GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) Gaming Control Amendment Regulations 2008

These regulations amend the *Gaming Control Regulations 2004* by revising the schedule of fees prescribed for the purposes of the *Gaming Control Act 1993*.

(2) Proclamation under section 2 of the Monetary Penalties Enforcement Act 2005

This proclamation fixes 28 April 2008 as the day on which the provisions of the Monetary Penalties Enforcement Act 2005 commence.

(3) Proclamation under section 2 of the Monetary Penalties Enforcement (Transitional Arrangements and Consequential Amendments) Act 2007

This proclamation fixes 28 April 2008 as the day on which the *Monetary Penalties Enforcement (Transitional Arrangements and Consequential Amendments) Act 2007* commences.

(4) Sale of Hazardous Goods (Babies' Dummies) Order 2008

This order places restrictions on the sale of babies' dummies.

(5) Sale of Hazardous Goods (Children's Cots) Order 2008

This order places restrictions on the sale of children's cots and replaces the Sale of Hazardous Goods Order 1998.

(6) Sale of Hazardous Goods (Lead in Children's Toys) Order 2008

This order prohibits the sale of children's toys containing more than a specified amount of lead.

(7) Sale of Hazardous Goods (No Holes Tongue Studs) Order 2008

This order prohibits the sale of jewellery commonly known as no holes tongue studs.

(8) Sale of Hazardous Goods (Toothpaste Safety) Order 2008

This order prohibits the sale of toothpaste containing more than a specified level of diethylene glycol.

ENERGY OMBUDSMAN ACT 1998, SECTION 39

PURSUANT to section 39(4)(b) of the *Energy Ombudsman Act 1998* I publish the following Guidelines.

Guidelines Overview

These Guidelines have been prepared in accordance with the *Energy Ombudsman Act* 1998, s 39(1), and will govern the preparation of the annual budget in respect of the costs of administering the *Energy Ombudsman Act* 1998, until they are varied or revoked in accordance with that Act.

1. The Membership Fee

A membership fee is payable by each energy entity, within the meaning of the Act. This fee is \$5000 per entity, subject to the following -

- Where the entity holds more than one licence under the *Electricity Supply Industry Act* 1995, including a presumptive licence under s 4 of the *Electricity Supply Industry Restructuring (Savings and Transitional Provisions) Act* 1995, the entity will pay a membership fee of \$5000 for each licence held.
- Where the entity holds both a licence or licences under the *Electricity Supply Industry Act 1995* and a licence or licences under *Gas Act 2000*, the entity will pay a membership fee of \$5,000 for each licence held.
- For electricity generation entities, a sliding scale depending on the generating capacity of the licence holder applies as follows -

Less than 15 MW \$ 0
 15-30 MW \$ 500
 30-250 MW \$ 2 500
 Over 250 MW \$ 5 000

2. The Complaint Levy

A complaint levy is payable based on the number of complaints or enquiries received by the Ombudsman against an entity during the previous calendar year, as a proportion of the total number of complaints and enquiries received by the Ombudsman during that period.

3. Timing of Costs allocation

Section 39A of the Act provides that the Ombudsman will prepare and publish a budget in respect of the costs of administering the Act before the 31 March in each calendar year in respect of the financial year commencing on the next following 1 July. Once the budget has been approved, the entities will be billed in two sixth monthly tranches in advance. The membership fee will be billed as part of the first bi-yearly invoice.

4. Underspending and overspending

The situation may arise at the end of the financial year, where the Energy Ombudsman has not spent the entire budget, or has spent more than the amount budgeted.

Overspending will only be passed onto the entities if the deficit is adequately explained and it is necessary for the effective operation of the Energy Ombudsman jurisdiction.

Overspending in one financial year will not necessarily result in an increased budget for the following year.

Underspending will be credited to the entities and may lead to a lower budget for the next year.

To accommodate any surplus or deficit in the budget, it will be necessary to adjust the entities' contributions for the following year in proportion to their contributions for the year in which the surplus or deficit arose.
