- The MPA are currently training 65 apprentices of whom 6 are female. Holmesglenn TAFE is a major provider of training apprentices, they are currently training 100 male apprentices and five female apprentices of which 3 are employed by the applicant.
- The applicant's customers prefer women to work in their homes for the following reasons:
 - (a) Women at home and single women feel safer — they perceive they will not be physically threatened or sexually harassed by female painters and decorators.
 - (b) Many elderly ladies feel more comfortable with female painters as do parents of daughters who will be at home whilst the work is done.
 - (c) Mothers of young children have expressed feeling more comfortable with women around their home and their children, that female painters will be more careful with regards to the children's safety during work.
 - (d) The clientele of the applicant include single women, married couples and gay couples. Gay men prefer female tradespeople as they perceive women will not comment

on their sexuality or threaten them in any way.

- (e) Other clients want to give women a go as there are very few women in the trade.
- The employment by the applicant of female tradespeople will help to redress an imbalance in the proportion of males and females employed in the Australian Painting and Decorating industry and will provide a possible role model to encourage other women to enter an occupation currently perceived as one not usually taken up by women.



Regulatory Impact Statement

The Minister for Planning and Local Government, the Honourable Robert Maclellan, has approved the publication of a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) prepared for the Plumbing Standards Regulations 1998 (the proposed regulations) under section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**.

Section 221ZZZV of the **Building Act 1993** authorises the making of the proposed regulations. The proposed regulations revoke the Victoria Water Supply and Sewerage Plumbing Regulations 1988.

The primary objects of the proposed regulations are to safeguard public health, safety and welfare of the community and to safeguard and maintain the integrity of water systems and sanitary systems in relation to plumbing work carried out from the reticulation connection point. Subsidiary objects include updating existing plumbing standards and to provide uniformity of national standards.

The proposed regulations prescribe new performance standards and current technical standards under the AS 3500 published by Standards Australia relating to water supply, sanitary waste disposal, and hot water supply, with some modifications. The proposed regulations also provide for standards relating to discharge from evaporative coolers.

The RIS presents an assessment of the costs and benefits of the proposed regulations and examines alternatives to the proposals. The RIS concludes that the overall benefits outweigh the costs imposed by the regulations.







Fisheries (Declaration of Point Cook Fisheries Reserve) Order 1998

The Governor in Council makes the following Order:

1. Title

This Order may be cited as the Fisheries (Declaration of Point Cook Fisheries Reserve) Order 1998.

2. Authorising provisions

This Order is made under sections 88 and 89 of the **Fisheries Act 1995**.

3. Objectives

The objectives of this Order are -

- (a) to declare the Point Cook Fisheries Reserve and specify its purposes; and
- (b) to provide for -
 - (i) the prohibition and regulation of certain fishing activities, the use of certain equipment and other activities in the reserve; and
 - (ii) the issue of permits by the Secretary.

4. Commencement

This Order commences on 30 April 1998.

5. Definitions

In this Order-

"commercial fishing equipment" has the same meaning as in the Fisheries Act 1995;

"reserve" means the Point Cook Fisheries Reserve established under clause 6.

6. Declaration of Point Cook Fisheries Reserve

The area described in the Schedule is declared to be the Point Cook Fisheries Reserve.

7. Purposes of Point Cook Fisheries Reserve

The purposes of the Point Cook Fisheries Reserve are -

- (a) to provide for -
 - (i) the harvesting of; and
 - (ii) the management of; and
 - (iii) the monitoring of; and
 - (iv) the habitat protection of; and
 - (v) the education in relation to; and
 - (vi) the scientific uses of; and
 - (vii) research into;
 - (viii) non-consumptive uses of fish and protected aquatic biota in the reserve; and
- (b) to protect and conserve the ecosystems of the fish and protected aquatic biota in the reserve and to maintain the aquatic ecological processes of the reserve.

8. Provisions relating to fishing and use of equipment in certain areas of the fisheries reserve

- (1) A person must not take, interfere with or attempt to take, or cause or permit to be taken or interfered with, any flora or fauna of the area in the reserve -
 - (a) indicated by vertical hatching on the Schedule, being the area within 200 metres of highwater mark on the shoreward boundary; and
 - (b) indicated by horizontal hatching on the Schedule, being the area seaward of 200 metres from highwater mark on the shoreward boundary.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

(2) A person must not possess, use or attempt to use any firearm, spear-gun, fishing net or commercial fishing equipment in the reserve.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

- (3) Despite sub-clauses (1) and (2) -
 - (a) a person may, in the area of the reserve referred to in sub-clause (1)(b), take or attempt to take fish if he or she uses a fishing line with not more than two hooks attached; and
 - (b) the holder of a current abalone

licence issued under Part III of the **Fisheries Act 1968** or an Abalone Fishery Access Licence issued under the **Fisheries Act 1995** may, in the area of the reserve referred to in sub-clause (1)(b), take or attempt to take abalone in accordance with the relevant Act and Regulations under that Act.

9. Provisions relating to other activities in the fisheries reserve

(1) A person must not, in the reserve, operate a boat, aircraft or other vehicle in a manner likely to cause damage to any flora or fauna.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

(2) A person must not, disturb, cause to be disturbed, remove or cause to be removed from the reserve any ballast, stone, rock, shingle, gravel, sand, boulders, clay, earth, silt, mud or other material.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

(3) A person must not discharge, or cause to be discharged, into the reserve any matter which is, or may become, deleterious to the flora or fauna in the reserve.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.

(4) A person must not deposit or release any rubbish or refuse into the reserve.

Penalty: 20 penalty units.
