

Road Discontinuance

Between Herbert Street and Old Street, Robinvale

Pursuant to Section 206 and Schedule 10 Clause 3 of the **Local Government Act 1989** the Swan Hill Rural City Council at its ordinary meeting held on 10 October 2000 formed the opinion that the road described above and as shown hatched on the plan below, is not reasonably required as a road for public use. Council has resolved to discontinue the road and sell the land from the road to the abutting owners, subject to any right, power or interest held by Lower Murray Water Regional Authority in the road in connection with any sewers, drains, pipes, in or near the road.



Catch returns submitted to the Director of Fisheries by the holders of a Master Fisherman's Licence issued under the provisions of Fisheries Act 1968 and/or an Ocean or Rock Lobster Fishery Access Licence issued under the provisions of the Fisheries Act 1995 will be used as the basis for validating the 1,000 kilograms;
- (b) be the holder of an Ocean Fishery Access Licence or a Rock Lobster Fishery Access Licence:
- (c) be the owner of a suitably registered fishing vessel which has the capacity to store and hold live fish;
- (d) have access to onshore handling facilities for live banded morwong.

The banded morwong developing fishery will be reviewed by the Secretary before the end of the year 2003 to determine if the fishery is sufficiently developed to justify the issue of access licences under section 38 of the **Fisheries Act 1995**.
