Public Transport Competition Regulations 1998

In accordance with the provisions of Section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**, notice is given of the availability for public comment of the proposed Public Transport Competition Regulations 1998 and Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS).

Section 38 (1) of the **Public Transport Competition Act 1995** authorises the making of the proposed regulations, which are new regulations.

The objective of the proposed regulations is to regulate the accreditation of road transport passenger services; and service contracts for the operation of regular passenger services. The proposed regulations apply to buses with more than twelve (12) seats including the driver. The types of bus operation covered by the proposed regulations are regular passenger services (includes public route, school contract and long distance services) and tour and charter services.

The proposed regulations prescribe certain procedures and standards required by the **Public Transport Competition Act 1995** in order for the Act to become operational.

The RIS has been prepared to identify the likely impact of the proposed regulations, assess their costs and benefits and consider alternative methods of achieving the identified objectives. The RIS concludes that the overall benefits to the community outweigh the costs imposed by the proposed regulations.

The RIS has been prepared in consultation with Bus Association Victoria, VicRoads, NSW Department of Transport and the National Road Transport Commission.

Public submissions on the proposed regulations and the RIS are invited. PROPOSED PSYCHOLOGISTS REGISTRATION (FEES) REGULATIONS 1998

Notice of Decision

I, Rob Knowles, Minister for Health, give notice under section 12 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994** that the proposed Psychologists Registration (Fees) Regulations 1998 have been the subject of a regulatory impact statement.

Public comments and submissions were invited as required by section 11(1) of the Act and submissions received have been considered as required by section 11(3) of the Act.

I have decided that the proposed Psychologists Registration (Fees) Regulations 1998 should be made with amendments. The amendments will ensure that the proposed increase in certain fees payable to the Psychologists Registration Board of Victoria will apply only up to 31 March 2000 and then revert to their pre-existing levels.

GLEN EIRA PLANNING SCHEME

Notice of Approval of Amendment

Amendment L32
