RULE 9(3) OF THE FISHERIES (ABALONE) RULES 2009

Pursuant to the powers under the *Fisheries (Abalone) Rules 2009* ("the Rules") that were delegated to the Director (Marine Resources) on 19 August 2015 by the Minister acting pursuant to section 20(1) of the *Living Marine Resources Management Act 1995* ("the Act"), I determine that the dates of closing of State waters of the commercial abalone fishery in State waters around the Furneaux Group of islands to the activities of the take and possession of blacklip abalone (*Haliotis rubra*) are as follows:

from 19 August 2016 to 31 December 2016, inclusive;

where: "**the Furneaux Group of islands**" is defined to mean: those State waters within an area bounded in the east by the line of longitude at 148° 35' 36.2" East, in the west by the line of longitude at 147° 37' 21.9" East, in the north by the line of latitude at 39° 35' 14.9" South, and in the south by the line of latitude at 40° 38' 24.1" South.

For the purpose of this public notice, "**possession**" does not include blacklip abalone on a fishing vessel that is transiting the part of State waters closed to the abalone fishery if the blacklip abalone possessed on the vessel were legally taken from a part of State waters that is open to the abalone fishery and, while the fishing vessel is transiting the part of State waters closed to the abalone fishery, a person does not dive from, or enter the water from, the fishing vessel or any other vessel used from the fishing vessel.

The holder of a fishing licence (abalone dive) can not on a fishing trip enter the water by swimming or diving in both an open and a closed part of the fishery regarding the same species.

Any expression used in this public notice having a particular meaning under the Act or the Rules has the same meaning in this public notice as it has in the Act or the Rules.

GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *Environmental Management and Pollution Control (Noise) Regulations 2016*

These regulations, made under the *Environmental Management and Pollution Control Act 1994*, provide for –

- a) the regulation of the emission of certain noises caused by the operation of domestic and industrial equipment and machines; and
- b) in particular, the regulation of noise caused by –
 - (i) the operation of motor vehicles, motor vessels and machinery near residential premises; and
 - (ii) the operation of chainsaws, lawnmowers and fixed equipment; and
 - (iii) the operation of motor vehicles and motor vessels at racing events, aquatic events and recreational activities; and
- c) certain offences to be offences for which an infringement notice may be issued and served.

(2) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Firearms (Miscellaneous Amendments) Act 2015*

This proclamation fixes 17 August 2016 as the day on which sections 7, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 31, 34, 39, 46, 56, 58, 59 and 62 of the *Firearms (Miscellaneous Amendments) Act 2015* commence.

(3) *Firearms Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2016*

These regulations amend the *Firearms Regulations 2006* by –

- (a) prescribing the methods for a licensed firearm dealer to deal with a firearm surrendered to the licensed firearms dealer under section 109 of the Act; and
- (b) omitting the fee for acting as an agent in the purchase or sale of firearms between licensees.

(4) *Historic Cultural Heritage Regulations 2016*

These regulations –

- (a) prescribe the fees that are payable on applications for certificates under the *Historic Cultural Heritage Act 1995*; and
- (b) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Historic Cultural Heritage Regulations 2006* under the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(5) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Liquor Licensing Amendment Act 2015*

This proclamation fixes 1 September 2016 as the day on which the provisions of the *Liquor Licensing Amendment Act 2015* commence.

(6) *Liquor Licensing Regulations 2016*

These regulations rescind the *Liquor Licensing Regulations 2013* and prescribe –

- (a) interests for the purposes of the definition of best interests of the community; and
- (b) substances as liquor; and
- (c) which producers are small producers; and
- (d) minimum age requirements for the sale and service of liquor on licensed premises and permit premises; and
- (e) certain matters relating to barring orders; and
- (f) persons to whom liquor may be sold under the authority of a club licence; and
- (g) certain matters relating to the provision of wholesale liquor supply information; and
- (h) evidence of age documents; and
- (i) various other matters for the purposes of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1990*.

(7) *Liquor Licensing (Infringement Notices) Amendment Regulations 2016*

These regulations amend the *Liquor Licensing (Infringement Notices) Regulations 2008* by –

- (a) revising the schedule of infringement notice offences consequent on the enactment of the *Liquor Licensing Amendment Act 2015* and the *Liquor Licensing Regulations 2016*; and
- (b) making other minor and consequential amendments.

(8) *Liquor Licensing (Fees) Amendment Regulations 2016*

These regulations amend the *Liquor Licensing (Fees) Regulations 2015* by –

- (a) prescribing the fees payable for –
 - (i) applications to vary conditions on liquor licences or liquor permits; and
 - (ii) small producer's permit applications; and
- (b) revising the fees payable for out-of-hours permit applications.

(9) *Threatened Species Protection Regulations 2016*

These regulations, made under the *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995* –

- (a) provide for –
 - (i) permits for dealing with certain endangered, vulnerable or rare taxa of flora or fauna; and
 - (ii) the keeping and provision of records of those dealings; and
 - (iii) the tagging or marking of listed taxa authorised to be taken under permits; and
 - (iv) other miscellaneous matters for the purposes of that Act; and
- (b) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Threatened Species Protection Regulations 2006* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(10) *Workers' (Occupational Diseases) Relief Fund Regulations 2016*

These regulations –

- (a) prescribe certain application processes for the purposes of the *Workers' (Occupational Diseases) Relief Fund Act 1954*; and
- (b) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Workers' (Occupational Diseases) Relief Fund Regulations 2006* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

1. Short title

These by-laws may be cited as the *Marine and Safety (Motor Boats and Licences) Amendment By-laws 2016*.

3. Principal By-laws
