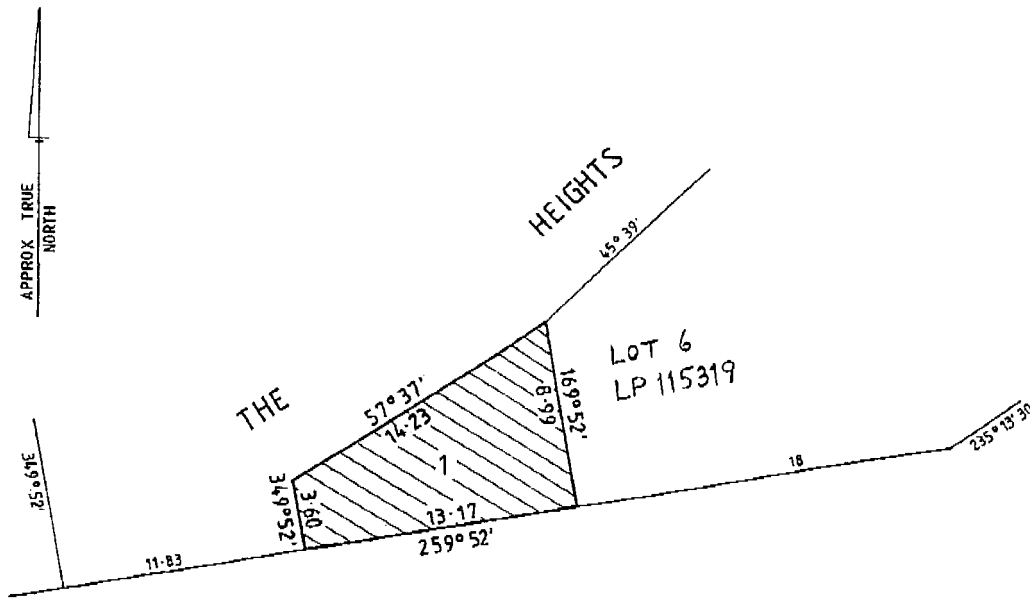

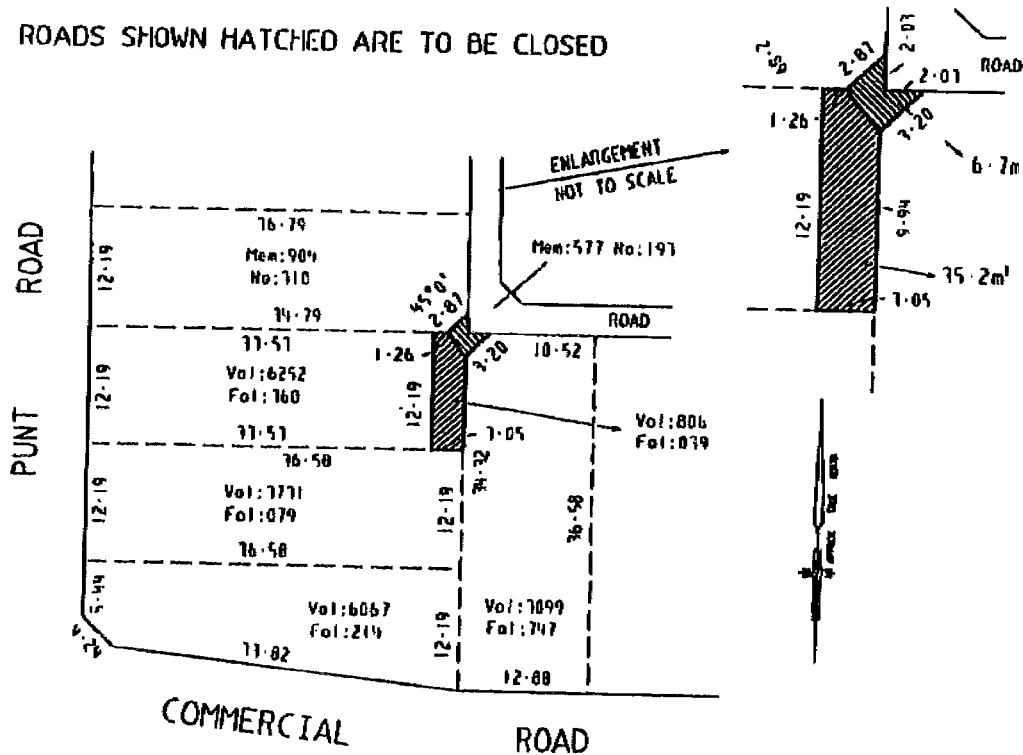

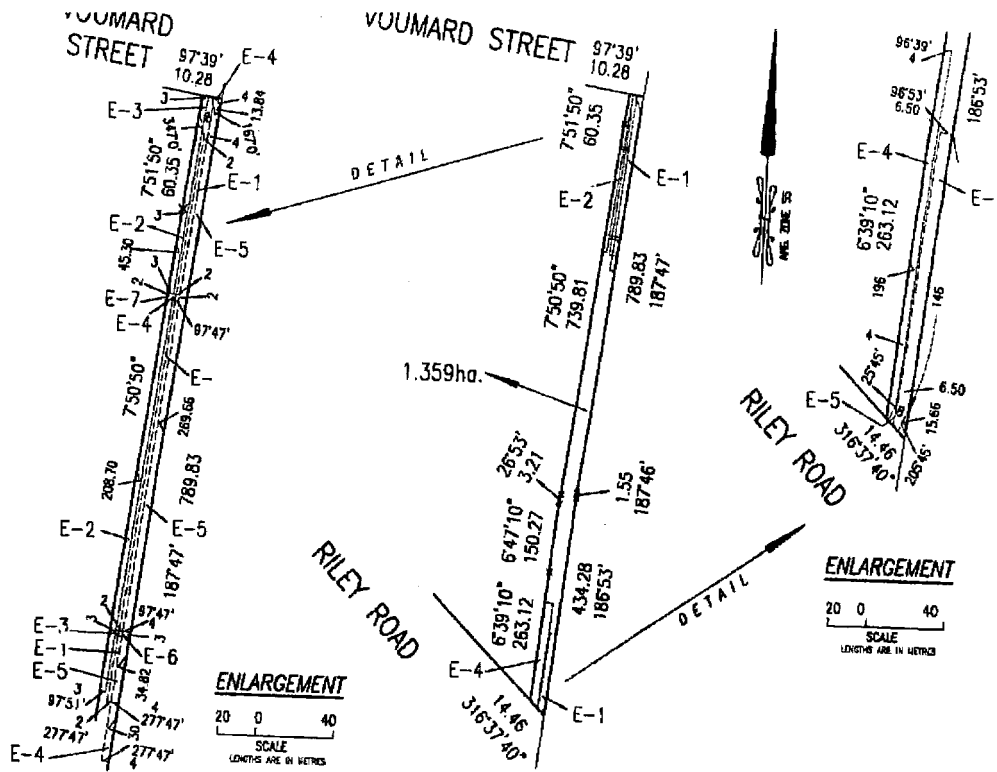

Environment Local Law 1999

Notice is hereby given that Moonee Valley City Council intends to make the following Local Law under Section 111 (1) of the **Local Government Act 1989**.

TITLE:

Environment Local Law 1999

PURPOSE

The principle objectives of the Local Law are to:

- Provide for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district;
- Promote a physical and social environment free from hazards to health, in which the residents of the municipal district can enjoy a quality of life that meet the general expectations of the community;
- Prevent and suppress nuisances which may adversely affect the enjoyment of life or the health, safety and welfare of persons;

- Prohibit, regulate and control activities which may be dangerous or unsafe or detrimental to the quality of life and the environment; and
- Repeal the Environment Local Law 1996 (Local Law No. 2 of 1996).

GENERAL PURPORT

Part 1. – Introductory

The Local Law will come into operation on the day after which it is made and will apply and operate throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Part 2. – Use of Property

- Prohibits the keeping of unsightly property or dilapidated buildings;
- Regulates the clearance of land which constitutes a fire hazard or a source of fuel for a fire;
- Regulates festivals;
- Regulates and controls the keeping of heavy vehicles in residential areas.

Part 3. – Refuse Disposal

- Provides for the collection, storage and transportation of refuse, recyclable goods, hard garbage and trade waste.

Part 4. – Clothing and Recycling Bins

- Regulates the placement of clothing recycling bins on any Council land or road.

Part 5. – Camping and Caravans

- Regulates camping and the use of caravans, tents and like structures.

Part 6. – Animals and Birds

- Regulates the keeping of animals and birds.

Part 7. – Management of Drains & Other Assets

- Regulates and controls the maintenance of drains and other Council assets and the tapping into drains.

Part 8. – Open Air Burning and Incinerators

- Prohibits the use of incinerators and regulates and controls open air fires.

Part 9. – Recreational Vehicles

- Prohibits, regulates and controls the use of recreational vehicles.

Part 10. – Administration and Enforcement

Provides for the impounding of items; consideration of applications for, issuing, correction and cancellation of permits; notices to comply; authority to act in urgent

circumstances; offences; infringement notices; payment of penalties; and withdrawal/waiver of notices.

Fisheries (Commercial) Regulations 2000

Notice is given in accordance with section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**, that a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) has been prepared in relation to the Fisheries (Commercial) Regulations 2000.

The reasons for, and the objective of, the proposed Regulations is to amend the Fisheries Regulations 1998 to provide for continued sustainable use, protection and good management of Victoria's fish resources and commercial fisheries, in particular the abalone and shark fisheries and to make minor amendments including clarification of the definition of the Gippsland Lakes.

Proposed regulatory changes include:

- Amending limits on commercial catches of gummy shark and school shark for Victorian Ocean Fishery Access Licence Holders;
- Introducing mandatory labelling and receipt requirements for commercial abalone products;
- Increasing certain levies for specified commercial fishing licences;
- Minor amendments including clarification of the definition of the Gippsland Lakes.

The regulatory impact statement (RIS) provides some possible alternatives to the proposed Regulations. These include introducing a nil shark by-catch for Ocean Fishery Access Licence holders, a voluntary code of practice for the abalone industry and no increase in levies. These alternatives, however, carry a much higher risk that the objectives of regulation will not be achieved. The benefits of the proposed Regulations are therefore considered to outweigh the alternatives as described in the RIS.

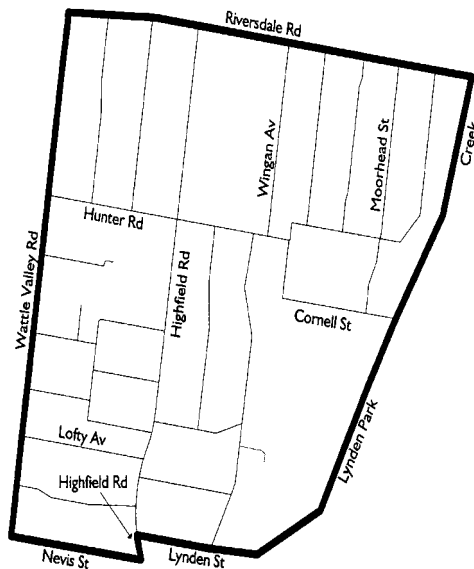

The new planning scheme also includes a municipal strategic statement, local policies and schedules to some of the zones, overlays and other provisions. The new scheme also incorporates a number of documents specified in the planning scheme, and contains new maps applying the standardised zones and overlays to land within the area covered by the scheme.

Any planning scheme or any part of a planning scheme in force immediately before the commencement of the new Loddon Planning Scheme is revoked to the extent that it applies to the area covered by the new Loddon Planning Scheme. Any amendment to a planning scheme or any part of a planning scheme which is revoked lapses.

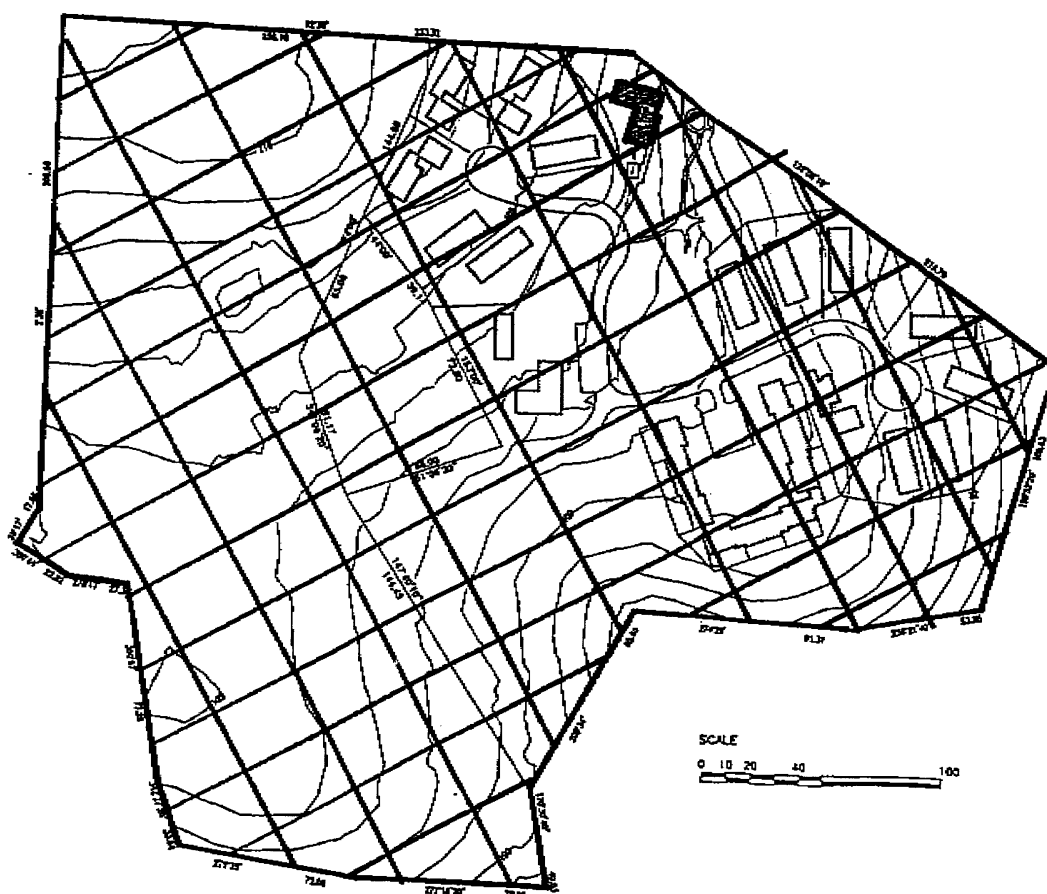
Crimes (Mental Impairment and Unfitness to be Tried) Act 1997

Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995DECLARATION OF A CONTROL AREA AT
COBRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF
PREVENTING THE SPREAD OF
QUEENSLAND FRUIT FLY.

The Governor in Council acting under section 9 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995** -

- (i) declares the area described in Schedule 1 to be a control area for the purpose of preventing the spread of Queensland fruit fly (*Bactrocera tryoni*);
- (ii) prohibits the removal from the control area into any part of Victoria, any fruit or vegetable listed as a host of Queensland fruit fly in Schedule 5 of the Plant Health and Plant Products Regulations 1996, unless the fruit or vegetable is accompanied by a Plant Health Certificate or Plant Health Declaration and/or in the case of fruit for treatment, packing or processing outside the control area, is accompanied by a permit issued by an authorised officer;
- (iii) requires owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 2, which is within the control area, to give access to such land at all times to an authorised officer with or without assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or placing on such land any lures or traps and/or for applying on such land any spray material or bait and for performing any other actions which in the opinion of the authorised officer are necessary for the eradication and/or prevention of spread of the pest;
- (iv) requires owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 2, which is in the control area, on instructions from an authorised officer, to strip fruit from trees, collect and dispose of waste fruit, or treat fruit and vegetables listed in Schedule 5 of the Plant Health and Plant Products Regulations 1996 in a manner approved by the Secretary; and
- (v) requires any fruit or vegetable listed as a host of Queensland fruit fly in Schedule 5 of the Plant Health and Plant Products Regulations 1996 which is transported through the control area from areas free of Queensland fruit fly, to be transported in accordance with the conditions of a permit issued by an authorised officer.

Schedule 1

The area of land around the outbreak centre at Cobram (Longitude: 145° 39.22, Latitude: 35° 54.98) bounded by a line commencing from the junction of Youarang Road and the Victorian side of the Murray River then in a southerly direction along Youarang Road to the intersection of Gleeson Road and Youarang Road, then in a westerly direction along Gleeson Road, to the intersection of Barnes Road and Fields Road, then in a westerly direction along Fields Road, to the intersection of Benalla Tocumwal Road, then in a westerly direction along Mills Road to the intersection of Mills Road and Kokoda Road, then in a northerly direction along Kokoda Road to the intersection of Ross Road and Kokoda Road, then in a westerly direction along Ross Road, to the intersection of Ross Road and Labuan Rd, then in a northerly direction along Labuan Road, to the intersection of Labuan and Sandmount Road, then in a westerly direction along Sandmount Road, to the intersection of Sandmount and Lorenz Road, then in a northerly direction along Lorenz Road to the intersection of Lorenz and Reynoldson Road, then in a westerly direction along Reynoldson to the intersection of Reynoldson Road and Katunga North Road, then in a northerly direction along Katunga North Road to the intersection of Katunga North Road and the Murray Valley Highway, then in a westerly direction along the Murray Valley Highway to the intersection of the Murray Valley Highway and Bouchiers Road, then in a northerly direction along Bouchiers Road to the intersection of Bouchiers Rd and Mywee Bearii Road, then in an easterly direction along Mywee Bearii Road, to the intersection of Mywee Bearii Road and Stokes Road, then in a northerly direction along Stokes Road, until Stokes Road meets the Murray River, then heading in an easterly direction along the southern side of the Murray River until the junction of the Murray River and Youarang Road.
