RULES PUBLICATION ACT 1953

NOTICE OF THE MAKING OF STATUTORY RULES

IN ACCORDANCE with the provisions of the *Rules Publication Act 1953*, notice is given of the making of the following statutory rules:—

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) Access to Neighbouring Land Regulations 2014

These regulations -

- (a) provide for the substituted service of a notice under section 5(4)(a) of the *Access to Neighbouring Land Act 1992* if the owner of certain land, or other person whose agreement to the entry on the land is required, cannot be found; and
- (b) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Access to Neighbouring Land Regulations 2004* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(2) Crime (Confiscation of Profits) Regulations 2014

These regulations -

- (a) prescribe corresponding laws for certain purposes of the Crime (Confiscation of Profits) Act 1993; and
- (b) declare certain interstate orders, declarations, and other decisions of a court, to be orders for the purposes of that Act; and
- (c) prescribe the notice to be given of an application under section 46(6) of that Act for an order for the return of, or access to, property seized pursuant to a search warrant under that Act; and
- (d) prescribe purposes for which the Treasurer may authorise payments from the Crime (Confiscation of Profits)
 Account; and
- (e) prescribe the maximum value of certain property to be protected from wealth-restraining orders and wealth forfeiture orders under that Act; and
- (f) are made consequentially on the repeal of the Crime (Confiscation of Profits) Regulations 2004 under section 11 of the Subordinate Legislation Act 1992.

(3) Listening Devices Regulations 2014

These regulations -

- (a) prescribe the form of complaint to be used for the purpose of obtaining a warrant authorising the use of a listening device; and
- (b) prescribe the form of that warrant; and
- (c) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Listening Devices Regulations 2004* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(4) State Polices and Projects Regulations 2014

These regulations -

- (a) prescribe the requirements for the advertising of draft State Policies and draft integrated assessment reports; and
- (b) prescribe the requirements for the making, and the content, of certain notices; and
- (c) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *State Policies and Projects Regulations 2004* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.
