ORDER OF YARRA RANGES SHIRE COUNCIL
Section 26(2)

Domestic (Feral & Nuisance) Animals Act 1994

1. Dogs must be under effective control. The owner or responsible person in charge of any dog must keep the dog on a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5m in length, held or secured by the owner or responsible person, when the dog is in any public place or Council reserve not designated as an off-lead area.
2. A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in a designated "off-lead" reserve, if the owner:
 - carries a chain, cord or leash, not exceeding 1.5m in length sufficient to bring the dog under effective control; and
 - remains in effective hand or voice control of the dog so as to be able to promptly place the dog on a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5m in length if that becomes necessary; and
 - does not allow the dog to worry, threaten, rush or attach another person or animal.
3. If a dog is being exercised in a designated "off-lead" reserve, the dog can be brought under effective control by the owner or person responsible for the dog by means of a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5m in length, if the dog roams or is likely to roam to within 20 metres of:
 - a children's play equipment area;
 - a permanent BBQ or picnic area;
 - all sporting ovals.
4. Meaning of word
In this Order
Owner has the same meaning as in the **Domestic (Feral & Nuisance) Animals Act 1994**.
5. Council designates the areas in Schedule a where dogs are permitted to be exercised off-lead.
6. Council designates the areas in Schedule B where dogs and cats are prohibited at all times.
7. This order is not applicable to public lands owned/managed by Parks Victoria or Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

Subordinate Legislation Act 1994 REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT Liquor Control Reform Regulations 1999

Notice is given in accordance with section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994** that a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) has been prepared in relation to the proposed Liquor Control Reform Regulations 1999.

The **Liquor Control Reform Act 1998** introduced reforms to the system of liquor licensing. The proposed regulations support the implementation of the Act.

Part 1: Preliminary of the proposed regulations sets out objectives, authorising provisions, commencement details and definitions.

Part 2: Prescribed Substances of the proposed regulations mirrors the Liquor Control (Prescribed Substances) Regulations 1997 that were made under the **Liquor Control Act 1987**. Those regulations were the subject of a previous RIS in 1997.

The proposed regulations in respect of prescribed substances provide that for the purposes of the definition of "liquor" in section 3 of the **Liquor Control Reform Act 1998** (the Reform Act), an alcohol-based food essence is liquor if it is supplied at retail level and packaged -

- (a) in the case of vanilla essence (whether natural or imitation), in a container of more than 100 millilitres capacity; and
- (b) in any other case, in a container of more than 50 millilitres capacity.

A retailer must obtain a liquor licence and be subject to the requirements of the Reform Act in order to supply alcohol-based food essences that are subject to the proposed regulations.

The reason for the making of the proposed regulations is that certain alcohol-based food essences are packaged in sizes that are conducive to their use as a intoxicant. The Victoria Police have reported persons under 18 years of age consuming such substances and becoming seriously intoxicated.

The initial RIS of 1997 under the **Liquor Control Act 1987** found that the then proposed regulations would achieve the objective of restricting the retail availability of specified alcohol-based food essences that are conducive to misuse and abuse by youth under 18 years of age, whilst imposing a relatively small cost on retailers who may wish to sell such essences.

Part 2 of the proposed regulations has the same objective as that of the Liquor Control (Prescribed Substances) Regulations 1997 and the RIS made in 1997 remains applicable to Parts 1 and 2 of the proposed regulations.

Part 3: Particulars and Information for Applications of the proposed regulations sets out the particulars to be included in an application to the Director of Liquor Licensing for the grant, transfer, relocation or variation of a liquor licence or permit and prescribes the information which is to accompany such applications.

The objective of Part 3 is to enable the Director of Liquor Licensing to appropriately determine licence and licence-related applications at the lowest practical cost to the applicant.

The RIS found that the proposed particulars and information are the minimum necessary to enable the Director of Liquor Licensing to determine applications. They represent the least cost alternative and provide for a responsible and flexible approach in dealing with applications.

Part 4: Licence Fees of the proposed regulations sets out the fees to be charged for the grant, transfer, relocation, variation and renewal of liquor licences and BYO permits and other matters as provided for under the **Liquor Control Reform Act 1998**.

The objectives of part 4 of the proposed regulations are:

- to recover the costs of administering the licensing regime;
- to ensure that the pattern and distribution of fees reflects the fact that certain licensed activities have a greater potential to impact on the amenity of the area and to impose greater enforcement requirements than others; and
- to minimise costs to both existing and potential licensees and permittees.

The RIS found that the proposed fee structure set out under Part 4 of the proposed regulations is appropriate in that it achieves full cost recovery, conforms to the user-pays principle, passes on to licensees the reduced costs of the licensing process and preserves the relativities of the previous fee regime which provides disincentives for certain trading hours which may impose greater social costs. The proposed regulations represent the most effective means of achieving the objectives and promote the efficient use of public sector resources.

Part 5: Licensing Polls of the proposed regulations mirrors the Liquor Control (Licensing Polls) Regulations 1989 made under the **Liquor Control Act 1987**.

The "dry area" is bounded by Burke Road, Koonung Creek, Gardiner's Creek, Warrigal Road, Riversdale Road (and extension) and Middleborough Road. It covers much of the suburbs of Balwyn, Box Hill, Canterbury, Mont Albert and Surrey Hills which now come within the municipalities of Boroondara and Nunawading.

The **Liquor Control Reform Act 1998** provides for two types of polls of affected residents to be conducted in respect of the "dry area":

- polls of residents in proximity to premises seeking to be licensed; and
- polls of affected residents conducted by relevant councils to determine whether the residents wish the "dry area" provisions of the **Liquor Control Reform Act 1998** to be amended, abolished or retained.

The objective of Part 5 of the proposed regulations is to give effect to the dry area provisions of the **Liquor Control Reform Act 1998** by providing for the conduct of polls of residents in proximity to premises seeking to be licensed. Polls to determine whether the "dry area" provisions should be amended, abolished or retained are conducted pursuant to the **Local Government Act 1989** and are not subject to the proposed regulations.

The RIS found that the **Liquor Control Reform Act 1998** is specific regarding the mechanisms to be used and the proposed regulations represent the most effective means of complying with the legislative requirements of the Act.

The Panel determined in accordance with Section 50(2)(g) of the **Medical Practice Act 1994** to suspend the medical registration of Dr Donald Bruce Seymour Murray for a period of six (6) months effective from 31 December 1998.

Further in accordance with Section 50(2)(e) of the **Medical Practice Act 1994** the Panel imposed the following conditions on the registration of Dr Donald Bruce Seymour Murray:

- (i) That on return to medical practice, after completion of his period of suspension, he restricts his practice of medicine to a group practice; specifically there must be another doctor present in the practice in all routine working hours and that Dr Murray be not permitted to undertake unsupervised practice of any type, including after hours deputising (locum) work.
- (ii) That prior to a return to medical practice, he provides to the Medical Practitioners Board of the following reports:
 - (a) A report from a physician, approved by the Board, attesting to the good physical health of Dr Murray,
 - (b) A report from a psychiatrist, approved by the Board, attesting to the good mental health of Dr Murray and assessing the propensity of Dr Murray to offend in the future in regard to sexual boundary violations.
- (iii) That after return to medical practice, Dr Murray continue to attend a psychiatrist, approved by the Board, at intervals prescribed by the Board, with reports of the psychiatrist to be made available to the Board.

Any application to review these ongoing conditions are to be made to the Board.

Finally, in accordance with Section 50(2)(d) of the **Medical Practice Act 1994**, the Panel

requires that Dr Donald Bruce Seymour Murray undertake an appropriate course of study or instruction, approved in advance by the Medical Practitioners Board, about sexual boundary issues in medical practice. This education is to take place prior to the completion of his period of suspension from the register.

FROM THE PROVISIONS REGULATING
BODY ARMOUR

The Governor in Council acting under section 8A(2) of the **Control of Weapons Act 1990** and section 41A of the **Interpretation of Legislation Act 1984** and all enabling powers hereby makes the following order exempting the following persons from the operation of section 8A(1) of the **Control of Weapons Act 1990**.

1. (1) A person bringing into Victoria, causing to be brought into Victoria, possessing, or using body armour which was acquired by that person prior to 16 December 1997 for the purpose of:-
 - (a) any lawful employment duty or activity; or
 - (b) participation in any lawful sport or recreation; or
 - (c) the legitimate collection or display or exhibition of body armour.
- (2) The exemption in sub-clause (1) expires on 31 March 1999.
- (3) An exemption granted under sub-clause (1) (c) is subject to the condition that the body armour is stored in a safe and secure manner.
2. (1) A person purchasing, bringing into Victoria, causing to be brought into Victoria, possessing, or using body armour for the purpose of:-

- (a) any lawful employment, duty or activity; or
 - (b) participation in any lawful sport or recreation; or
 - (c) the legitimate collection or display or exhibition of body armour other than for the purpose of protection against the effects of any firearm.
- (2) An exemption granted under sub-clause (1) (c) is subject to the condition that the body armour is stored in a safe and secure manner.
3. (1) A person purchasing, bringing into Victoria, causing to be brought into Victoria, possessing, or using body armour which is designed, intended or adapted for the purpose of protecting the body from the effects of any firearm within the meaning of section 3(1) of the **Firearm Act 1996** for the purpose of participation in any lawful sport or recreation.
- (2) An exemption granted under sub-clause (1) is subject to the condition that the body armour is stored in a safe and secure manner when not in use.
4. Any person belonging to one of the following classes of people:-
- (a) members of the police force, police recruits, employees in the Office of the Chief Commissioner of Police or protective service officers; or
 - (b) members of the naval, military or air forces of the Commonwealth; or
 - (c) members of the police force of the Commonwealth or any other Territory or State of the Commonwealth; or
 - (d) prison officers (within the meaning of the **Corrections Act 1986**) or authorised persons under section 9A of the **Corrections Act 1986**.

- (f) bringing body armour into Victoria for their official duties; or

Upon reading the material submitted in support of the application and upon hearing submissions from Ms Tracey Carlin on behalf of the applicant and for the Reasons for Decision given by the Tribunal on 5 January 1999, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from Sections 42, 100 and 195 of the Act to enable the applicant to advertise its beauty salon service as catering specially for clients accompanied by children at times specified in the advertisement.

The Tribunal hereby grants an exemption to the applicant from the operation of Sections 42, 100 and 195 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 1995** to enable the applicant to advertise its beauty salon service as catering specially for clients accompanied by children at times specified in the advertisement. This exemption does not authorise the applicant to exclude from the premises upon which its service is provided -

- (a) clients who attend accompanied by children at times when the service does not indicate in its advertisements that it caters especially for clients accompanied by children; or
- (b) clients who attend unaccompanied by children at times when the service indicates in its advertisements that it caters specially for clients accompanied by children.

This exemption is to remain in force from the date on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 6 January 2002.
