- to immediately cease the use of natural gas;
 - to turn off all natural gas appliances and meters; and
 - not turn on any gas meter; and
- (ii) ENERGY 21 PTY LTD, KINETIK ENERGY PTY LTD, IKON ENERGY PTY LTD, STRATUS NETWORKS PTY LTD, MULTINET GAS PTY LTD, WESTAR PTY LTD, GASCOR and TRANSMISSION PIPELINES AUSTRALIA PTY LTD, CFA, and STATE EMERGENCY SERVICES, VICTORIA POLICE and their servants, agents and persons authorised to act on their behalf, to stop the flow of natural gas to all consumers of natural gas in Victoria (other than hospitals, aged and infirm residential institutions and laundries servicing these institutions as specified in the Attachment marked "A") and to do any matters or things in connection with, or incidental to, stopping the flow of gas to all such consumers (other than hospitals, aged and infirm residential institutions and laundries servicing these institutions as specified in the Attachment marked "A") including entering any land building or structure.

To ensure the safe and sure supply of gas, I, DAVID KNIPE, Chief Executive Officer of VICTORIAN ENERGY NETWORKS CORPORATION pursuant to an instrument of delegation of 25 September 1998 from Alan R Stockdale being the Minister responsible for the **Gas Industry Act 1994**, (the Act) in the exercise of powers under Section 62G of the Act **DIRECT TRANSMISSION PIPELINES AUSTRALIA PTY LTD (TPA)** to relocate as soon as possible Solar Saturn Compressor Unit No. 4 with appropriate ancillary equipment from Brooklyn Compressor Station Site to the Euroa Compressor Site owned by TPA to maximise gas flows southwards from New South Wales.

This Direction takes effect at and from 10:30 p.m. on 26 September 1998.

Gas Industry Act 1994

I, the Hon. Alan Stockdale, MP, Treasurer, acting under section 62G of the **Gas Industry Act 1994**, direct the persons who transmit, distribute and supply ("the suppliers") liquefied petroleum gas ("LPG") in the State of Victoria to comply with the terms and conditions specified below relating to the distribution, supply and sale of LPG.

This direction operates from 2 p.m. on 26 September 1998.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- Suppliers of LPG must not transport LPG outside of Victoria without my express written permission.
- Suppliers of LPG must give preference to the supply of LPG for the purposes of emergency services (including police, fire and ambulance emergency vehicles, hospitals and nursing homes) at all times. Emergency services are exempt from the conditions specified in paragraph 4 below.
- Suppliers of LPG must ensure that sufficient supplies of LPG are maintained for emergency purposes (including hospitals and nursing homes) for a period of 14 days at any time.
- LPG must not be sold or supplied from any service station during the period of operation of this direction unless the following conditions are complied with:
 - the sale or supply of LPG to any person at any time must not exceed in value \$20;
 - subject to paragraph (d), LPG must only be sold or supplied on even numbered days of the month to motor vehicles on which the last numeral of the number plate is an even number;
 - subject to paragraph (d), LPG must only be sold or supplied on odd numbered days of the month to motor vehicles on which the last numeral on the number plate is an odd number or to motor vehicles on which there is no numeral on the number plate;
 - if the day of the month is the 31st day of that month, LPG must only be sold or supplied;

- (i) until midday on that day, to motor vehicles on which the last numeral on the number plate is an odd number or to motor vehicles on which there is no numeral on the number plate; and
- (ii) from midday on that day, to motor vehicles on which the last numeral of the number plate is an even number;
- (e) LPG must only be supplied into a gas bottle with a capacity not exceeding 9 kilograms or the fuel tank fitted to a registered road vehicle;
- (f) the sale or supply of LPG is exempted from the restrictions of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) above if the vehicle is a taxi or hire car licensed by the Victorian Taxation Director or is a commercial passenger vehicle as defined in section 87 of the **Transport Act 1983**;
- (g) the sale or supply of LPG is also exempted from the restrictions of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) above where the person seeking supply produces to the supplier or to any uniformed member of the police force present at the service station, a written statement signed by a member of the police force for the time being in charge of a police station to the effect that the person concerned has satisfied that member of the police force that, in connection with essential uses, the person has a special immediate and urgent need justifying the supply to him or her, if available, LPG during the period in respect of which this direction operates; and
- (h) subject to the terms and conditions in this direction, LPG must be available for sale or supply to any person without discrimination.
