GENERAL PURPORT OR EFFECT OF THE ABOVEMENTIONED STATUTORY RULES

(1) *State Service (Restructuring) Order 2018*

This order –

- (a) amalgamates the Agency, called the Tasmanian Health Service, with the Department of Health and Human Services; and
- (b) establishes the Department of Communities Tasmania; and
- (c) amalgamates, with the Department of Communities Tasmania, parts of the Department of Health and Human Services and parts of the Department of Premier and Cabinet; and
- (d) renames, as the Department of Health, the Department of Health and Human Services.

(2) *State Service (Agencies and Heads of Agencies) Order 2018*

This order substitutes a new Schedule 1 for Schedule 1 to the *State Service Act 2000*.

(3) *Administrative Arrangements Amendment Order (No. 2) 2018*

This order amends the *Administrative Arrangements Order 2018* so as to allocate, between the Department of Health and the Department of Communities Tasmania, responsibility for the administration of various Acts and so as to allocate between the Minister for Environment and the Minister for Primary Industries and Water, various provisions of the *Nature Conservation Act 2002*.

(4) *Administrative Arrangements (Removal of Inconsistency) Order 2018*

This order amends the *Community Protection (Offender Reporting) Act 2005* and the *Community Protection (Offender Reporting) Regulations 2016* so as to replace certain references that are inconsistent with administrative arrangements made under the *Administrative Arrangements Act 1990*.

(5) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Court Security Act 2017*

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2018 as the day on which the *Court Security Act 2017* commences.

(6) *Court Security Regulations 2018*

These regulations prescribe, for the purposes of the *Court Security Act 2017* –

- (a) specified tribunals and boards as falling within the scope of the Act; and
- (b) circumstances where a person may be in possession of a controlled substance on court premises.

(7) *Dog Control Amendment Regulations 2018*

These regulations amend the *Dog Control Regulations 2010* by updating the schedule of offences under the Act in respect of which infringement notices may be issued.

(8) *Health (Fees) Amendment Regulations 2018*

These regulations amend the *Health (Fees) Regulations 2017* by increasing certain fees that may be charged in respect of dental services and non-nursing-home-type patients.

(9) *Legal Profession (Prescribed Authorities) Regulations 2018*

These regulations –

- (a) prescribe the Law Society of Tasmania as the prescribed authority for the purposes of certain provisions of the *Legal Profession Act 2007*; and
- (b) prescribe the Legal Profession Board of Tasmania as the prescribed authority for the purposes of certain provisions of the *Legal Profession Act 2007*; and
- (c) are made consequentially on the repeal of the *Legal Profession (Prescribed Authorities) Regulations 2008* under section 11 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1992*.

(10) Proclamation under section 2 of the *Limitation Amendment Act 2017*

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2018 as the day on which the *Limitation Amendment Act 2017* commences.

(11) Proclamation under section 2(2) of the *Local Government Amendment (Targeted Review) Act 2017*

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2018 as the day on which the *Sentencing Amendment (Sentences of Imprisonment) Act 2017* commences.

This proclamation fixes 1 July 2018 as the day on which the provisions of the *Tasmanian Health Service Act 2018* commence.

(17) *Tasmanian Health Service Regulations 2018*
