LIVING MARINE RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1995
PUBLIC NOTICE - DATES OF OPENING AND CLOSING OF THE ROCK
LOBSTER FISHERY AND ABALONE FISHERY RULE 11 OF THE
FISHERIES (ROCK LOBSTER) RULES 2011

Rule 9 of the *Fisheries (Abalone) Rules 2009*

I, WES FORD, Acting Deputy Secretary, Department of
Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment, pursuant to
my delegated power under section 20 (1) of the *Living Marine
Resources Management Act 1995*, in accordance with Rule
11(2) of the *Fisheries (Rock Lobster) Rules 2011* and Rule 9
of the *Fisheries (Abalone) Rules 2009*, hereby determine that:

- (1) the part of the non-commercial rock lobster fishery
comprising of the taking of rock lobster for non-
commercial purposes and recreational purposes in
eastern waters will be closed from 23 November 2012,
inclusive; and
- (2) the part of the non-commercial rock lobster fishery
comprising of activities by way of setting rock
lobster pots, setting rock lobster rings and diving for
taking rock lobster for non-commercial purposes and
recreational purposes in eastern waters will be closed
from 23 November 2012, inclusive; and
- (3) the part of the abalone fishery that relates to
recreational fishing and fishing as part of an
Aboriginal activity comprising of activities by way of
the taking of abalone in eastern waters will be closed
from 23 November 2012, inclusive;

where:

"**eastern waters**" is defined to mean the area of State waters
adjacent to the east coast of Tasmania bounded in the north by
the line of latitude at 41° 1' 0" South and bounded in the south
by the line of latitude at 42° 49' 00" South.

Words and expressions used in this public notice have the
same meaning as in the *Living Marine Resources Management
Act 1995*, the *Fisheries (Rock Lobster) Rules 2011* and the
Fisheries (Abalone) Rules 2009.

delegated power under section 20 (1) of the *Living Marine
Resources Management Act 1995*, in accordance with Rule
9 (a) of the *Fisheries (Giant Crab) Rules 2006*, hereby
determine that:

- (1) the part of the commercial giant crab fishery
comprising of activities by way of setting giant crab
traps and taking male and female giant crab for
commercial purposes in eastern waters will be closed
from 24 November 2012

Where:

"**eastern waters**" is defined to mean the area of State waters
adjacent to the east coast of Tasmania bounded in the north
on the east coast by the line of latitude at 41° 1' 0" South and
bounded in the south on the east coast by an the line of latitude
at 42° 49' 00" South.

Words and expressions used in this public notice have the
same meaning as in the *Living Marine Resources Management
Act 1995* and the *Fisheries (Giant Crab) Rules 2006*.

PUBLIC NOTICE - DATES OF CLOSING OF THE COMMERCIAL DIVE
FISHERY FROM EDDYSTONE POINT TO DEEP GLEN BAY

I, ROBERT GOTT, Director Marine Resources, acting under Rule 12 of the *Fisheries (Commercial Dive) Rules 2011*, and delegated authority under Section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995*, hereby determine that the closed season for the part of the commercial dive fishery which comprises the taking of sea urchins *Heliocidaris erythrogramma* and *Centrostephanus rodgersii* and periwinkles (Genus *Turbo*) from the area on the east coast of Tasmania south of the line of latitude 40° 59' 42.54"S running through Eddystone Point and north of the line of latitude at 42° 58' 12.29"S running through Deep Glen Bay to be from midnight, Saturday 24 November 2012
