CITY OF WHITEHORSE Order No. 2 of Whitehorse City Council Section 26(2)

Domestic (Feral and Nuisance) Animals Act 1994

This Order repeals Order No. 1.

1. Dogs must be under effective control

The owner of any dog must keep the dog in effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash, not exceeding 1.5 metres in length, held by the owner and attached to the dog while the dog is in: – a reserve; – or a public place.

2. Owner's obligations

A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in a Designated Reserve, if the owner: carries a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5 metres in length, sufficient to bring the dog under effective control if the dog behaves in a manner which threatens any person or animal; remains in effective voice or hand control of the dogs so as to be able to promptly bring the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5 metres in length if that becomes necessary; and does not allow the dog to worry or threaten any person or animal.

3. Controls

If a dog is off a chain, cord or leash in a Designated Reserve, the dog must be brought under the effective control of the owner by means of chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5 metres in length if the dog roams, or is likely to roam, to within 50 metres of: the principal location of an organised sporting event; a children's play equipment area; the principal location of an organised public meeting; or a permanent barbecue or picnic area.

4. Meaning of word

In this Order

Owner has the same meaning as in the **Domestic** (Feral and Nuisance) Animals Act 1994;

Designated Reserve means any of the following reserves or part of the following reserves:—Masons Road Retarding Basin; Simpson Park, Somers Trail, Davy Lane Reserve, Ballyshanassy Reserve, Morton Park, Glen Valley Retarding Basin, Nicoll Park, Gardiners Creek Reserve, Koonung Creek Reserve, Bushy Creek Reserve West (between Elgar Road and Woodhouse

Grove), Sparks Reserve, Boisdale Reserve, Mont Albert Reserve, Blackburn South Link (between Holland Road and Royton Street), Mahoney's Reserve, Hunter Knoll, Terrara Park, Forest Hill Reserve.

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has considered an application pursuant to Section 83 of the **Equal Opportunity Act** 1995 by The Graduate Union of the University of Melbourne Inc. The application for exemption is to enable the applicant to exclude from the activities of the "Graduate Links" group of the Union, members of the Union aged 45 years and over and to advertise those activities on the basis of that exclusion.

Upon reading the material submitted in support of the application, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from Sections 42, 59, 60, 100 and 195 of the Act to enable the applicant to exclude from the activities of the "Graduate Links" group of the Union, members of the Union aged 45 years and over and to advertise those activities on the basis of that exclusion.

In granting this exemption, the Tribunal noted:

- The "Graduate Links" group is a sub-group of the Graduate Union, an association of the university graduates.
- The applicant wishes to regularise a grouping of its membership that is known as "Graduate Links" which has in fact existed informally for some years, which caters for single graduates aged under 45 years and aims to create an opportunity for people with different interests and qualifications to enjoy each others company in a friendly environment.
- The Graduate Union has social activities open to all members. Another sub-group, the Solo Graduates, consists of single university

graduates of any age. Both groups organise similar functions. Members who are 45 years and over have the opportunity to attend a wide range of social functions, even if excluded from the activities of "Graduate Links".

- It is felt by some members of "Graduate Links" that open age events can scare away younger females. The group feels that they have fought very hard to achieve a group where young women feel comfortable and the activities provided are attractive to younger people.
- The union has previously been granted an exemption in respect of the Mono Group. That Group has since changed its name to Graduate Links.

The Tribunal grants an exemption from the operation of Sections 42, 59, 60, 100 and 195 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 1995**, to enable the applicant to exclude from the activities of the "Graduate Links" group of the Union, members of the Union aged 45 years and over and to advertise those activities on the basis of that exclusion.

This exemption is to remain in force from the day on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 6 December 2003.

For the purpose of calculating towing charges, the distance travelled is to be measured from the authorised depot to the accident scene and then from the accident scene to the address to where the motor vehicle is to be towed.

In addition to the above charges, an after-hours surcharge of \$54.00 (\$158.00+\$54.00 = \$212.00 total charge) applies to tows allocated by the Accident Allocation Centre between 7.00 pm and 7.00 am.

 For locked storage following towing from the scene of an accident within the controlled area, the following daily rates in accordance with Section 176 of the Transport Act 1983 shall apply:

Motor car, under cover, per day \$12.10 Motor cycle, under cover, per day \$4.10 Motor car, in locked yard, per day \$8.05 Motor cycle, in locked yard, per day \$2.65

3. The prescribed charges shall be reviewed and sunset two years from the effective date.

The charges, inclusive of GST, take effect from 8 December 2000






