 - 2) using receptacles provided by the Council,
 - 3) maintaining receptacles,
 - 4) specifying prohibited wastes,
 - 5) specifying placement of receptacles, and
 - 6) specifying correct closure of the receptacle lid.

Proposed Local Law

The Council proposes to make a new local law – Council Local Law No. 6. The purpose and general purport of the Local Law is to:

- (a) control and protect public places, Council land and reserves;
- (b) control matters which may adversely affect amenity and the quality of life of persons;
- (c) provide for a safe and healthy environment;
- (d) provide for, controlling and managing the use of premises and vehicles;

- (e) control:
- (i) the sale of goods and services in various locations; and
 - (ii) the activities of street vendors and traders;
- (f) control activities on roads including:
- (i) trading;
 - (ii) placing of goods, advertising signs and equipment;
 - (iii) repairs to vehicles;
 - (iv) processions, street festivals, street parties and busking;
- (g) provide for the physical features of roads and adjacent premises to be managed for the safety and convenience of people using them;
- (h) provide for controlling and managing traffic and the use of roads and premises by persons, animals and vehicles;
- (i) control:
- (i) behaviour on roads, public places and Council land;
 - (ii) the numbering of premises;
 - (iii) the placement of things on roads;
 - (iv) obstructions;
 - (v) the use, construction, repair and removal of vehicle crossings and temporary vehicle crossings;
 - (vi) the removal and impounding of vehicles and other things; and
 - (vii) recycling and bulk collection bins;
- (j) limit the use of public places by a certain class of vehicle;
- (k) control:
- (i) incinerators and fires in the open;
 - (ii) amenity, condition and use of premises;
 - (iii) motorised vehicles;
 - (iv) advertising and bill posting;
 - (v) camping;
 - (vi) animals including livestock;
 - (vii) drainage;
 - (viii) noise;
 - (ix) the places and times at which alcoholic beverages may or may not be consumed, and
- (x) smoking in specified circumstances and places.
- (l) maintain at all times a clean and sanitary condition in the municipal district;
- (m) have environment control, protection and conservation; and
- (n) generally maintain the peace, order and good government of the municipal district.
- The proposed Local Law will:
- repeal existing Local Laws 2, 3, 4, & 5 but many provisions of these local laws are repeated.
 - not apply to persons engaged in statutory duties or certain activities for public bodies.
 - introduce definitions for various terms and procedures for application of the Local Law including permits for activities, impounding of items, fees and declaration of areas where an activity might be limited or banned.
 - provide for enforcement by issue of notices to comply and infringement notices, establishing penalties, giving direction and acting in urgent circumstances.
 - deal with the use of reserves and Council land.
 - prescribe that property must not become dangerous to life or property, or unsightly, that incinerators and open fires are controlled, burning of offensive material is prohibited.
 - control use of property for camping, habitation, storage, placing of advertising material, damage by trees, pests, sanitary facilities and litter on building sites.
 - limit the number of animals and birds and prescribe conditions under which they may be kept.
 - deal with the transportation of waste, use of tips, pick up and disposal of domestic and trade waste.
 - control the use of clothing bins and bulk rubbish containers, games and entertainment, protrusions and overhanging vegetation, property numbers, construction of vehicle crossings, drainage connections, obstructions and naturestrips on roads.
 - provide for control of livestock on roads, use of shopping trolleys, toy vehicles, horses, parking of large vehicles, abandoned

vehicles, vehicle noise, sale and repair of vehicles on roads, Council land, reserves or public places.

- control outdoor eating facilities, street furniture, offensive substances, street parties, festivals and processions on roads.

- allow for control of alcohol consumption and smoking in places declared for these purposes.

The proposed Local Law is designed to address National Competition Policy agreements and while it may contain controls which are seen as affecting competition, these are necessary to meet the objectives of the Local Law and address public safety, amenity, environmental and health issues.

This Local Law, which will come into operation on 1 July 1999, is for the purpose of:-

- (a) promoting a vibrant street life which balances the interests and needs of residents, ratepayers and visitors to the City;
- (b) regulating and controlling footpath activities to achieve fairness and consistency between traders in the use of footpaths;
- (c) regulating and controlling footpath activities so that there is:
 - safe and unobstructed passage for pedestrians, in particular, those who may be physically or visually impaired;
 - safe and unobstructed vision for drivers of vehicles and cyclists; and
 - limited impacts on the residential amenity and the streetscape that characterises the area; and
- (d) promoting a safe physical and social environment in which the potential for nuisance activities and risk and exposure to risk by footpath users is minimised.

The general purport of the Local Law No. 7 includes specification of the form of regulation with a view to achieving the stated objectives and in particular provides for:-

- (a) the uses of the footpath which require a permit from the Council, namely location of:
 - tables and chairs and ancillary equipment for kerbside dining;
 - display of goods;
 - advertising signs; and
 - special events;
- (b) the factors considered by Council in granting a permit;

- (c) displaying of permits; and
- (d) the authority of Council to make guidelines for the use of footpaths for any activities described in (a) above.

Owners Obligations

A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in a Designated Reserve, if the Owner:

- carries a chain, cord or leash sufficient to bring the dog under effective control if the dog behaves in a manner which threatens any person or animal;
- remains in effective voice or hand control of the dog so as to be able to promptly bring the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash if that becomes necessary; and
- does not allow the dog to worry or threaten any person or animal.

If a dog is off a chain, cord or leash in a Designated Reserve, the dog must be brought under the effective control of the Owner by means of a cord, chain or leash if the dog is within 30 metres of:

- the principal location of an organised sporting event;
- the principal location of an organised public meeting; or
- a permanent barbecue or picnic area when in use.

Dogs are prohibited within the immediate perimeter of any playground at all times, and must further be on a cord, chain or leash if within ten (10) metres of the perimeter of a playground in a Designated Reserve at all times.

Public Amenity Local Law (Local Law No. 1)

The Docklands Authority has made a Local Law, in anticipation of section 4 of the **Local Government (Governance and Melton) Act 1998** coming into operation. The Local law is authorised by section 35D of the **Docklands Authority Act 1991** and section 13 of the **Interpretation of Legislation Act 1984**.

The Local Law is known as the "Public Amenity Local Law", and is Local Law No. 1 of the Docklands Authority. It will commence operation on 1 July 1999.

Its purpose is to

1. promote a physical and social environment free from hazards to health, in which residents of and visitors to the docklands

area could enjoy a quality of life that meets the general expectations of the community; and

2. protect and promote access, safety and amenity in public places within the docklands area.

The Local Law

- creates an offence for a person to commit a nuisance in a Municipal Place
- creates an offence for a person to engage in specified conduct within a Reserve
- creates an offence for a person without a permit or licence to do specified things in relation to drains or sewers vested in the Docklands Authority
- create an offence for a person without a permit or licence to do specified things in relation to other assets (including watercourses, bridges, culverts and fences) vested in or under the control of the Docklands Authority
- creates an offence for a person who does not have a permit or licence to commence building works without constructing a permanent vehicle crossing, and consequential offences for a person who fails to do specified things in relation to works associated with a vehicle crossing
- creates an offence for a person who does not have a permit or licence to do specified things in relation to land vested in or under the control of the Docklands Authority
- creates an offence for an owner or occupier of land to keep that land in a manner which is unsightly, otherwise detrimental to the area in which it is located, a haven for vermin or noxious weeds or otherwise dangerous
- creates an offence for an owner or occupier of vacant land to keep the land unfenced if the Authority or an authorised officer has directed that fencing be erected
- creates an offence for a person without a permit or licence to occupy, or place or cause to be placed for the purpose of occupation, caravans, tents or like structures on specified land for a period longer than three weeks in any calendar year

- creates an offence for an owner or occupier of land to permit a tree, shrub, hedge, sign or other object on land to overhand a road at a specified height, encroach upon an adjacent road or land vested in or under the control of the Authority, or otherwise constitute a hazard or danger or compromise the safe and convenient use of a road
- creates an offence for a person to leave the engine of a heavy motor vehicle running while the motor vehicle is stationary for a specified time, or do specified things in relation to refrigeration units mounted on motor vehicles or the collection or delivery of goods for the provision of services in or next to a residential area before specified times on specified days
- creates an offence for an owner or occupier of land to do specified things in relation to an intruder alarm which emits specified noise
- creates an offence for a person to apply a name to a road without the approval of the Docklands Authority
- creates an offence for a person to leave a shopping trolley on a road or vacant land, or in a public place, other than in an area designated for the leaving of shopping trolleys
- creates an offence for a person without a permit or licence to conduct a circus, carnival, festival or like event on land
- creates an offence for a person to do specified things in relation to a fire in the open air
- creates an offence for a person to do specified things relating to an incinerator on land
- create an offence for a person to do specified things relating to burning of substances, and creates a consequential offence for a person to fail to extinguish a fire upon being directed to do so by a specified person
