MINISTERIAL DIRECTIONS: SERVICE OF ADVICE IN LEGAL VACATION

1. Preamble

These Directions are given pursuant to Section 135AB and Section 20C of the **Accident Compensation Act 1985** ("the Act") and their objective is to amend the Directions given on 1 June 1998 to:

- Address the practical difficulties which arise if the advicepursuant to \$135A(2D) of the Act is served on the worker during th elegal vacation;
- No longer require the appointment of a conference facilitator for a claim which is subject to a conference following the response date.
- 2. Application of these Directions

These Directions shall apply from 15 December 2000.

3. Definitions

In these Definitions, the definitions set out in the Directions given on 1 June 1998 still continue to apply.

4. Delivery of the Advice over the Legal Vacation

I direct that Direction 6 of the Directions given on 1 June 1998 be amended by inserting after paragraph 6(e):

"(f) where section 135A(2AA) applies to an application I direct that the advice is not served by the Authority or a self-insurer upon a worker between 18 December 2000 and 9 January 2001 inclusive".

5. Conferences

I direct that:

- (a) Direction 9(a) and (b) be deleted;
- (b) In Direction 9(c) for "The conference facilitator" substitute "The worker or his or her legal representative";
- (c) In Direction 10(b) for "the conference facilitaror" substitute "its legal representative";
- (d) In Direction 10(c) for "the conference facilitator" substitute "by the worker or his or her legal representative".

6. Failure to comply with these Directions

I direct that Directions 13(b) of the Directions given on 1 June 1998 be amended by inserting after "made", "or where the advice is served upon the worker in the period referred to in Direction 6(f)".

7. Continuation of 1 June 1998 Directions

I Direct, subject to Directions 4, 5 and 6 of these Directions, that the Directions given on 1 June 1998 shall continue to apply.

MELBOURNE CRICKET GROUND (OPERATIONS OF FLOODLIGHTS) ORDER NO. 6/2000

I, Sherryl Garbutt, Minister for Environment and Conservation, make the following Order:

1 Title

This Order may be cited as the Melbourne Cricket Ground (Operation of Floodlights) Order No. 6/2000.

2. Objectives

The objectives of this Order are to —

- (a) specify the days and times during which the floodlights affixed to the floodlight towers at the Melbourne Cricket Ground may be used; and
- (b) specify the purposes for which the floodlights may be used on those days; and
- (c) make provision in relation to vehicle entry into the Yarra Park Reserve.
- 3. Authorising provision

This Order is made under section 3 of the Melbourne Cricket Ground Act 1984.

4. Floodlights may be used on certain days at certain times and for certain purposes

The floodlights affixed to the floodlight towers at the Melbourne Cricket Ground may be used —

(a) on 24 December 2000 between 8.00 p.m. and 11.30 p.m. for all purposes relating to the televising of the Carols by Candlelight; and

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- (b) on 11, 21 and 26 January 2001 and 9 and 11 February 2001 between 2.00 p.m. and 11 p.m. for all purposes relating to the playing of international or domestic day/night cricket matches; and
- (c) during daylight hours on any day on which an international or domestic cricket match is played at the Melbourne Cricket Ground during the 2000/2001 cricket season for all purposes related to the playing of a cricket match; and
- (d) between 8.00 a.m. and 8.00 p.m. for the purpose of aligning, testing or repairing of the floodlights on the days specified in sub-clauses (a), (b) and (c).
- 5. Yarra Park Reserve Entry of Vehicles

On any day on which the floodlights affixed to the floodlight towers at the Melbourne Cricket Ground are permitted to be used for the purposes specified in clause 4(a) or (b), vehicular traffic is not permitted to enter into the Yarra Park Reserve by way of Vale Street after 5 p.m.
