *Local Government Act 1999*.
- 8.3 Where the Council makes a resolution under either of subparagraphs 8.1 or 8.2, the Council's Chief Executive Officer must ensure that:
- 8.3.1 the area is denoted by signs erected by the Council; and
- 8.3.2 information is provided to the public on the Council's website and in any other manner determined by the Council's Chief Executive Officer.

**9. Orders**

- 9.1 If a person engages in conduct that is in contravention of this By-law, an authorised person may order that person:
- 9.1.1 if the conduct is still continuing – to stop the conduct; and
- 9.1.2 whether or not the conduct is still continuing – to take specified action to remedy the contravention.
- 9.2 A person must comply with an order under this clause.
- 9.3 If a person does not comply with an order, the authorised person may take action reasonably required to have the order carried out, and the Council may recover its costs of any action so taken from the person to whom the order was directed.
- 9.4 However, an authorised person may not use force against a person under this clause.

**10. Revocation**

Council's *By-law No. 5 – Dogs*, published in the *Gazette* on 19 July 2012, is revoked on the day on which this by-law comes into operation.

## BY-LAW MADE UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1999

*Foreshore By-law 2019—By-law No. 6 of 2019*

For the management of local government land comprising the beach and foreshore under the control of the Council.

**Part 1 – Preliminary****1. Short Title**

This by-law may be cited as the *Foreshore By-law 2019*.

**2. Commencement**

This by-law will come into operation four months after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette* in accordance with Section 249(5) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.

**3. Definitions**

In this by-law, unless the contrary intention appears:

- 3.1 **authorised person** has the same meaning as in the *Local Government Act 1999*;
- 3.2 **boat** includes a raft, pontoon, jet ski, personal watercraft or any other similar device;
- 3.3 **camp** includes setting up a camp, or causing a tent, caravan or motor home to remain on the foreshore for the purpose of staying overnight, whether or not any person is in attendance or sleeps on the foreshore;
- 3.4 **effective control** means a person exercising effective control of an animal either:
- 3.4.1 by means of a physical restraint; or
- 3.4.2 by command, the animal being in close proximity to the person and the person being able to see the animal at all times;
- 3.5 **foreshore** means the area between the low water mark on the seashore and the nearest boundary of:
- 3.5.1 a road;
- 3.5.2 a section;
- 3.5.3 a public reserve; or
- 3.5.4 land comprised in a land grant, Crown Land or Crown License;
- 3.6 **liquor** has the same meaning as defined in the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*;
- 3.7 **low water mark** means the lowest meteorological tide;
- 3.8 **open public water** means any stream, river, creek or sea within the foreshore;
- 3.9 **vehicle** has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1961*.

**Part 2 – Management of Foreshore****4. Activities Requiring Permission**

A person must not without permission on the foreshore:

- 4.1 **Advertising**  
display any sign for the purpose of commercial advertising other than a moveable sign displayed in accordance with the Council's Moveable Signs By-law 2019;
- 4.2 **Aircraft**  
subject to the *Civil Aviation Act 1988*, land any aircraft on, or take off any aircraft from the foreshore;
- 4.3 **Amplification**  
*use an amplifier or other mechanical or electrical device for the purpose of broadcasting sound, or magnifying sound, to an audience;*
- 4.4 **Attachments**  
attach anything to a tree, plant, equipment, fence, post, structure or fixture on the foreshore;
- 4.5 **Charge Admission**  
charge admission or seek payment for entering any part of the foreshore;
- 4.6 **Fireworks**  
ignite or discharge any fireworks;
- 4.7 **Missiles**  
throw, roll or discharge any stone, substance or missile to the danger of any person or animal thereon;
- 4.8 **Model Aircraft, Boats and Cars**  
fly or operate a model or drone aircraft, boat or model or remote control vehicle in a manner which may cause or be likely to cause injury or discomfort to a person being on or in the vicinity of the foreshore or detract from or be likely to detract from another person's lawful use of and enjoyment of the foreshore;
- 4.9 **Pontoons**  
install or maintain a pontoon or jetty in any open public water;
- 4.10 **Removal of Sand**  
remove, clear or destroy any sand, seaweed, soil, rocks, minerals, vegetation or shells;
- 4.11 **Trading**
- 4.11.1 carry on the business of selling or offering or exposing for sale any goods, merchandise, commodity, article or thing; or
- 4.11.2 set up a van or other vehicle or stall or other structure, tray, carpet or device for the purpose of buying or selling any goods, merchandise, commodity, article or thing;
- 4.12 **Vehicles and Vessels**
- 4.12.1 repair, wash, paint, panel beat or carry out other work to a vehicle, except for running repairs in the case of a breakdown;
- 4.12.2 allow any vehicle, boat, yacht or other seagoing craft to remain stationery on any boat ramp longer than is necessary to launch or retrieve a boat;
- 4.13 **Weddings, Functions and Special Events**
- 4.13.1 hold, conduct or participate in a marriage ceremony, funeral or special event;
- 4.13.2 erect a marquee, stage or structure for the purpose of holding or conducting a wedding, funeral or special event;
- 4.13.3 hold or conduct any filming where the filming is for a commercial purpose.
5. **Activities Requiring Permission in Declared Areas**  
A person must not without permission on any part the foreshore that the Council has resolved that the sub-paragraph applies:
- 5.1 **Alcohol**  
consume or possess or be in charge of any liquor;
- 5.2 **Animals**
- 5.2.1 cause or allow any animal to swim or bathe in any open public water to the inconvenience, annoyance or danger of any other person bathing or swimming; or
- 5.2.2 take, drive or ride any horse, or allow it to remain, on the foreshore or to bathe in any open public water except between the hours of midnight and 9.00am and then only if the horse remains under effective control;
- 5.3 **Bathing**  
swim or bathe in any open public water at a time when swimming or bathing in that place has been prohibited as indicated by a sign or signs displayed on or near the foreshore;
- 5.4 **Boats**  
subject to the provisions of the *Harbors and Navigation Act 1993* and the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law* hire out any boat or otherwise use a boat for commercial purposes from the foreshore;
- 5.5 **Boat Ramps**  
subject to the provisions of the *Harbors and Navigation Act 1993* and the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law*:
- 5.5.1 use or launch a boat or other object from any boat ramp or in any area except where a sign or signs are displayed by the Council requiring the purchase of a permit prior to launch;
- 5.5.2 in respect of a permit issued under sub-paragraph 5.5.1:
- 5.5.2.1 the Council shall prescribe a fee at least once in each financial year for permits to use a boat ramp;

- 5.5.2.2 a permit may be purchased for a fee from the Council or its duly authorised agent, or a ticket vending machine installed and maintained by the Council;
- 5.5.2.3 upon request of an authorised person, any person about to use (unless they have not yet had the opportunity to purchase a ticket) using or having used a boat ramp, must produce a permit purchased prior to the request in compliance with this by-law;
- 5.5.2.4 the Council, or such other person as the Council may authorise by resolution for that purpose, may exempt organisations involved in search and rescue at sea from the requirement to purchase a permit; and
- 5.5.2.5 the Council may, by resolution and the erection of a sign or signs, restrict the use of special areas or boat ramps to either commercial or recreational use, or prohibit their use entirely;
- 5.6 **Camp**  
erect a tent or other structure of calico, canvas, plastic or similar material as a place of habitation for the purposes of camping or remaining for more than 48 hours;
- 5.7 **Fires**  
subject to the *Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005*, light any fire except:
- 5.7.1 in a place provided by the Council for that purpose; or
- 5.7.2 in a portable barbecue, as long as the barbecue is used in an area that is clear of flammable material for a distance of four metres;
- 5.8 **Fishing**  
cast or keep in the water any fishing line, net or trap to catch fish or other water creatures in any area, bridge, pontoon or jetty;
- 5.9 **Vehicles**  
drive or propel a vehicle except on an area of the foreshore set aside by the Council for that purpose and identified by means of signs, devices or fencing.
6. **Prohibited Activities**  
A person must not on the foreshore:
- 6.1 **Annoyances**  
do anything likely to offend or unreasonably interfere with any other person:
- 6.1.1 using the foreshore; or
- 6.1.2 occupying nearby premises,  
by making a noise or creating a disturbance;
- 6.2 **Glass**  
wilfully break glass, china or other brittle material;
- 6.3 **Interference with Permitted Use**  
interrupt, disrupt or interfere with any other person's use of the foreshore for which permission has been granted;
- 6.4 **Sand Dunes, Pebble Dunes, Coastal Slopes and Cliffs**
- 6.4.1 carry out any activity that may damage or threaten the integrity of sand dunes, pebble dunes, coastal slopes or cliffs; or
- 6.4.2 introduce non-indigenous flora or fauna or dump any material in a sand dune or pebble dune; or
- 6.4.3 destroy, remove or cause interference to any vegetation, whether living or dead, on or within a sand dune, coastal slope or coastal cliff;
- 6.5 **Toilets**  
in any public convenience:
- 6.5.1 urinate other than in a urinal or pan or defecate other than in a pan set apart for that purpose;
- 6.5.2 deposit anything in a pan, urinal or drain that is likely to cause a blockage;
- 6.5.3 use it for a purpose for which it was not designed or constructed;
- 6.5.4 enter any toilet set aside for the use of the opposite gender except:
- 6.5.4.1 child under the age of five accompanied by an adult of that gender; and/or
- 6.5.4.2 for the purpose of providing assistance to a disabled person;
- 6.6 **Use of Equipment**  
use any item of equipment and/or facilities or other Council property:
- 6.6.1 other than for the purpose and in the manner for which it was designed or set aside; and
- 6.6.2 where any nearby sign states the conditions of use, except in accordance with those conditions;
- 6.7 **Waste**
- 6.7.1 deposit or leave thereon:
- 6.7.1.1 anything obnoxious or offensive;
- 6.7.1.2 any offal, dead animal, dung or filth; or
- 6.7.1.3 any mineral, mineral waste, industrial waste or by-products;
- 6.7.2 deposit any rubbish other than in receptacles provided by the Council for that purpose;
- 6.7.3 deposit in any receptacle any rubbish emanating from domestic or trade purposes, unless designated by a sign or signs.

**Part 3 – Miscellaneous****7. Orders and Directions**

- 7.1 Every person shall comply with any reasonable direction or request from an authorised person relating to:
- 7.1.1 that person's use of the foreshore;
  - 7.1.2 that person's conduct and behaviour on the foreshore;
  - 7.1.3 that person's safety on the foreshore; and
  - 7.1.4 the safety and enjoyment of the foreshore by other persons.
- 7.2 If a person fails to comply with an order of an authorised person made pursuant to section 262 of the *Local Government Act 1999* in respect of a breach of this by-law, the Council may recover its costs and expenses of any action taken under Section 262(3) of the *Local Government Act 1999* from the person to whom the order was directed.

**8. Removal of Animals and Objects**

If any animal or object is found on any part of the foreshore in breach of a by-law:

- 8.1 any person in charge of the animal or object shall forthwith remove it from that part on the request of an authorised person; and
- 8.2 any authorised person may remove the animal or object if the person fails to comply with the request, or if no person is apparently in charge of the animal or object.

**9. Exemptions**

- 9.1 The restrictions in this by-law do not apply to any Police Officer, Council Officer or employee acting in the course and within the scope of that person's normal duties, or to a contractor while performing work for the Council and while acting under the supervision of a Council Officer, or an emergency worker when performing emergency duties.
- 9.2 The restrictions in paragraphs 4.1, 4.3 and 4.4 of this by-law do not apply to electoral matter:
- 9.2.1 electoral matters authorised by a candidate and which relate to a Commonwealth or State election that occurs during the period commencing at 5:00pm on the day before the issue of the writ or writs for the election and ending at the close of polls on polling day; or
  - 9.2.2 authorised by a candidate and which is related to an election under the Act or the *Local Government (Elections) Act 1999* and occurs during the period commencing four weeks immediately before the date that has been set (either by or under either Act) for polling day and ending at the close of voting on polling day; or
  - 9.2.3 related to, and occurs during the course of and for the purpose of a referendum.

**10. Application of Paragraphs**

Any of sub-paragraphs 4.5, 5.1, 5.2, 5.3, 5.4, 5.5, 5.6, 5.7, 5.8 and 5.9 of this by-law shall apply only in such portion or portions of the foreshore as the Council may be resolution direct in accordance with Section 246(3)(e) of the *Local Government Act 1999*.
